ANIMAL SHELTER FACILITY TO CARE FOR STRAY ANIMALS

Trece Martires, Cavite (PIA) – The Alfonso Municipal Government is set to establish an animal shelter facility to address the perennial problem on stray animals particularly dogs and cats spreading rabies in the locality.

Mayor Randy Salamat signified the importance of caring for the animals thru the facility instead of an impounding area to lock up stray dogs.

“Dogs have lives and whether they are street dogs or not, we need to take care of them so instead of building an impounding area as facility (for them), we are preparing for an animal shelter facility during the first quarter of 2022,” said Mayor Salamat.

More than a dozen steel cages were recently completed on May 17, 2021 which according to mayor Salamat will now be distributed to every barangay in the municipality for the temporary holding of stray dogs.

“Sa totoo lang ay ‘sinosolusyunan’ na naman po. May mga hakbang na tayong nagawa. May ordinansa, Animal Control Officers’ training, may kulungan na para sa bawat barangay at may budget na para ngayong taon,” said Mayor Salamat.

(Actually, it’s “being solved”. We have taken steps. There is an ordinance, Animal Control Officers’ training, there is an animal cage for each barangay and there is a budget for this year.)

The local government for years had been taking steps in preparation for the program with the training of personnel of the Municipal Agriculture Office on Rabies Awareness, Animal Impounding and Management of Dog Pound for the Animal Control Officers of LGU on August 2019.

Subsequently, on March 27, 2021 the Municipal Ordinance no. 02-2021 or the Anti-Rabies Ordinance was passed and approved by the LGU which provided for the pertinent guidelines to protect human and

animal inhabitants of the municipality from rabies infection pursuant to the Anti-Rabies Act of 2007.

Additional steps for the full implementation of this program are the skills enhancement of Animal Control Officers for the proper and safe handling of animals and the procurement of an Animal Control Vehicle. **(Ruel Francisco with reports from Alfonso LGU)**

PTFoMS sends handbooks to media security vanguards

MANILA – The Presidential Task Force on Media Security (PTFoMS) recently supplied the Philippine National Police (PNP) Media Security Vanguards (MSVs) with the initial batch of the “Handbook on Personal Security Measures for Media Practitioners”.

These handbooks will be dispatched and coursed through the PNP Public Information Office (PIO) under Police Brig. Gen. Roderick Alba and they will be sent to PIOs nationwide.

Alba is also the Chief Focal Person of the Regional, Provincial, and City public information officers of the PNP. These information officers were also recently appointed as Media Security Vanguards by PNP Chief, Gen. Dionardo B. Carlos.

“The handbook starts with the Philippine Journalists’ Code of Ethics and ends with the PTFoMS Protocols. In between, basic guidance on personal security measures were thoroughly discussed,” said Undersecretary Joel Sy Egco, also PTFoMS Executive Director, in a news release on Wednesday.

“We are releasing the initial 150 copies of the Handbook on Personal Security Measure for Media Practitioners (2nd edition) to the PNP-Public Information Office under Brig. Gen. Roderick Augustus Alba for distribution to the media and to the designated Media Security Vanguards

MANILA – The subnational laboratories of the Research Institute for Tropical Medicine (RITM) will have the capacity to test vaccine-preventable diseases – measles, rubella, Japanese encephalitis, and rotavirus this year.

In a televised Laging Handa public briefing, RITM Virology Department Head Mayan Lumandas said the RITM, the Department of Health, and the World Health Organization have established seven

nationwide,” he added.

He said the handbook is “a product of thorough studies and discussions among various law enforcement agencies and media organizations, (and) will be very helpful in ensuring the safety of media workers and their families.”

“We had distributed thousands of copies of the booklet before and will be distributing more next month,” he added.

Some of the topics included in this comprehensive handbook are Threat Detection and Assessment; Personal, Vehicle, and Travel Security; Security at Home and in the Office; and how to deal with threats coursed through email, landline, and cell phones.

“We are confident that with the release of these handbooks to the journo ‘first-line-of-defense’ in the remotest areas of the country, the MSVs will be better equipped to handle any and all kinds of incidents involving media workers,” he said.

In 2018, UNESCO made special mention of the Philippines when the Task Force launched this “Handbook on Personal Security Measures for Media Practitioners” that provides good practices for journalists on how to protect themselves and their families against violence, threats, and intimidation.

The PTFoMS published the guide and copies are given free of charge to media workers. An updated edition

RITM labs to test vaccine-preventable illnesses in July

subnational laboratories nationwide.

These are the Ilocos Training and Regional Medical Center and the Jose B. Lingad Memorial Regional Hospital in Luzon; the Vicente Sotto Medical Center and the Western Visayas Medical Center in the Visayas; the Southern Philippines Medical Center, the Zamboanga City Medical Center and the Cotabato Regional and Medical Center in Mindanao.

“So, iyong mga laboratoryo magkakaroon ng kapasidad na mag-test ng apat na sakit sa pamamagitan po ng pag-analyze ng dugo (the laboratories will have the capacity to test the four diseases through analysis of blood), cerebrospinal fluid and stool,” Lumandas said.

