CAVITE TOWN SLATES MONTH-LONG ANTI-MEASLES IMMUNIZATION

NOVELETA, Cavite — As the spread of the contagious measles disease placed rural health units (RHUs) in the Calabarzon region on heightened alert and monitoring, this smallest Cavite town has slated its month-long free immunization to children in its 16 villages here.

Mayor Dino Reyes Chua and Rhu head Dr. Hilda Bucu on Monday announced the free vaccination for measles including anti-polio and vitamin A supplementation for children ages 6 months to 5 years old, saying these vaccines are safe to provide protection for their kids from the measles contagion.

“Nananawagan po ako sa aking mga kababayan dito sa Noveleta, na maaring makipagtulungan sa kani-kanilang mga health centers sa kanilang barangay para sa pagpapabakuna sa kanilang mga sanggol o baby (I am appealing to our Noveleta constituents to seek assistance from their health centers in every barangay for the vaccination of their infants and babies),” Chua said.

The mayor said barangay health workers have been mobilized in the respective villages to embark on house-to-house infor-

mation campaign to encourage mothers to bring their children to local health centers from 8 a.m. until 3 p.m.

They also advised parents to bring the children's vaccination record booklet to properly document and monitor the immunization program.

The health center in Barangay San Rafael IV has scheduled the vaccination on February 19-20, Barangay Salcedo 2 next on February 25-26, and Barangay Santa Rosa 1 on February 27-28.

The vaccination for children in San Juan 2 has been scheduled on March 1; San Antonio 2 - March 4; Poblacion Proper - March 5; San Rafael 3 - March 6-8; Barangay Magdiwang - March 11; Barangay Salcedo 1 - March 12; San Antonio 1 on March 13 - 15 and 18; San Jose 1 on March 19; San Jose 2 on March 20-21; Santa Rosa 2 - March 25; San Rafael 1 on March 26; San Rafael 2 on March 27-28; and San Juan 1 on March 29.

Andanar: PCOO officials sent to Europe, part of NTF to End Communist Armed Conflict

QUEZON CITY (PIA)— Communications Secretary Jose Ruperto Martin M. Andanar stressed that officials of the Presidential Communications Operations Office (PCOO) sent to Europe are part of the government's official delegation to clarify the issue on “involuntary disappearances,” anti-communist terrorist groups, among others.

In a statement issued Monday (Feb. 18), he clarified, PCOO, being a committee member of the National Task Force (NTF) to End Communist Armed Conflict pursuant to Executive Order 70, provides communications support in terms of messaging and content to the anti-Communist Terrorist Groups efforts.

“The engagement of PCOO in the NTF alongside relevant agencies of gov't in the security cluster is necessary in the adoption of a National peace framework as directed by the President by putting together the context, messaging and communication plan for the whole-of-nation approach to be executed by the NTF,” Andanar, in his statement said.

To maximize the official trip, the PCOO delegation found it an opportune time to bring the Press Freedom Caravan in Brussels and Geneva.

“The Communications Department has been holding Press Freedom caravans locally and internationally to bring government

closer to Filipinos even those in the international community,” Andanar said.

The first caravan in a foreign country was conducted in Bangkok, Thailand last January 2019.

Andanar said the caravan is a side event in-between official meetings with officials from the EU Parliament, Belgian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, UN Working Group on Enforced or Involuntary Disappearances (WGEID), European Commission, and leaders of the Filipino community.

The Secretary also clarified a radio interview regarding the arrest of Maria Ressa, the chief executive officer of Rappler, that was

taken out of context.

“My radio interview was taken out of context. I only used Ressa's case as an example of what might be raised in the caravan; We didn't know much about the Ressa case when we prepared for this trip,” the Secretary said.

He clarified that the arrest of Ressa happened two days after the official delegation left for Europe.

“Nobody from the delegation was aware it was coming. In any case, it is just natural for me to instruct the PCOO officials in Europe to answer possible queries about Ms. Ressa,” Andanar said.

He assured the public

that no public funds are wasted in the official mission which came about from a directive from the National Security Council.

“All engagements in Bosnia, Brussels and Geneva are all part of PCOO mandate to deliver and disseminate information relation to policies, programs, and achievements of the President and Executive Branch,” he assured.

