MAYOR'S PERMIT WAIVED TO AID NOVELETA TRIKE DRIVERS

TRECEMARTIRES, Cavite (PIA) – The Noveleta Municipal Government waives the Mayor's Permit renewal fee for tricycle drivers in order to aid to the members of the local transport sector.

A Sangguniang Bayan resolution was recently approved for this intent upon the request of Mayor Dino Reyes-Chua to the Municipal Council with Vice Mayor Arlyn Torres and ten members of the local council voting for the approval of said resolution. The waived renewal fee amounts to P 300.00 to aims to alleviate the losses sustained during the period of non-operations due to quarantine restrictions on travel.

With the waiving of the renewal fee, tricycle operators will only be required to process for the issuance of 2022 Tricycle plates.

"Our tricycle drivers and operators, around 2,000 of them need to pay only

P 200.00 for the plate since we had waived the P 300.00 Mayor's Permit fee for them to cope up and lessen the expenses of renewing their permits," Mayor Chua said.

To further help the members of this transport group, the LGU ordered the RHU to give way for the vaccination for Booster shots for tricycle drivers and ambulant vendors every Saturday at the Noveleta Health Center for the added protection of the drivers against COVID-19. Despite their return to operations with the gradual loosening of quarantine protocols to help the economy recover, their income is still insufficient for their daily living expenses. However, the local government of Noveleta had continuously granted aid to the tricycle drivers in the almost two years amidst the ongoing COVID-19 crisis. **(Ruel Francisco with reports from Dennis Abrina)**

Dasma public hospital restricts entry to unvaxxed

Trece Martires, Cavite (PIA) – The management of the Pagamutan ng Dasmariñas, recently implemented the requirement for the presentation of CoVID-19 vaccination card of individuals who need to access medical services and allow entry to the facility.

According to the Public Advisory of the said hospital, regulations allow patients for confinement whether vaccinated or not to be admitted in the hospital as well as children 11 years below who are not yet vaccinated against CoVID-19 may enter the facility but their aide, companions, and parents need to be fully vaccinated.

Patients undergoing dialysis in the hospital need to be fully vaccinated though those with partial vaccination shall also be accepted.

Meanwhile, unvaccinated dialysis patients need to show negative RT-PCR test

taken every two weeks. All other individuals who wish to enter the facility or need to access medical services from the Out-Patient Department (OPD), Physical Therapy (PT), ECG, Laboratory and X-Ray will be required to answer the Health Declaration Form at the Triage area and should present their vaccination card.

Persons who remain unvaccinated may present a doctor's certificate to prove their health condition that restrict them from getting the vaccine. On the other hand, individuals in emergency situations whether vaccinated or not shall be accepted and given medical services in the Emergency Room. **(Ruel Francisco, PIA-Cavite with reports from Pagamutan ng Dasmariñas)**

CoVid Care Kits provided to city's HQ symptomatic patients

Imus City, Cavite (PIA)

– The city government's Home Mitigation Program initiative that aims to diminish the rapid transmission of the CoVID-19 omicron variant included the provision of CoVid-19 Care Kits to confirmed positive symptomatic patients undergoing home quarantine.

According to Jay Saquilayan, Chief of Imus City Public Information Office, "Once a symptomatic patient tested positive with the antigen test, he/she undergoes Real Time Polymerase Chain Reaction Test (RT PCR) for confirmation."

Positive patients with no symptoms are advised to isolate for required period of time while positive symptomatic patients undergo home quarantine and are provided CoVid-19 Care Kits from the city government with priority to members of the vulnerable sector such as the Senior Citizens, Persons with comorbidities and Persons with Disabilities (PWDs).

These care kits were distributed to the 97 Barangays in the city which are given to the identified positive symptomatic patients in each barangay. Members of the Expanded Home Mitigation Team led by the employees of the City of Imus Traffic Management Office (CITMO) and the Imus City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (CDRRMO) conduct the house-to-house distribution of the CoVID-19 Care Kits to prevent the patients and the members of the household from leaving their houses to buy the needed medication.

CoVid Care kits include medicines and supplements such as the Mulnopyravir, Sodium Ascorbate+Zinc, oral rehydration solution, and other medicines (Levofloxacin 750mg tablets; Dexamethasone 500mg capsules) to treat the symptoms caused by CoVid-19 virus. **(Ruel Francisco, PIA-Cavite with reports from Imus City PIO)**

Prov'l ordinance passed to honor Cavite nonagenarians

Trece Martires, Cavite (PIA) – The Provincial Government of Cavite thru the Sangguniang Panlalawigan recently passed and approved Provincial Ordinance no. 343-2022 otherwise known as the "The Nonagenarians Cash Gift Ordinance", an ordinance honoring and granting cash gifts to the Nonagenarian Citizens of the Province of Cavite and appropriating funds thereof.