She said laboratories with such capacity are important as they allow the government to respond to outbreaks and provide pertinent data for the National Immunization Program and campaigns about vaccine-preventable diseases.

The subnational laboratories are expected to run tests in July. **(PNA)**

DHSUD chief sets 2022 direction for housing sector

QUEZON CITY -- Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development (DHSUD) Secretary Eduardo Del Rosario on Monday presided over the first meeting of the National Human Settlements and Urban Development Coordinating Committee (NHSUDCC) for 2022 – setting the housing sector’s thrusts for the year.

During the forum held via video conference, Secretary Del Rosario issued his guidance on how the Department, along with its key shelter agencies (KSAs), can achieve its goals and align initiatives and efforts towards attaining their 2022 targets, particularly within the first semester when the Duterte administration completes its six-year term.

“We have a long road ahead of us. Our tasks and responsibilities are never ending. But as long as we keep moving forward and try to hurdle each of these challenges as TEAM BALAI, even if we encounter setbacks, we’ll still deliver outstanding results with heads high and proud to be among the stars,” Secretary Del Rosario said.

For 2022, the key directives include the completion of priority housing projects, ramping up housing production and finance in line with the Philippine Development Plan and Sustainable Development Goals, formulation of policies and guidelines to streamline housing permits and processes, promotion of effective land use among LGUs and the development of internal systems and processes to strengthen institutional capacities.

Secretary Del Rosario noted that DHSUD, together with the KSAs, has been working tirelessly in addressing the housing needs of Filipinos, especially the underprivileged, despite numerous stumbling blocks since the Department’s full operationalization in 2020. Hecited the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and several typhoons that adversely affected numerous parts of the country as among the sticking points that had hampered DHSUD’s operations. The good

thing was, according to Secretary Del Rosario, the Department and the KSAs stepped up to the plate and still delivered.

“To say that the past two years had been challenging is an understatement. But in spite and because of these challenges and difficulties, we have continued to persevere to deliver our targets and serve our people,” Secretary Del Rosario stressed.

The housing czar also commended the KSAs after they presented their respective key accomplishments for 2021.

“Despite all the roadblocks, I am proud and happy with what we have accomplished. As we know, the term of the current administration is nearing its completion, with barely six months remaining. Much has been done, but there is still so much more we need to do to accomplish the targets we have earlier set,” Secretary Del Rosario added.

Hence, he reiterated his call for the NHSUDCC to further maximize their efforts in attaining their goals for this year and beyond.

The NHSUDCC is composed of the heads of the National Housing Authority (NHA), the Home Development Mutual Fund or Pag-IBIG Fund, the National Home Mortgage Finance Corporation (NHMFC), the Social Housing Finance Corporation (SFHC) and the Human Settlements Adjudication Commission (HSAC).

Officially activated in June last year, the committee serves as a platform to strengthen coordination between DHSUD and KSAs in carrying out the Department’s housing and urban development policies and programs nationwide. Chaired by the DHSUD Secretary, the committee is tasked to recommend policies and programs for approval of the National Human Settlement Board, monitor and evaluate the functions of KSAs and facilitate the harmonization of housing programs and streamlining of processes to eliminate overlaps. **(DHSUD)**

LUNGSOD NG CALAMBA (PIA) – Umaasa ang mga lokal na magpapalay mula sa mga lalawigan ng Laguna, Batangas, at Quezon sa muling pagbangon ng kanilang industriya sa tulong ng Rice Farmers Financial Assistance (RFFA) mula sa pamahalaan.

Noong Enero 10, sinimulan ng Department of Agriculture Region 4-A (DA Calabarzon) ang pamamahagi ng tulong pinansyal para sa mga maliit na magpapalay sa rehiyon.

Unang nagtungo ang DA 4-A sa lalawigan ng Quezon upang ipamahagi ang nasa P1,690,000 halaga ng tulong pinansyal para sa 338 benepisyaryo mula sa mga bayan ng Catanauan, Mulanay, San Francisco, Buenavista, Macalelon, at San Narciso.

Kasunod nito, 270 magsasaka mula sa mga bayan ng Majayjay at Liliw sa lalawigan ng Laguna ang nabigyan ng tig-P5,000 halaga ng tulong ng kagawaran. Umabot sa P1,350,000.000 ang kabuuang halaga ng cash assistance na naibigay ng pamahalaan sa mga nasabing bayan.

Laking pasasalamat naman ng 989 magpapalay mula sa bayan ng Nasugbu nang tumulak ang kagawaran sa kanilang bayan noong

Enero 12. Umabot naman sa P3,715,000 ang kabuuang halaga ng tulong pinansyal na ibinigay ng pamahalaan para sa 743 nmagpapalay mula sa mga bayan ng Cavinti at Luisiana noong Enero 13.

Ayon kay Marilyn Ilaog sa isa sa mga magpapalay na naging benepisyaryo ng nasabing programa, napakalaki ng kanilang pasasalamat sa patuloy na pag-aabot ng tulong para sa mga tulad niyang maliit na magsasaka.

“Napakalaking tulong nito sa paghahanda namin sa susunod na planting season ‘yung halagang ipinagkaloob nila,” ani Ilaog. Ayon sa DA Calabarzon, isa lamang ang Rice Farmers Financial Assistance sa mga proyekto ng kanilang tanggapan sa ilalim ng Rice Competitive Enhancement Fund (RCEF).