He bared that the PCOO may also set up and maintain local and international field offices to ensure that accurate information from the President and the Executive Branch is promptly and efficiently relayed. **(PIA)**

Suspected MERS-CoV patient in Laguna tested negative

CALAMBA CITY (PIA)— The Department of Health-4A said results of the laboratory test on a patient suspected of MERS-CoV yielded negative of the virus.

DOH4A spokesperson Glen Ramos stated that the Research Institute for Tropical Medicine has confirmed the findings last night, February 20.

Before the result was release, the patient suspected to have developed symptoms of the Middle East Respiratory Syndrome

Coronavirus or MERS-CoV remained under monitoring after blood samples were taken for testing.

“The patient is alive,” Ramos said dispelling reports that the patient had died.

The 47 year-old male patient from Laguna, who arrived last February 14 from the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, is said to have experienced fever and cough and immediately went to the Laguna Doctor's Hospital in Santa Cruz, Laguna

as a precautionary measure.

He said the Laguna Doctor's emergency room has resumed operations after it was temporarily shut down for decontamination, a standard procedure in all infectious cases.

“There's no reason to be afraid in going to the hospital,” Ramos said.

Since the patient tested negative, it is now clear that MERS-CoV does not exist in the country. **(Joy Gabrido, PIA4A)**

DOH-CALABARZON HOPES TO SLOW DOWN MEASLES CASES BY MARCH

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) — Health officials expect measles cases to drop beginning next month with the government's response measures kicking in.

But for now, the Department of Health (DOH)- Calabarzon monitoring as of February 14 showed that measles cases were still on the rise with 1,645 cases or up by 673 from the previous report of 972 cases on February 9. Deaths were also up from 25 last week to 40 incidents as of yesterday.

In another meeting over the weekend, DOH-Calabarzon Director Eduardo Janairo presented the department's strategies to address the measles outbreak that included surveillance, public awareness and education, vaccination, and taking care of measles patients in health care facilities.

"Because of the severity and the comprehensive coverage of the measles outbreak DOH will be col-

laborating (with partner-agencies for specific responses)," Janairo said.

The DOH enumerated the responsibilities of each government agency namely:

- Department of Social Welfare and Development will involve their Day Care Workers in ensuring that all their pupils will be vaccinated;

- Department of Education to ensure that all school children will get their dose of measles vaccine;

- Department of the Interior and Local Government to request for the extension of immunization schedules beyond regular hours and provide supplemental immunization activity (SIA) from February to March;

- Department of Transportation to provide transport in times of emergency;

- World Health Organization to assist in the development of checklist for LGUs;

- Armed Forces of the Philippines for the deployment of medical personnel in conflict areas and ensure the safety of personnel;

- Philippine National Police and Bureau of Fire Protection to provide additional personnel and logistical support;

- Philippine Information Agency and private partners for continuous advocacy and awareness promotion.

The DOH targets to vaccinate a total of 430,292 children in CALABARZON from an estimated population of 15,936,725.

The number of children for immunization are as follows: Cavite - 113,064; Laguna - 90,160; Batangas - 79,839; Rizal - 87,019; and Quezon - 60,210.

"Everyone's cooperation and support are essential to be able to successfully prevent the spread and lessen the cases of measles in the country," Janairo said. **(PIA4A with reports from DOH Calabarzon)**

PNR to use DOST-made train soon; more units eyed

MANILA — Soon, passengers of the Philippine National Railways (PNR) would be able to use the hybrid electric train (HET) made by engineers of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST).

In an interview with the Philippine News Agency (PNA) on Thursday, DOST Secretary Fortunato dela

Peña said the HET just needs to undergo some testing, and that Transportation Secretary Arthur Tugade has expressed interest to have more units of the DOST-made train.

"The training of PNR drivers and maintenance personnel will start on the first week of March. (That would be) two weeks train-

ing, and another two weeks operating the HET without a passenger," he said.

He added that there is a required 150 hours of validation testing that would take 25 days or one month of 6-hour service operation with passengers.

The possibility of using the HET by April would depend on the PNR, dela Peña said.

