Pinoy WISE Step Financial Education Program for OFW Families

About 60 Overseas Filipinos (OFs) and their families attended the Pinoy WISE Step Financial Education Program for OFW Families, an activity in support to the Go Earn Achieve Return Uplift Philippines (GEAR-UP) Reintegration Preparedness Program on October 24-25, 2019 at Cañossa Health and Social Center in Bulihan, Silang, Cavite.

The two-day activity aims to sensitize the OFs and their families on the various economic and social issues of migration and the barriers to achieving migration goals, assist them in financial planning and investment to ensure that migration will contribute to the long-term development of the OFs, their families and their communities, and to guide the OFs in identifying and addressing their issues and concerns to enable them to achieve their financial and family goals for migration.

In behalf of Mayor Socorro Rosario Poblete, the participants were warmly welcomed by Ms. Rhoda Bautista, the Municipal Social Welfare Officer of Silang. She also expressed her gratefulness to all the people behind the activity for choosing their municipality as venue for launching the program in Cavite.

In order to prepare and guide the participants in taking their financial literacy path, an audio-visual presentation on GEAR-UP

Reintegration Preparedness Program was presented and an overview of the training was discussed by the Program Coordinator of Atikha, Ms. Riza Sevilla.

Lecture on Nurturing Family Relations was conducted by Ms. Maria Aura Fuentes, PSWDO Social Welfare Officer. She discussed the family issues caused by overseas migration such as gap in the relationship with spouse, communication gap and psychosocial problems of children, dependency of the families on remittances, irresponsibility in managing funds, growing extravagant lifestyles and over indulgence and consumerism. Subsequently, Ms. Precyl Ramos, Social Welfare Officer III of PSWDO, guided the participants in addressing the family issues identified.

Discussions on Financial Education like Achieving Goals for Migration, Savings and Budgeting and Investing and Protecting Migrants were presented by Ms. Sheryll Loyola from the Provincial Cooperative, Livelihood and Entrepreneurial Development Office (PCLEDO), where the participants learned the concepts in savings and investing such as "Save Before You Spend", the difference between "Needs and Wants", "Pay Yourself First", "Diversifying Investments" and others.

To better understand every topic presented, the attendees were encouraged

to do a small group sharing activity. Workshops on drawing their dream map, saving goals and budgeting were also accomplished by the participants.

Highlight of the activity was the signing of the Commitment Form of the participants wherein they compel to liberate themselves from financial barriers and regularly save certain amount to achieve their visions as successful migrants. They were also asked to voluntarily enroll in the Pinoy WISE and GEAR-UP Cavite membership.

On the second day, Ms. Precyl Ramos discussed the programs and services being implemented by the provincial government which include Psycho-Social Services (financial assistance services, Reintegration Assistance to OFW and Migrants (RAOM), medical assistance, burial assistance), Economic Services (Family and Income Management Seminar, Skills and Livelihood Training, Business and Investment Forum), Legal advice and assistance to OFWs regarding laws on migrants and overseas employment, free and quality computer education through the Cavite Computer Center among others, for OFs in Cavite.

A lecture-discussion on reintegration was facilitated by Ms. Aileen Peña, the Deputy Executive Director of Atikha. She emphasized the push and pull factors of return migration, for instance, unemployment and termination of contract, racism and discrimination, homesickness, war or violence against foreigners. She also shared that lack of savings and investment, family issues that drain resources, failure in business, lack of integration of OF resources (financial, human and social) in the development plan of the region, province, municipalities and communities were identified as the barriers to reintegration. She also discussed the typology of return migration; return of failure, return of retirement, return of achievement and return of innovation and then challenged the participants into what type of return would they want to be.