Matatandang ipinasa ng pamahalaan ang Republic Act No. 11203 o ang Rice Tariffication Law na layuning magpataw ng taripa sa mga bigas na inaangkat mula sa ibang bansa.

Aeta community receives sewing machines from DOST

CALAMBA CITY (PIA) – The Aeta Community of San Luis town in Batangas will soon have its very own sewing services industry, with the help of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST).

Last January 18, the DOST Batangas Provincial Office formally turned over manual sewing machines to ensure productivity of the community enterprise. The DOST will also host a technology transfer training on dress making in Barangay Banoyo later this month.

Members of the Aeta community thanked the DOST for the support they received, such as the off-grid solar power system which helped in charging their mobile devices and emergency lights.

“Napakalaking tulong po nitong solar [system] na kaloob sa amin. Dati po dumadayo pa kami sa baba para maki-charge, ngayon po ay dito na kami lalo ang mga kabataan,” said Mr. Zosimo Magtibay who is also the Chieftain of the beneficiary Aeta community.

Aside from the solar lights and sewing kits, the DOST

also provided sewing starter packs to help them launch a productive sewing industry.

In his message, Magitbay said other members of their communities are still overwhelmed by projects the agency launched for their community.

The DOST will also provide business-related trainings in order to help the community enrich their sewing services enterprise by equipping them with proper knowledge on business principles and strategies.

Currently, around 275 people in 68 families form the said Aeta community. They currently reside in 30 houses and share one (1) comfort room facility.

As part of the Poverty Reduction, Livelihood and Employment Cluster (PRLEC) of the Calabarzon Regional Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict (RTF-ELCAC), DOST CALABARZON launched the Project Aetaguayod: Establishment of an S&T Based Community Livelihood, in partnership with the municipal government of San Luis. **(PB/DOST)**

Cases filed in 4 ‘drug war’ cases; others still under review

MANILA – Four of 52 incidents under review for suspicious deaths during police operations have resulted in criminal cases. Cases have been filed in Regional Trial Courts involving the deaths of Carl Angelo Arnaiz (Navotas City); Richard Santillan and Gessamyn Casing (Cainta City, Rizal); Anwar Sawadjaan, Noel Bacalzo, and Angelo Hofer (Zamboanga del Norte); and Sharif Amatonding (San Pedro, Laguna). Last year, the Philippine National Police Internal Affairs Services released information on the 52 cases to the Department of Justice (DOJ), part of the more than 150 incidents under review.

The DOJ has since turned over the case files to the National Bureau of Investigation (NBI).

“Per the initial report of the NBI dated 4 January 2022, most of the 52 cases turned over by the PNP Internal Affairs Service are still under evaluation by the regional offices or are presently subject of case build-up,” DOJ Secretary Menardo Guevarra said via text message on Tuesday. Arnaiz, 19, was found dead 10 days after he left his home in Cainta, Rizal in 2017.

According to the Caloocan police, Arnaiz tried to rob taxi driver, Tomas Bagcal, who was taking the teenager home from Navotas City.

The driver sought police assistance and in an ensuing firefight, Arnaiz was shot. Three packets of marijuana and shabu were allegedly recovered from the fatality.

France opens 2 scholarship programs for Filipinos

MANILA – The French Embassy in Manila is now accepting applications for two government scholarship programs for Academic Year 2022-2023.

The first program, called “PhilFrance Scholarships”, targets highly-qualified candidates who have demonstrated strong academic and leadership qualities in their scholarly and professional activities. Awardees may pursue a master’s degree taught in French higher education institutions, either public or private, in all academic disciplines.

They will be granted the status of boursier du gouvernement français (French government scholar) and will be given a tuition subsidy, one round-trip ticket from Manila to France, an exemption from visa application fees, a monthly living allowance covering the duration of their studies, a health care package, and priority access to public student accommodations.

The second program, called the PhilFrance-Department of Science and Technology (DOST) Scholarship, is geared towards Filipino professionals working in academic, research, or government institutions who are interested to pursue a master’s degree

The PhilFrance-DOST Scholarship program prioritizes the following fields of study: agriculture, bioengineering, bioinformatics (medical), biological sciences, climate change, forestry, health and medical research, material sciences, medical chemistry, natural resources and environment, nuclear application on health, nuclear medicine, veterinary sciences, and virology.

Awardees of the PhilFrance-DOST Scholarship will be granted the status of boursier du gouvernement français (French government scholar) and will get an exemption from public university registration fees, one round-trip ticket from Manila to France, an exemption from visa application fees, a monthly living allowance covering the duration of their studies, a relocation allowance, coverage of pre-travel expenses, a health care package, and priority access to public student accommodations. Selected candidates of the PhilFrance-DOST Scholarship must return to the Philippines immediately after the completion of their graduate degree to render return service or a period equivalent to twice the length of time that they spent in France for their degree.