At present, there is only one unit of HET from the DOST. Dela Peña said the DOST has always been open to technology adoption. "In the Philippines, of course PNR is the main company (for this train)," he said.

"The good news is that Secretary Tugade expressed his desire to have more units of this DOST hybrid train. Our DOST MIRDC (Metals Industry Research and Development Center) engineers are ready for this should a decision be made," dela Peña emphasized.

He said Tugade did not mention the number of HET units needed, except the trains are for the PNR.

In July 2018, the DOST led a demo run of HET between PNR Dela Rosa station to PNR EDSA station. The activity was part of the National Science and Technology Week observance.

Launched in 2016, the HET is said to be energy-efficient since it is powered by batteries. The train could run at a speed of about 50 kph and could accommodate 220 passengers, according to DOST.

Apart from HET, the DOST has also developed a hybrid road train. **(PNA)**

DOJ chief backs PRRD line on students may lose scholarships

MANILA—Justice Secretary Menardo Guevarra on Thursday sided with the President Rodrigo Duterte's recent pronouncement that students who overtly support terrorist organizations may be validly dropped from the rolls of scholarship.

"The President's statements are legally correct. Mere affiliation or subscription to any leftist ideology is not unlawful; it's when you put this into action by joining or providing support (arms, supplies, recruits etc.) to armed groups seeking to overthrow the duly constituted authorities that makes you an enemy of the state," Guevarra told reporters in a message.

Guevarra underscored that freedom of speech, like freedom of the press, does not enjoy absolute protection.

"If once incites others to sedition, for example, he or she must face the consequences of the felonious act," he said.

"Scholarships are generally determined and maintained by academic standards, but some schools

may require that the scholar has no pending case in court or other tribunal. So a scholar who is charged with a crime such as inciting to sedition will be prosecuted and may lose his/her standing as a scholar, depending on the requirements of his/her particular school," Guevarra added.

President Duterte earlier said students in state-run schools may lose their eligibility for scholarships for overt acts of support for the communist rebels that aim to overthrow the government.

"If they espouse [support against] the very government feeding food on their mouth, they will lose that," Duterte was quoted as saying.

National Youth Commission chairperson Ronald Cardema previously asked the President to issue an executive order removing the scholarships of "all rebellious anti-government scholars" particularly those allied with communist rebels who have been involved in the killing of government troops. **(PNA)**

IMUS LAUNCHES GREEN SCHOOL PROJECT

The mayor now leaves it to the Department of Education (DepEd) to institutionalize the project that will enable the schools to produce their “very own eco-friendly culture” and ensure the creation of eco-friendly leaders for the next generation.

Maliksi and Vice Mayor Arnel Cantimbuhan and DepEd Imus City officer-in-charge (OIC), Superintendent Dr. Hermogenes Panganiban, signed the memorandum of agreement (MOA) for the project.

Noemi Paranada, OIC Regional Director of the De-

partment of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), commended the city’s efforts in serving as the agency’s partner in promoting plans and programs for the environment.

“As the city continues to grow, it is not only moving forward in terms of productivity and competitiveness, but also cleaner, liveable and sustainable,” she said.

After Monday’s launch, information dissemination would make the public become more aware of the project before they convene all stakeholders to plan, implement, and monitor programs for the greening of institutions.

Expanded Maternity Leave to cost SSS P7.5-B more

MANILA — The Expanded Maternity Leave law, which was signed into law last February 20, is expected to cost the Social Security System (SSS) an additional PHP7.5 billion in benefits.

In a briefing Thursday, SSS President and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Emmanuel Doooc said this amount is on top of the PHP6 billion in maternity benefits disbursed in 2017.

Some 289,000 SSS members received maternity benefit in 2017.

As of end-September 2018, SSS disbursed about PHP5.2 billion worth of maternity benefits and this was extended to 241,680 members.

Doooc said they will look for ways to fund this additional benefit even as the state-run pension fund for private sector workers can now impose a hike in monthly contributions following the signing into law of Republic Act (RA) 11199 or the Social Security Act of 2018.