In the afternoon, services,

savings and investment forum was held. The purpose of the activity is to give migrants the opportunity to look at different investment vehicles for their money. As part of the government savings program, Modified Pag-IBIG 2 (MP2) savings program was presented by Pag-ibig Fund Representative, Mr. Rommel Ramallosa. This is a voluntary savings program for members who wish to save more and earn higher dividends than the regular Pag-IBIG savings program. Ms. Angelina Bergonio, Assistant General Manager of Cavite Farmers Feedmilling and Marketing Cooperative (CAFFMACO) and Mr. Regie Ambagan, Credit and Collection Officer of Investneur Multi-Purpose Cooperative (IMPC) were also present and discussed their savings and investment programs and encouraged everyone to be a member of their coops.

Meanwhile, Philam Life Insurance representative, Ms. Annie Rodriguez, tackled the importance of protecting oneself and preparing for the future and urged everyone to invest in lifetime protection program.

On the other hand, in ardent desire to organize the OFs in Silang, particularly in Bulihan, Ms. Cynthia Zamora, Silang Migration and Development Focal Person with the assistance of PSWDO staff Precyl Ramos, facilitated the election of Officers of Bulihan Association of OFWs and Families wherein Mr. Severino Dela Cruz, former OF from Brgy. Yakal was elected as the interim president.

In closing, Ms. Fely Servanez, PSWD Officer expressed her gratitude to everyone who extended efforts in achieving the goal of having financial-literate migrants and families in the province.

The event was made possible thru the effort of Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office (PSWDO), Cavite Migration and Development Office (CMDO), in collaboration with the local government of Silang, Provincial Cooperative, Livelihood and Entrepreneurial Development Office (PCLEDO), Atikha and PINOY WISE International.

Cavite Peace & Order, Anti-Drug Abuse councils convene for 3Q meeting

GENERAL TRIAS, Cavite (PIA) – The local chief executives of the 23 cities and municipalities of the province, heads of concerned national agencies, the academe and civil society organizations once again recently gathered for the 3rd Quarter Meeting of the Cavite Provincial Peace and Order Council (CPPOC) and the Anti-Drug Abuse Council (PADAC) held at The Bayleaf Hotel.

Mr. Alvin Mojica, Provincial Administrator for Community affairs presided over the meeting on behalf of Governor Jonvic Remulla, chairman of the council.

During the meeting, Col. Cesar Fernandez of the 202 IB of the Armed Forces of the Philippines said although there is no terrorist armed group presently operating in the province, they are likely to exploit national issues and use them to further their influence on

sectors like the labor, students and the youth, transport and the urban poor.

Col. Fernandez emphasized the importance of sustained delivery of basic services, livelihood and development projects especially in critical areas and vulnerable sectors to curtail the infiltration of communist terrorist armed groups and ensure internal security in the province. Further, he urged the Declaration of Persona Non Grata of communist groups in the municipalities down to the barangay level.

DILG OIC Provincial Director Eloisa Rozul commended the efforts of Maragondon Mayor Reynaldo Rillo thru the provision of basic services and other assistance to affected families that kept undesirable groups from infiltrating the communities of Barangay Patungan and Pinagsanhan.

Jesus Barrera, Provincial Planning and Development Coordinator reported on the peace and order and anti-drug abuse programs while Police Maj. Jonathan Asnan provided an update on the status on peace and order situation showing a notable 37.5% decrease in the crime statistics from January – September 2019 with 980 as compared to the same period in 2018 with 1,567 recorded crimes.

Meanwhile, Dr. Nelson Soriano, head of the Provincial Epidemiology Surveillance Unit showed a record on the reported cases of dengue outbreak in the province from January 1 to September 19, 2019 totaling to 13, 292 of which 51 were fatal.

"The dengue outbreak is a

public concern that must be promptly and rightly dealt with since it has been a recurring problem in the province for years." Dr. Soriano said as he called on the chief executives to help the health department to address this issue thru legislations that will instill in the people the awareness on the proper ways to battle this disease.