Interested candidates must submit their applications through the PhilFrance Scholarships site no later than noon of April 4, 2022. Since 2016, the PhilFrance Scholarship Program has funded the studies of more than 65 Filipinos who have been able to pursue their graduate degrees in the French language and literature, business, public policy and international development, engineering, mathematics, marine biology, applied chemistry, environmental and ecological sciences, physics, computer science, and public health in several of France’s

Rejected party-list group obtains TRO vs. Comelec

MANILA – The Supreme Court (SC) on Monday issued yet another temporary restraining order (TRO) against the Commission on Elections (Comelec) regarding the dismissal of the registration of a party-list organization. The TRO signed by Deputy Clerk of Court Anna-Li Gombio, by authority of Chief Justice Alexander Gesmundo, gave the Comelec a non-extendible period of 10 days to file a comment on the suit filed by Juan-Pinagkaisang Ordinaryong Mamamayan Para Yumabong (Juan Pinoy).

The group sought a TRO

on January 3, questioning Comelec for dismissing its petition for registration on Oct. 12, 2021.

Juan Pinoy’s motion for reconsideration on December 13 was likewise turned down.

Party-list groups that obtained TROs prior to the printing on January 20 are among the 178 that will appear on the ballots.

The Comelec said it will print 65,745,512 ballots for local voting and 1,697,202 ballots for overseas voting. It is unclear yet how party-lists that will win their bids for inclusion in the May 9 polls will be accommodated in the ballots. **(PNA)**

BSP eyes to finish probe into BDO cyberattack by month’s end

MANILA – Monetary authorities aim to finish by the end of this month the investigation on cyber-hacking of several accounts with the Sy-led BDO Unibank Inc. (BDO). “In addition to that ongoing investigation, the BSP continues its cyber threat surveillance with the latest reports that cyber threat actors increasingly rely on social engineering to perpetrate their fraudulent activities,” Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) Governor Benjamin Diokno said in a virtual briefing on Monday.

He said the central bank “continues to aggressively coordinate with law enforcement agencies to arrest and prosecute scammers and with

relevant government and private sector players to address emerging cyber-related threats and fraud.”

Last December, monetary authorities said around 700 BDO accounts were hacked, with some accounts fraudulently withdrawn of funds that were transferred to several Union Bank of the Philippines (Unionbank) accounts.

Earlier, Diokno said they were in close coordination with officials of the two banks as well as with other government agencies to run after the perpetrators.

“BSP will do everything to ensure the safety and integrity of the financial system as well as the protection of financial consumers,” he said. **(PNA)**

BOC marks 17.04-B liters of fuel, collects P165.96-B Taxes for 2021

Now on its third year of implementation, the Bureau of Customs (BOC) marked 17,0336,061,436 liters of gasoline, diesel and kerosene and collected taxes amounting to P165.96 billion from January to December 2021 through the continuing implementation of the

most prestigious higher education institutions.

These include the Aix-Marseille Université, École des hautes études en santé publique (EHESP), École Polytechnique, Institut National des Sciences Appliquées (INSA) de Toulouse, Sciences Po, and Université Paris-Saclay. **(PNA)**

In line with the program’s campaign to address fuel smuggling, the BOC and BIR apprehended a total of 86,888 liters of diesel and kerosene and seized two (2) units of tank trucks carrying unmarked fuel with estimated value of P5.16 million and P7.4 million, respectively. Tanks of eight (8) retail stations were these unmarked fuel were found was likewise sealed and recommended for filing of criminal cases.

Since its implementation in September 2019 to December 2021, the BOC and BIR marked 34.59 billion liters of fuel and generated revenue amounting to P313.98 billion. **PR**

MALIBAN kung may dagdag na pondo na bumuhos, ang mga atletang Pilipino ay kailangang gumawa ng paraan sa kung ano ang magagamit sa paghahanda nila para sa 31st Southeast Asian Games sa Hanoi sa Mayo.

"Kailangan nating harapin ang katotohanan dahil sa pandemyang ito," sabi ni Philippine Olympic Committee (POC) president Abraham Tolentino sa online Philippine Sportswriters Association (PSA) Forum.

Sa katunayan, sinabi ni Tolentino na kakaunti ang pag-asa na ang 584 na atleta sa listahan ng POC ay maaaring magsimula sa pagsasanay sa ibang bansa halos apat na buwan bago subukan ng Pilipinas na pagtanggap ang pangkalahatang korona ng SEA Games.

"I doubt kung meroon pang overseas training," aniya sa forum na ipinakita ng San Miguel Corporation, MLOO Philippines, Amelie Hotel Manila, Braska Restaurant, Unilever, at PAGCOR, kasama ang Prime Edge Marketing Consultancy bilang social media at webcast partner.

Tila babalik sa normal ang lahat ilang buwan na ang nakalipas hanggang sa lumabas ang variant ng COVID Omicron sa larawan at iniwan ang paghahanda sa SEA Games pabalik sa square one.

"Nakakahinga na sana ng konti eh," ani Tolentino, umaasang may sapat na panahon ang POC para makakuha ng suporta mula sa Kongreso at pribadong sektor para mapalakas ang budget para sa SEA Games.

Dahil dito, ang Philippine Sports Commission (PSC) ay mayroong P121 milyong pondo na inilaan para sa SEA Games. Sa orihinal, ang badyet ay nasa P200 milyon, ngunit napakaraming pera ang nagastos para sa pagsasanay bago magsimula ang pandemya.