The ordinance sponsored by Sangguniang Panlalawigan Board Members: Hon. Dennis T. Lacson and Hon. Ivey Jaynee A. Reyes in the 124th Regular session aims to provide benefits to the Senior Citizens in recognition of their vital values and contributions to the development of the province.

The order declares that in addition to other benefits and privileges granted under existing laws, ordinances, rules and regulations the eligible Caviteño Nonagenarians shall be given a Certificate of Recognition, and cash gifts in the amount of Php5,000 during the Annual Elderly Filipino Week celebrated every month of October.

Senior Citizens who have been residing in the

province for at least five years and had reached 90 – 99 years of age must register at the Office of the Senior Citizens Affairs (OSCA) at their respective city/municipality for proper identification and documentation.

Certifications from the Barangay and from OSCA to certify their residency in the province and membership with the OSCA for at least five years with the latter certified by the City/Municipality Social Welfare and Development Office are requirements to secure receipt of these benefits.

During the implementation of the ordinance, all individuals aged 90-99 shall receive the cash award provided they meet all requirements specified in the ordinance. Recipients will be divided into two (2) age groups: 90 – 94 and 95 – 99, and awards will be granted on different timetables.

Annual appropriations for the nonagenarian cash awards shall be included in the Provincial Social Welfare and Development funds with changes in the amount of the cash award depending on the availability of funds. **(Ruel Francisco with reports from the Cavite Provincial Information Office)**

'Hospitainers' increase capacity of city's CoVid-19 center

Bacoor City, Cavite (PIA)

– The Southern Tagalog Regional Hospital (STRH), the 75-bed capacity Ligas CoVid-19 Center here was given an additional 24-bed capacity with the opening of the 'Hospitainers' on Friday, January 21, 2022. This is an initiative of the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) in coordination with the office of the Deputy Speaker Strike B. Revilla, the City Government of Bacoor, and the Department of Health (DOH) – CALABARZON in response to the continuing surge of Covid-19 cases in the city.

Said 'hospitainers' is an off-site modular hospital that can accommodate up to 24 mild to severe CoVid-19 patients equipped with a Close Monitoring/Intensive Care Unit, a Command Center Office, a TeleMedicine Office, a Triage area, and a guardhouse.

"The van-type isolation facility for COVID-19 patients is part of our continuous commitment to providing quality and accessible health services to Caviteños in general, especially during this time of the pandemic," stated Second District of Cavite Representative Strike B.

Revilla.

According to DOH Secretary Francisco T. Duque III, the system was developed to respond properly and effectively to patients affected by Covid-19.

During the event, 600 pieces of COVID-19 Kalinga Kits were turned over to the city government for distribution to confirmed positive Covid-19 patients. The kit consists of paracetamol tablets, Vitamin C tablets, two (2) pieces of Alcolgel, two (2) pieces of soap, a COVID-19 information sheet, one (1) roll of tissue, one (1) bottle of disinfectant, and face masks.

"Nagkaisa kami para makabuo ng Kalinga kits para patibayin at pahusayin ang ating home isolation at quarantine facilities," Secretary Duque said.

(We have teamed up to develop Kalinga kits to strengthen and improve our home isolation and quarantine facilities.) The provision of Kalinga Kits was made possible through partnerships with the World Health Organization (WHO), Unilab, and Procter and Gamble Philippines. **(Ruel Francisco, PIA-Cavite)**

2nd omicron variant case detected in Tanza town

TRECE MARTIRES, Cavite (PIA)

– The Rural Health Unit (RHU) of the municipality of Tanza reported the detection of another patient positive with the COVID-19 omicron variant in the locality on Friday, January 29, 2022.

Municipal Health Officer Dr. Ruth Punzalan confirmed the report, identifying the 2nd case as a 49-year old male who tested positive with the RT-PCR test on December 24 but was confirmed as omicron variant thru genome sequencing on January 27.

According to Dr. Punzalan, the said patient had fully recovered as well as the rest of his family dispelling fears of further transmission. It could be recalled that around the third week of January, the RHU had reported the detection of the first confirmed omicron variant in the town, a 44-year old male who had no history of travel and had not traveled outside of town. Dr. Punzalan said that the positive omicron variant case may not be the only one in the town since the rate of the transmission had been swift, increasing from 5 Active cases reported on December 27, 2021 to 75 Active cases on

January 4, 2022.

"It may be assumed that the rapid increase in positive cases is secondary to the omicron variant since omicron is highly transmissible," said Dr. Punzalan.

The health official further added that what was notable was majority of the positive cases reported were asymptomatic or mild cases since positive patients are either fully vaccinated or had received the first dose.

"The protection we get from COVID-19 vaccines prevent the occurrence of severe symptoms of the disease that is why we highly encourage our citizens to get vaccinated against COVID-19," said Dr. Punzalan.