In addition, reports on the security preparations for the upcoming SEA Games to be hosted by the Philippines was given by Police Lt. Col. Pablito Naganag with the province being part of the venue for games and billeting of athletes. **(Ruel Francisco, PIA-Cavite/with reports from PICAD)**

Through the festival, Filipino audiences will see the masterful storytelling, acting, and technological advancement in Korea's thriving film industry. Film enthusiasts can also look forward to the critically-acclaimed and most talked-about 2019 movie in Korea entitled *Parasite* by Bong Joon-Ho.

The film, which won the prestigious Palm D'Or at the Cannes film festival, is about the poor and unemployed Ki-Taek who lives with his family in a damp, insect-infested semi-basement apartment at the low income area in Seoul. His son, Ki-Woo, is offered

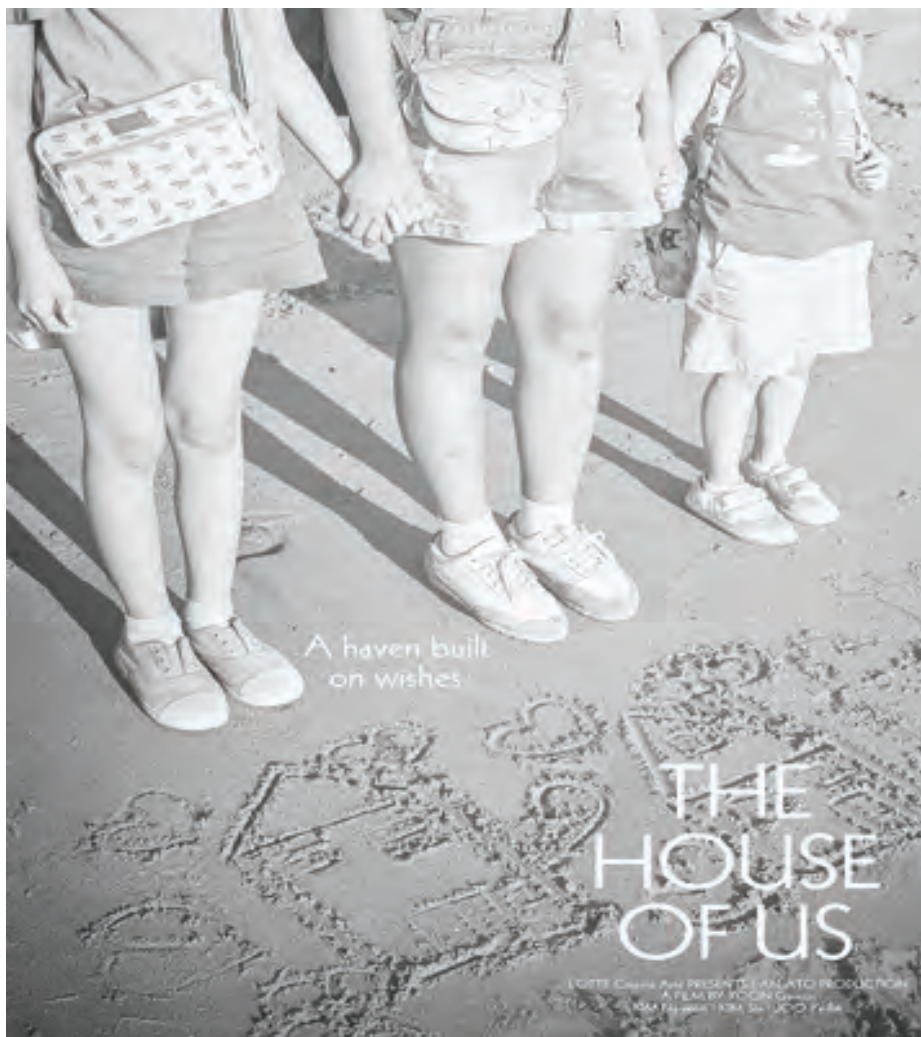

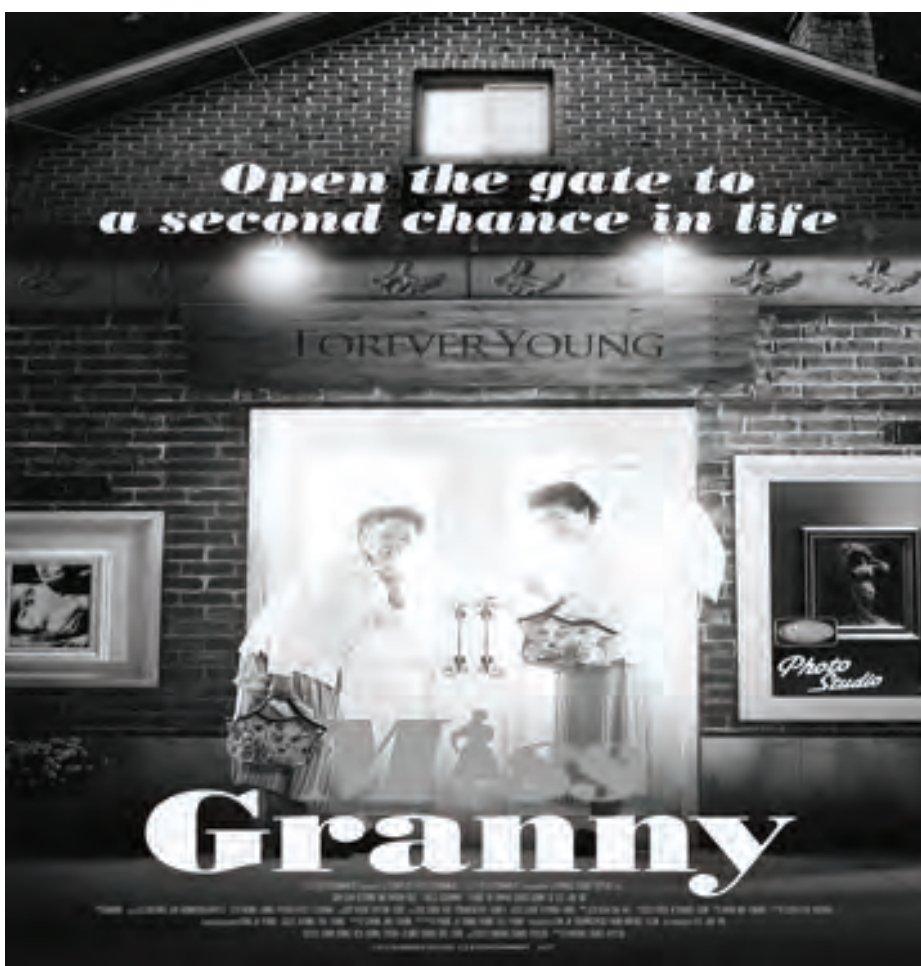

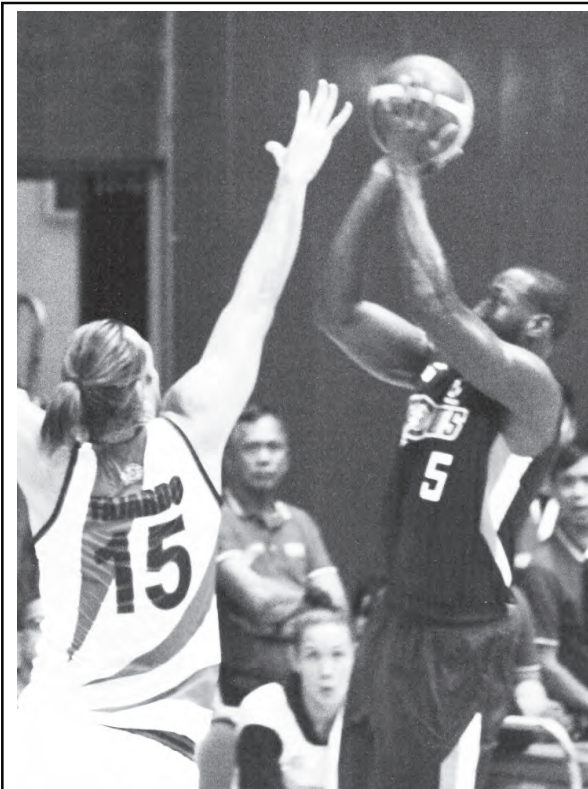

Nagpamalas ng kahandaan sina sprinter Kristina Knott, long jumper Janry Ubas at ang bata na si Hocket Delos Santos para sa inaasam na gintong medalya ng Pilipinas sa ihost nito na ika-30 edisyon ng Southeast Asian Games matapos magtala ng impresibong panalo sa isinasagawang Test Event sa New Clark City.

Nagwagi ng gintong medalya si Knott sa 200m women, si Ubas sa long jump at si Delos Santos sa pole

vault upang pangunahan ang pambansang koponan sa nagsilbi na panghuling torneo para madetermina ang mga bubuo sa 62 atleta na isasabak nito sa isa sa dalawang centerpiece sports na athletics.

Nagtala si Knott ng 24.42 segundo sa paborito nitong 200m upang talunin ang kababayan na si Kayla Richardson na nagtala ng 26.18 segundo habang ikatlo naman si Mahisin Maziah ng Brunei (27.02s).