Tolentino, who ended up asking himself if the Philippines can keep the overall title sa kabila ng matinding hamon mula sa host Vietnam.

"Maaari ba nating ipagtanggol ang pangkalahatang kampeonato? Ang daming nangyari. Mahirap sagutin yan. Pangalawa, malaki ang epekto ng budgetary constraints sa ating kampanya," he said.

"Kaya pa rin i-defend pero uphill batte," ani Tolentino, at idinagdag na ang host country ay nag-scrap ng mahigit 40 events kung saan nanalo ang Pilipinas ng gintong medalya noong 2019, at nagdagdag ng higit sa 30 event kung saan ang mga host ay pinapaboran na manalo ngayong taon.

TANZA COVID-19 VACCINATION RESUMES WITH RECOVERY OF HCWs

TRECE MARTIRES, Cavite (PIA) – The CoVid-19 Vaccination program rollout of the municipality of Tanza recently resumed operations after the gradual recovery from the disease of the healthcare workers (HCWs) who are members of the vaccination team of the Rural Health Unit (RHU).

Among those who were infected was Municipal Health Officer Dr. Ruth Punzalan, who manifested mild symptoms of the disease and has quickly recovered along with other HCWs.

According to Dr. Punzalan, around eighty healthcare workers have been infected, from RHU staff to Barangay HCWs who were exposed during the conduct of COVID-19 vaccination.

The number of quarantined HCWs slowed the vaccination team prompting the RHU to declared a break for the vaccination activity on Thursday and Friday, January 13 & 14, and over the weekend.

Meanwhile, the target number for herd immunity had been revised by the Department of Health for the year 2022, from 70% of target population which for the municipality of Tanza is about 185K to the new target of 70% of the projected population which now totaled to 212K residents including children aged 5 – 11 years.

With the resumption of RHU operations, the new target number of vaccinees for 2022 could now be achieved with more than 3K CoVid-19 vaccine doses administered daily.

Based on the RHU data as of January 19, 2022, a total of 157,217 eligible members of the priority groups are now fully vaccinated while 167,409 had received the first dose of the CoVid-19 vaccines which is about 74% of the new target.

Dr. Punzalan noted an increase in the registered vaccinees which may be due to restrictions in the movement of unvaccinated individuals as mandated by

the national government.

“As of now, we are prioritizing recipients of the 1st and 2nd dose for those who now wish to get protected with the CoVid-19 vaccines while the distribution of booster shots will be announced in the coming days,” stated Dr. Punzalan.

DTI streamlines application for Certificate of Authority to Import used motor vehicles

MAKATI CITY -- The Department of Trade and Industry's Fair Trade Enforcement Bureau (DTI-FTEB) marked the first year of its streamlining project for the application of Certificate of Authority to Import (CAI) through its Integrated Registration and Information Systems (IREGIS) last 2 December 2021. The digital transition was launched in 2020 and since then, DTI-FTEB has been maintaining the faster, easier, and more efficient processing of CAI applications.

Prior to importation of used motor vehicles, parts, and components, importers must secure a CAI first at the DTI-FTEB office. It is a statutory requirement under Executive Order (EO) No. 156 dated 12 December 2002 entitled “Providing for a Comprehensive Industrial Policy and Directions for the Motor Vehicle Development Program and Its Implementing Guidelines”, as amended by EO No. 877 A, better known as “The Comprehensive Motor Vehicle Development Program”.

Today, applicants may acquire their CAIs in four easy steps – connect, submit, pay, and receive. First, connect and register to IREGIS NegosyoKonek as Negosyo Applicant, then go to Import Application Menu to fill out initial application information and pay the initial assessment fee of P150.00 through DTI Pay. Next, complete the application details, download and have the system generated application form with Token Number and affidavit of undertaking notarized. Upload the notarized application form and Affidavit of Undertaking together with other documentary requirements to the IREGIS portal. FTEB will

BSP reminds public to be vigilant when receiving banknotes

MANILA -- The Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) reminds the public to regularly inspect banknotes for authenticity through the “feel, look, tilt” approach to protect oneself against counterfeiting. Should a banknote dispensed by an ATM be suspected as a counterfeit, the holder is advised to immediately report it to the bank that owns the machine.

The bank will then conduct a thorough investigation to verify whether the banknote was indeed dispensed by the bank's ATM. If the holder's claim is verified, the bank should replace the banknote in question.

The BSP likewise assures the public that banks employ

adequate risk management measures to deter such incidents.

Aside from the installation of cameras at ATM areas, cash handlers and service providers tasked to refill ATMs are trained to detect counterfeit banknotes or verify their genuineness before placing them in ATMs.

Under BSP Circular No. 829, Series of 2014, banks are required to submit suspicious banknotes to the BSP for further examination. **(BSP)**

DepEd empowers digital transformation in schools through nationwide distribution of annual Adobe licenses

PASIG CITY -- The Department of Education (DepEd) has provided all public schools nationwide with annual Adobe Creative Cloud Licenses to enhance the digital literacy skills of teachers and learners.