The COVID-19 Vaccination program of Tanza LGU recorded more than 162K individuals that are fully vaccinated and more than 172K had received the 1st dose.

The number of vaccinated individuals is about 81% of the target 212K residents for the year 2022 which includes the pediatric population aged 12 – 17 years. **(Ruel Francisco with reports from Balitang Tanzeño)**

Winners of ASEAN's 6th Zooming in on Biodiversity bared

LAGUNA -- With the ongoing pandemic, photographs of nature have the power to inspire and cultivate a deeper appreciation for biodiversity and its protection.

On Monday afternoon, the ASEAN Centre for Biodiversity (ACB) announced the winners of the ASEAN-wide photography competition, Zooming in on Biodiversity via Zoom and Facebook live, after a thorough evaluation of photo and digital content entries.

Organised by the ACB in partnership with the European Union (EU) through the Biodiversity Conservation and Management of Protected Areas in ASEAN (BCAMP) Project, the competition was opened in November 2021 to all amateur and professional photographers and creatives in the ASEAN region.

It is part of a regional campaign #WeAreASEANBiodiversity campaign, which aims to raise awareness and mobilise support for biodiversity conservation in the region.

"(An image) can tell us a compelling story and even bring us to places we haven't seen, heard, or experienced. Such power of photography has become even more important today, as our movement continues to be limited due to the continuing threat of COVID-19 and its emergent variants," ACB Executive Director Theresa Mundita Lim said in a recorded video message.

She said the photographs of land- and seascapes, plants, and animals are reminders of the essential role of biodiversity in our daily survival.

The sixth staging of Zooming in on Biodiversity has two categories: the general category, #WeAreASEANBiodiversity: I am part of the solution, which focuses on the richness of ASEAN's rich biodiversity, and the active role of people, as part of nature, as a vital part of the solution to conserving this rich natural heritage, and the ASEAN Heritage Parks (AHP) special category, which highlights the natural and cultural richness of the 50 AHPs.

The finalists were judged following a set of criteria: relevance, composition, creativity, and technical excellence. The panel of judges was composed of ACB's Lim; Ileana Mirutescu, programme manager of the EU Delegation to the Philippines; and professional photographer Sheryl Aguiba.

Aung Chan Thar of Myanmar bagged the grand prize in the general category and the People's Choice Award for the AHP category.

The second place and third place of the general category went to Kyaw Zay Yar Lin of Myanmar and Arturo B. De Vera Jr. of the Philippines, respectively.

Aung Kyaw Zaw of Myanmar is the People's Choice Awardee garnering the highest number of likes on Facebook.

For the AHP category, Kyaw Kyaw Winn of Myanmar won first place while Tran Viet Linh of Viet Nam and Danny Ocampo of the Philippines came in second and third.

Meanwhile, in, the #WeAreASEANBiodiversity Tiktok Challenge, Pavina Vongsouvanh of Lao PDR won the Creativity Award. Maria Fe Felicilda of the Philippines had the most liked entry and bagged the People's Choice Award.

Winners took home prizes between USD 300 and USD 1500.

"We saw powerful messages, stunning landscapes, and superb wildlife captured in your photos. They show us the many creative perspectives highlighting the natural and cultural richness of ASEAN Heritage Parks and interactions of humans with biodiversity," Mirutescu of EU said in a video message.

Moderated by Antoinette Taus, UN Environment Programme Goodwill Ambassador and one of the voices of the ACB's #WeAreASEANBiodiversity campaign, the awards ceremony also featured one of the first environment champions hailed as ASEAN Biodiversity Heroes.

ASEAN Biodiversity Hero of Cambodia Sophea Chhin, one of the founders of Birds of Cambodia Education and Conservation, in a conversation with Taus, talked about his passion for photography and wildlife conservation and his community's appreciation for wildlife.

"Before, a lot of people (in my community) were using slingshots to shoot birds. Wildlife was bushmeat for them then. It changed when they started using a camera," Sophea Chhin said. (ACB)

BOC surpasses January 2022 target collection by P6 BILLION

Aligned with its primary mandate to collect lawful revenues for the country, the Bureau of Customs (BOC) collected a total of P58.158 billion against its P52.123 billion January 2022 target collection, posting a surplus of P6.035 billion or +11.58%.

Based on the preliminary report from the BOC-Financial Service, 14 out of the 17 collection districts hit the target namely the Ports of San Fernando, POM, MICP, Batangas, Legaspi, Iloilo, Cebu, Surigao, Zamboanga, Davao, Subic, Clark, Aparri and Limay.

Last year, the bureau surpassed its annual revenue collection target by +4.7% or P29.036 billion, collecting a total of P645.785 billion against its P616.749 billion target, based on the preliminary report from the BOC-Financial Service.