Aminado si Knott na mabagal ang kanyang oras sa personal best na 23.23 segundo bagaman umaasa ito na mas mapapabilis pa ang tiyempo sa kanyang

pagkukumpleto sa pagsaanay isang buwan pa ang natitira bago ang aktuwal na kompetisyon na gagawin sa mismong bagong gawa na New Clark City.

"I consider it a good time since this is just a test event. I have something to work on in the last few days before the SEA Games so I can contribute to the team come the competition time," sabi ni Knott.

CHILDREN'S RIGHTS GROUP CONDUCTS MEDIA TRAINING ON CHILD WELFARE

MANDALUYONG CITY (PIA) -Educo, a children's rights-based organization, brought together child rights experts and journalists from various media organizations to exchange knowledge on how to protect children's rights in various media presentation.

"Often, violations against children's rights are seen across all sectors when it comes media presentations," Educo Child Protection Specialist Shiena Base during the training for media on covering children held Oct. 23-24, 2019 in Mandaluyong City.

"The journalists have a big role in developing the portrayal children in mass media. They act as the eyes, ears, and voices of the public drawing attention to abuses of power and human rights," Base added.

"Media tends to represent more of child violence and issues rather than showing specialized contexts with child right's expert viewpoints. And so, media must be aware of the risks in reporting a story about children," Base stressed.

According to Base, the child rights situation in the Philippines indicated that there are low information access to Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH), declining immunization coverage, increase rates of childhood malnutrition, high rates of child mortality, low access to education, and high rates of violence against children where these are often the subject highlighted in news stories.

During the training, Educo Communication Coordinator April Tesz discussed media guidelines in interviewing children and adolescents through a rights-based approach.

"News items or reports on situations of violence should not use images of children or their surroundings if this could lead to their identification," Tesz emphasized.

Based on the Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC), journalists must adhere to the best interest of the children taking account their right to be treated equally, right to express opinion, and right to a dignified life. These principles

should be regarded as foundation for journalists working with children and adolescents.

"Media practitioners should be reminded to be aware of the common misconceptions about children and provided guidelines in crafting a story that stand with the best interests of the children," Tesz cited.

Educo recommended the following media guidelines prior to presenting reports with children or child or adolescents as subject:

1. The dignity and rights of the child should to be respected at all times;

2. Assess the possible repercussions, could this activity put the child at risk them in any way?;

3. Any action must be carried out with the informed and written consent from the child and their parent or guardian;

4. The child must know the purpose of the interview, photograph or video, and the planned usage;

5. Guarantee that the work is carried out with the right to confidentiality; and avoid interviewing a child in a vulnerable situation.

"Media must explain the working piece to the children. Talk to them properly and appropriately according to their language of understanding with full disclosure in the purpose of collecting the information."