The Office of the Undersecretary for Administration (OUA), through the Information and Communications Technology Service (ICTS), has partnered with Adobe to procure around 108,000 licenses and the Creative Nation Academy on sharing knowledge and expertise on the use of these tools. The creative licenses have undergone speedy activation after distribution.

“DepEd must provide these licenses to our public schools because we are now in the creative development era. Anyone can be a content creator due to the simplification and adaptability of existing mobile devices where learning and design can blend as one,” Undersecretary for Administration Alain Del B. Pascua emphasized.

Undersecretary Pascua explained that the Department is preparing learners to be globally inclined and encouraging them to use industry-standard software to give them greater opportunities of landing a job.

Furthermore, Mr. Mark Sy, ICTS-Educational Technology Unit Head, also stressed that it is important to open gateways to the teaching force since they are the ones molding learners' transferrable skills.

‘Iconic’ Binondo-Intramuros Bridge ready by Holy Week 2022

MANILA – The Binondo-Intramuros Bridge project in Manila of the Department of Public Works and Highway (DPWH) is nearly 90 percent finished and expected to open to vehicular traffic by Holy Week this year.

In his report to DPWH Secretary Roger G. Mercado, Undersecretary and “Build, Build, Build” chief implementer Emil K. Sadain said the 680 meters bridge project across Pasig River is pretty

much finished with the main bridge itself having two lanes in each direction complete.

Sadain, in-charge of the Unified Project Management Office (UPMO) Operations, with UPMO Project Directors Benjamin A. Bautista, Sharif Madsmo H. Hasim, Ramon A. Arriola III, Rodrigo Delos Reyes, and Johnson Domingo; and Project Manager Mechor Kabling conducted rigorous inspection from Intramuros to Binondo on Monday to make sure that the project is done to the standards that are laid out in the contract.

“You can walk over the bridge, but still closed with ongoing construction of ramps on Binondo and Intramuros side,” Sadain said in a news release on Monday.

Mercado said he is extremely excited for the opening of the iconic basket-handle tied steel arch bridge that is expected to cut travel time between the districts of Binondo and Intramuros.

Implemented by UPMO Roads Management Cluster 1, the newest bridge in Manila which will benefit approximately 30,000 vehicles daily gives extra space for pedestrians and dedicated lane for bikers for improved safety and ease of traffic flow.

Equipment and crews are in the process of constructing access ramps made of prefabricated components from Shanghai, China at the Binondo side with an up-ramp located at Muelle dela Industria Street and down-ramps at Rentas Street and Plaza del Conde Street.

Simultaneously, construction of ramps at Intramuros side is ongoing with an up-ramp at Riverside Drive and down-ramp at Solana street.

The PHP3.39 billion project is financed by a government aid grant from the People's Republic of China.

“We are grateful to the men and women who worked so hard to build this bridge and thank the government of China and its contractor China Road and Bridge Corporation for their commitment to this project,” Sadain said.

The bridge project is one of the flagship infrastructure projects of DPWH under President Rodrigo Roa Duterte administration's BBB Program. **(PR)**

Enough power supply for May polls: DOE

MANILA—The Department of Energy (DOE) has assured the public that there will be enough power supply during the May 9 elections.

In a press briefing Tuesday, DOE director Mario Marasigan said the outlook hinges on the start of the original commercial operation of GNPowr Dinginin 2, which has a maximum capacity of 668 megawatts (MW).

"We can show you that there are no potential yellow alerts or red alerts for the entire year," Marasigan said.

However, considering the forced outages in the past years, the red alert could happen in two consecutive weeks after the election, he added.

Marasigan said the DOE, along with the Energy Task Force Election, identified possible solutions if there will be delays on the commercial operation of GNPowr Dinginin 2.

"We have to recognize that even if there will be delays in the commercial operation of GNPowr Dinginin 2, by April, they will already start the test and commissioning, and

at least 400 megawatts will be available on the grid," he said.

Marasigan said SMC Mariveles power plant is also expected to be online with a capacity of 150 MW. "Also another solution is we are seeing if we can optimize the Luzon-Visayas interconnection, up to 350 MW would still be available," he added.

DOE Undersecretary Felix William Fuentebella said the Energy Task Force Election will be working and coordinating closely to ensure that there will be no power interruption on election day.

The task force is composed of DOE, National Electrification Administration, National Power Corporation, National Transmission Corporation, Philippine National Oil Company, National Grid Corporation of the Philippines, Power Sector Assets and Liabilities Management Corporation, Philippine Electricity Market Corporation/ Independent Electricity Market Operator of the Philippines, and Manila Electric Company. (PNA)

2.14M avail of TESDA's online programs since pandemic began

MANILA — More than 2.14 million Filipinos have registered in the online programs of the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) since the start of the pandemic and the implementation of community quarantines in March 2020 until December last year.

In an interview on Tuesday, TESDA Director General, Secretary Isidro Lapeña, urged enrollment in the TESDA Online Program (TOP) that can be completed at home and at the students' own pace.

Lapeña said by enrolling in TOP, new skills would be acquired that can create new livelihoods or secure jobs.

"We continue to

encourage our kababayan (countrymen) to enroll in TOP. Since the start of the pandemic and until now, we remain very consistent in promoting the TOP, because we know that it can really help, especially the displaced workers and the repatriated OFWs (overseas Filipino workers)," he told the Philippine News Agency (PNA).