RA 11199 strengthens the pension fund’s actuarial life since the mandated additional one percentage point increase in contribution from the current 11 percent, scheduled to be implemented this year, will bring in about PHP31 billion

in contribution collections.

This, in turn, will extend the actuarial life of SSS from 2038 to 2045.

Under the Expanded Maternity Leave law, pregnant workers will have 105 days of paid maternity leave, 7 days of which are transferable to fathers.

It gives single mothers additional 15 days leave while a 30-day extension can be made but this will be without pay.

Also, the expanded leave does not discriminate whether the member has already exceeded four pregnancies.

Out of the 11 percent combined contribution of both the members and their employers, only 0.4 percent is allocated for maternity benefit to date.

Doooc said this share should have been increased to 0.5 percent when the maternity leave was increased to 60 days from 45 days for normal delivery and to 78 days from 60 days for caesarian delivery.

He explained that with the deficiency the contribution should be hiked by as much as 0.6 percent.

He said that Taguig Congresswoman Pia Cayetano, who is one of the measure’s authors, has given assurance that SSS has the authority under the

MANILA - The prices of rice are expected to decrease by P2 to P7 per kilo following the signing of the tariffication law by President Rodrigo R. Duterte, the Department of Finance (DOF) said on Tuesday.

“The implementation of the rice tariffication law is vital to the national interest and it should be done as soon as possible,” DOF Assistant Secretary Tony Lambino said in the weekly economic briefing in Malacañang.

Lambino allayed the fears of farmers’ groups that the new law will be disadvantageous to them.

“Ang gusto po nating gawin (What we want to do) is through rice tariffication iyong makakalap po nating taripa ay para sa mga magsasaka lamang at iyan po ay naka-earmark po based on the law (tariffs collected are solely for farmers and it will be earmarked based on the law),” he said.

Lambino expressed confidence that local farmers will be able to compete internationally following the signing of the law.

He cited data from the National Economic Development Authority that showed 57 provinces are rice growing and have the potential to be internationally competitive adding some areas are already competitive.

expanded maternity leave to increase contribution to address the additional cost. **(PNA)**

“Because of better productivity and the use of technology and agricultural sciences ay makakalaban po ang maraming lugar sa Pilipinas na rice growing (many rice-growing places in the Philippines can compete),” he said.

Aside from lowering the prices of rice in the country, Lambino said the law’s passage is also seen to lower inflation significantly by 0.6 percentage point based on estimates from the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas.

Lambino said the tariffication of rice in the country has been delayed for more than 20 years already.

Rice prices seen to drop by at least P7 due to tariffication law

“Dalawang extension na po ang binigay sa atin (We have already been given two extensions), based on our international commitments to the WTO. So since 1996 ay humingi na po tayo ng (we have been asking for) special treatment for rice and we have been saying that we will improve productivity before we tariffify,” Lambino said.

“So we are now fulfilling our international commitment para po (so that) we are true to our word and also, so that we do not run the risk that other countries will retaliate in terms of tar-

iffs on other Filipino products. So we really needed to do this,” he added.

Lambino said the National Food Authority (NFA), which previously had the monopoly in importing rice, will restructure and handle emergency buffer stocking under the new rice tariffication law.

Duterte signed the rice tariffication bill into law last Friday.

The signing will result in a switch from the current quota system in importing rice to a tariff system, where rice can be imported more freely. **(PNA)**

DOST-NCR STILL HAS 27 LOAN ASSISTANCE SLOTS FOR MSMES IN 2019

MANILA —The Department of Science and Technology - National Capital Region (DOST-NCR) still has 27 slots to fill up this year under the DOST's Small Enterprises Technology Upgrading Program (SETUP), an executive told the Philippine News Agency (PNA) on Tuesday.

SETUP is DOST's nationwide program that aims to encourage and assist

SC upholds 3rd martial law extension

MANILA — The Supreme Court (SC) on Tuesday ruled to uphold the constitutionality of Malacanang's Proclamation No. 216 extending martial law and suspending the privilege of the writ of habeas corpus in Mindanao.

In a briefing, SC Public Information Office (PIO) chief, lawyer Brian Keith Hosaka, announced the decision which was written by Associate Justice Rosmari Carandang after the high court's regular en banc session.