The 115 courses under TOP have lured 1,090,530 Filipinos, with 961,151 completing them.

The total includes 72,476 OFWs and their dependents.

Excluding the TOP, 1,209,659 individuals also enrolled in the regular training programs as of Dec. 31, 2021, producing

Come clean with figures on fish shortage and compare measures before importation permits, Legarda urges DA

Deputy Speaker and Antique Congresswoman Loren Legarda expressed her disapproval over the Department of Agriculture's planned importation of 60,000 metric tons of fish in the first quarter of this year.

The Department of Agriculture (DA) earlier said the country needed more than 800,000 MT of fish to meet the demand for January to March 2022. The importation was supposedly aimed primarily at stabilizing supply and keep prices in the wet markets from rising. One of the reasons cited for the possible increase in fish prices was the onslaught of Typhoon "Odette" which caused P3.97 billion in damage, and affected numerous coastal and fishing communities.

Additionally, there is the closed fishing season implemented by the Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) every year in the country's major fishing areas to allow fish species to spawn and recover. The closed fishing season impacts. To illustrate, retail prices of galunggong in Metro Manila averaged between P250 to P260 a kilo last week.

For her part, Legarda opposed the importation, noting the public outcry and the allegations that the DA needs to address, such as, that there is sufficient

supply from the previous importations still unsold that could tide us over, that previous importations have had little or no impact on fish prices, and that the closed season is about to be over. "We risk further marginalizing many of our small-scale fishers and coastal communities who are already vulnerable to a myriad of social and environmental changes. These policy decisions that tend to further bring down our most marginalized sectors must be based on evidence. Merely blaming Odette and not comparing other measures like faster provision of small boats and safety nets for the marginalized is not convincing."

She lamented: "This archipelago is still rich in resources, which is why we are repeatedly challenged to enforce laws against poaching. Instead of prioritizing band-aid solutions that help importers and big traders but are harmful to the entire industry in the long-term, we must craft policies and spending that uplifts the poor and ensures food security for all in the long term."

"I urge the government and the private sector, to rapidly mobilize and implement support mechanisms for small-scale fishers, coastal fishing communities, and associated people's organizations," Legarda added.

Legarda further said that, "our fishers in the coastal villages face a range of environmental challenges due to coastal erosion, mangrove destruction, the endangered species trade and, most seriously, overfishing. There is a need to consider the impact of illegal, unreported, and unregulated fishing practices. These are the reasons for our dwindling supply. Rather than using government resources to import more fish, why don't we use these resources to ensure marine resource sustainability and livelihood security in coastal communities? Why not safeguard pollution control and environmental conservation through strict

enforcement of marine fisheries laws?"

Legarda stressed the need for support services to improve the socio-economic conditions of coastal fishing communities, with consideration for gender and ecological supply chains. As an archipelagic nation, fisheries are essential to the country's economy in terms of food security and employment. More than half of animal protein consumption (60%) of the country comes from fish or seafood. Over a million Filipinos are engaged in

marine fishing. Of these, an estimated 800,000 are small-scale fishermen using traditional, low-cost techniques, notably net fishing from small boats and the fish corral. "And yet, we fail to give the most support to small-scale fisheries where livelihoods are under most immediate pressure from marine resource competition and degradation. We cannot reach our Sustainable Development Goals if we are only looking at the macro and not the micro," Legarda concluded. PR

MANILA – The government has started providing emergency shelter assistance to the victims of Typhoon Odette that swept through parts of the Visayas and Mindanao last December.

"Ang NHA (National Housing Authority) naman ay kasalukuyang nag-i-implement ng emergency shelter assistance, sila ay nakapag-download na sa mga local government units ng PHP487 million (The NHA is presently implementing its emergency shelter assistance and they have already downloaded around PHP487 million to local government units)," Undersecretary Ricardo Jalad, National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) executive director, said in his report to President Rodrigo Duterte during the Talk to the People briefing on Monday night.

Jalad said aside from the NHA, around PHP4.8 billion in funds from the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) for the same purpose have been downloaded to local government units (LGUs).

"At mayroong recommendation na ibibigay ang NDRRMC sa inyo, Mr. President, para sa karagdagang emergency shelter assistance, (Mr. President, the NDRRMC will submit a recommendation to you regarding the grant of additional emergency shelter assistance)," Jalad

said.

Meanwhile, Jalad said the government has so far transported 7.1 million kilograms of relief goods to areas severely affected by the typhoon.

Jalad also reported that the Department of Social Welfare and Development has so far distributed a total of 786,000 family food packs worth PHP440 million to Western Visayas, Central Visayas, Eastern Visayas and Caraga.

Jalad, who is also the administrator of the Office of Civil Defense (OCD), said post-disaster needs assessment (PDNA) for typhoon-affected areas is expected to be concluded by the end of January.

He added that the PDNA is now being conducted by 21 teams on 95 local government units who reported losses and damage due to "Odette". Jalad said that these will be submitted to the Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (RDRRMCs) who will then forward it to the NDRRMC by mid-February.

"Odette" has so far affected 2.3 million families or around 8 million individuals.

Around 406 people were reported dead, along with 65 missing and 1,265 injured with 339,478 individuals still residing and being helped in 1,146 evacuation centers.

Some 1.3 million houses were also damaged by the typhoon. (PNA)

Para hindi maipit ng procuremen ban KAILANGANG MGA KAGAMITAN, SERBISYO, PRODUKTO VS COVID-19, BILHIN NA AGAD – CHIZ

Ngayong panahon na ng eleksiyon at malapit nang mag-umpisa ang kampanyahan, pinaalalahanan ni Sorsogon Gov. Chiz Escudero ang pambansang gobyerno at mga lokal na pamahalaan na bilhin na ang mga kinakailangang kagamitan, serbisyo at produkto upang hindi maipit ng procurement ban ang pagtugon ng bansa sa pandemya.

Sa ilalim ng Circular 03-2021 ng Government Procurement Policy Board (GPPB), wala nang iisang mga notice of awards para sa mga proyektong may kaugnayan sa pabahay, mga gawaing pambayan, at pagpapaunlad panlipunan mula Marso 25 hanggang Mayo 8.

“Nasasaamin nang mga lokal na pinuno at pati na mga kalihim ng mga kagawaran kung papayagan naming maparalisa ang ating paglaban sa COVID-19 nang dahil lang sa 2022 elections, lalo’t pumapalo ng 25,000 ang impeksyon araw-araw. Hindi dapat matigil ang epektibong pandemic response nang dahil lang may procurement ban. Paghandaan natin ito ngayon pa lang,” ani Escudero na kumakandidato para sa Senado.

Ayon kay Escudero, ang pinamamahalaan niyang probinsiya, na nasa Alert Level 3, ay nagsimulang bumili ng home care kits sa pag-uumpisa pa lamang ng pandemya noong 2020 at ipinamimigay nila ang mga ito ngayon sa mga mild at asymptomatic COVID-19 patient. Dahil napaghandaan, aniya, hindi punuan ngayon sa mga ospital ng probinsiya kahit may nangyayaring pagtaas sa numero mga kaso ng COVID-19 dito.

“Alam naman natin three years ago pa na may eleksiyon at may mga paghihigpit at limitasyon

ang puwedeng magawa ng kada ahensya ng pamahalaan. Kaya kami sa lalawigan ay nag-early procurement para hindi abutan ng election ban ang bidding ng mga proyekto na kailangan dumaan naman talaga sa proseso. Hindi dapat ma-delay ang anumang programa, proyekto at lalong-lalo na ang COVID-19 response dahil lamang sa kampanya,” ani Escudero.

Hinimok ni Escudero ang Commission on Elections (COMELEC) na payagan nito na mapagtuloy ang ilang social welfare projects, tulad ng testing at teleconsultations para sa mga nagka-COVID-19, kahit panahon na ng kampanya.

“Dahil may pandemya ngayon at kita naman ng lahat na matapos ang dalawang taon ay wala pa rin tayong sapat na kahandaan, sana ay huwag ng hadlangan ng COMELEC ang mga ahensya na nagbibigay-tulong at kapakinabangan sa nakararaming tao,” aniya.

Kung papayagan ng COMELEC, maaaring isama ng GPPB sa listahan ng mga exempted sa procurement ban ang mga tinutukoy na serbisyo ni Escudero. **PR**

Kaya naman ang apela ng BPLO sa mga entrepreneurs ay isagawa ang business online for a seamless and contactless business permit renewal.

Ang bagong sistema sa pagkuha ng business permit ay wala ng mga fixers na nag-aalok ng insurance.

Unang gagawin ay mag

fill-up sa pamagitan ng online, kapag hindi naman alam ay nandyan ang mga empleyado na tutulong at aalalay upang makapag-rehistro.

Dahil sa kanilang isinagawang online registration ay nalimitahan na ang pagdagsa ng mga taong kukuha o mag-renew ng business permit at ipinatupad din ang social distancing, lalo na nananatili ang banta ng COVID-19.

Tinitiyak naman sa pag-renew ng business permit na naipapatupad ang mga health protocols.

Nabatid na sa bagong sistema, ang mga negosyanteng mag-renew ng kanilang business permit ay required ang QR Code para makakuha ng insurance. Ang nasabing QR Code ay isang paraan at proteksyon sa mga Pasayeño upang makasiguro na ang kanilang nakuhang insurance ay authentic, hindi peke at higit sa lahat ay lehitimo.

Matapos makapag-rehistro at mayroon ng QR Code, ang sunod na gagawin ay sundan na lamang ang nakapaskil: Step 1: Validation/Verification, Step 2: Assessment/Payment and Step 3: Releasing. Hihintayin na lamang tawagin para sa releasing at makukuha na ang business permit.

Meron ding nakalaan na priority lane para sa mga senior citizens, pregnant women at person with disability (PWD).

Ang nasabing hakbang sa paglilinis sa departamento

ng BPLO ay upang tuluyan ng maalis ang naglipanang mga fixers.

Napag-alaman na si City Treasurer Tecson ay isang Certified Public Accountant (CPA) at license Real Estate Appraiser na nagtapos ng kolehiyo sa Philippine School of Business Administration (PSBA), Manila.