Nine magistrates voted to dismiss the four petitions questioning the proclamation, while a minority of four justices voted against the suits.

"The Supreme Court ruled to uphold the constitutionality of the extension of the declaration of martial law and the suspension of the privilege of writ of habeas corpus in Mindanao until December 31, 2019," Hosaka said.

Chief Justice Lucas Bersamin, Associate Justices Diosdado Peralta, Mariano Del Castillo, Estela Perlas-Bernabe, Andres Reyes Jr., Alexander Gesmundo, Jose Reyes Jr., Ramon Paul Hernandez and Carandang voted to dismiss the suits.

On the other hand, Senior Associate Justice Antonio Carpio and Associate Justices Marvic Leonen, Francis Jardeleza and Alfredo Benjamin Caguioa were in the minority.

The four petitions were filed by lawmakers led by Albay Rep. Edcel Lagman, militant

micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) in adopting technological innovations to improve their products and operations.

Through SETUP, the DOST helps improve the MSMEs' productivity and competitiveness by providing them a loan that is payable in three years.

They argued that the extension of martial law is unconstitutional as it failed to satisfy public safety requirement under the 1987 Constitution.

Last December 12, Congress voted to re-extend the martial law in the region up to the end of this year.

State lawyers cited data from the Armed Forces of the Philippines on active terrorist groups.

The military said Abu Sayyaf Group (ASG) still has as a total of 424 members with 473 firearms who are scattered in 138 barangays in Basilan, Sulu, Tawi-Tawi and Zamboanga. On the other hand, the Bangsamoro Islamic Freedom Fighters (BIFF) has 264 members with 254 firearms and affecting 50 barangays.

The Daesh-affiliated Maute, Maguid and Turaiife groups have around 150 members with various firearms.

The report said they are scattered in at least 204 barangays in Mindanao.

He also noted that the New People's Army continues to rise publicly and take up arms against the government. (PNA)

Cluster Director Oscar Sevilla said DOST-NCR has a total of 64 SETUP slots to fill up this year.

"About 37 applications are already for approval. So we can still accommodate 27 enterprises," he said.

Sevilla clarified that the 64 slots he was referring to include financial aid. "We provide other technical assistance under SETUP. That includes assistance in packaging, etc. We provide a lot of technical assistance, but for the slots where we could aid the enterprises financially, we (DOST-NCR) only have 64," he said.

To inform the public of the DOST's programs and the assistance it could provide, Sevilla said the DOST-NCR conducts a "roadshow" yearly.

During roadshows, the DOST-NCR invites officials and the media to visit some of the SETUP beneficiaries.

"We do this (roadshow) to showcase the programs that we provide to the industry, community and the academe," he said.

Sevilla noted that the DOST-NCR also uses this roadshow to find potential partners or SETUP beneficiaries. "We also showcase this to the academe for possible collaborative R&D (research and development)," he added.

On Tuesday, DOST-NCR representatives and Secretary Fortunato dela Pena visited five MSMEs who were SETUP beneficiaries.

They visited Aretei Foods Corp., Bristol Shoes, Twinville Homeowners' Association Inc., TJ Milky Mushroom and Marikina Mushroom Coop (a beneficiary of DOST's Community Empowerment through Science and Technology program).

"It is important for us to show the impact of DOST's programs among those we have helped," Sevilla remarked. (PNA)

PNP AKG lauded for rescuing Australian kidnap victim

MANILA — Philippine National Police (PNP) Chief, Director General Oscar Albayalde on Thursday hailed the Anti-Kidnapping Group (AKG) for rescuing an Australian national from his alleged kidnapers in Makati City.

PNP Spokesman, Senior Supt. Bernard Banac said Albayalde congratulated the PNP AKG under Chief Supt. Glenn Dumalo for their ‘accomplishment’ as the AKG also arrested the alleged kidnapers.

“We thank the public for their constant support to our campaign against criminality. The PNP will remain steadfast to its mandate to enforce the law and keep the peace and order in our communities,” Banac in a statement.

Banac said the kidnap victim was identified as Jianting Chen who was reportedly kidnapped by four Chinese nationals on Feb.