The positive revenue collection performance is

attributed to the improved valuation. intensified enforcement against illegal importations, improved compliance by traders to customs laws, the gradual improvement of importation volume, and the government's effort in ensuring unhampered movement of goods domestically and internationally.

The Bureau of Customs is the 2nd largest revenue-generating government agency next to the Bureau of Internal Revenue. For the past 2 years, the BOC was able to surpass its annual target collection by +6.23% and +4.70% respectively even during a global health crisis. Commissioner Rey Leonardo Guerrero commended the efforts of the men and women of the Bureau of Customs who showed their commitment and dedication to government service during an executive committee meeting. **PR**

Manila RTC judge named new CA associate justice

MANILA – The Supreme Court (SC) on Monday announced the formal receipt of Malacanang's appointment of Manila Regional Trial Court's (RTC) Judge Ana Marie Mas as associate justice of the Court of Appeals (CA).

Mas will fill in the vacancy left in the CA by now retired SC justice Edgardo Delos Santos. Delos Santos was appointed to the SC in 2019 by President Rodrigo Duterte after serving in the CA for 11 years.

He retired on June 30, 2021, a year earlier than expected, due to health reasons.

Antique Governor Rhodora Cadiao congratulated her province mate in a

Facebook post on January 26.

"Congratulations, Atty. Ana Marie T. Mas, the new Court of Appeals Justice. The Antiqueño people are proud of you! Kruhay (Long live)!" Cadiao posted.

Mas, who was admitted to the Bar in 2001, was appointed to the Manila RTC in 2015.

Among the cases Mas handled was the conviction of a sheriff of the Department of Labor and Employment - National Capital Region for direct bribery.

The officer was sentenced to up to seven years in prison for demanding PHP15,000 from workers of a broadsheet embroiled in a labor case. **(PNA)**

GSIS to release P100M educational subsidy to members' kin

PASAY CITY -- The Government Service Insurance System (GSIS) will release a total of P100 million to 10,000 kin of GSIS members to augment their college education expenses through the GSIS Educational Subsidy Program (GESP) for academic year (AY) 2021 to 2022. Each college student will receive P10,000 from GSIS.

"Malaking ginhawa ang hatid ng P10,000 na educational subsidy para sa ating mga miyembrong may anak o legal dependents na nasa kolehiyo, lalo pa ngayon na nasa gitna tayo ng pandemya. Out of nearly 17,300 received applications nationwide, the grantees for AY 2021-2022 were selected from different regions across the country, broken down as follows: 1,581 from NCR (15.81%); 1,994 from North Luzon (19.94%); 2,093 from South Luzon (20.93%); 2,078 from Visayas (20.78%); and 2,254 grantees from Mindanao (22.54%). The grantees will receive the subsidy after submitting the requirements to GSIS. New grantees must submit the duly signed and notarized GESP

agreement, the Information Sheet with two copies of the student's latest 2x2 ID pictures, and a Land Bank of the Philippines account number. These requirements must be submitted to the nearest GSIS office within 60 calendar days from the publication of the list of qualified students in the GSIS website or official social media account.

The list of qualified grantees for 2021-2022 may be viewed through <https://www.gsis.gov.ph/gsis-educational-subsidy-program-grantees-ay-2021-2022/>.

A student-grantee may shift course or transfer to any CHED-registered school provided that the course is completed within the duration of the original course. Additionally, a written notice for the shift of course or transfer of school must be submitted to the Corporate Social Advocacies and Public Relations Facilities Department Manager, GSIS Pasay City.

The subsidy is non-transferable.

DA-China negotiations on for lower-priced fertilizer

MANILA – In an attempt to meet the fertilizer requirement for the first planting season this year, the Department of Agriculture's Fertilizer and Pesticide Authority (DA-FPA) is negotiating with China to lower prices.

The country needs 600,000 metric tons (MT) of fertilizer for the first planting season, according to FPA chief Wilfredo Roldan during a virtual briefer on Tuesday. The DA inventory currently holds 200 MT.

"It is a real fact that the Philippines is a net importer of fertilizer, even if we have the PhilPhos (Philippine Phosphate Fertilizer Corporation) and Atlas (Fertilizer Corporation), but they are importing their raw materials," he said.

To date, the price of the commonly imported fertilizer urea is USD900 per ton, which will retail for PHP2,400 to PHP3,000 per bag.

In February and March

2021, it only cost about USD300.

The price increase is caused by high demand in India, Australia, United States, and Brazil, while big suppliers, like China and Russia, are withholding their exports to ensure their domestic requirements are met, according to Roldan.

Urea is a low-cost nitrogen fertilizer form that promotes green leafy growth and make the plants look lush. When China asked for a firm offer, Roldan said the DA set the price at USD500 USD.

"If they will agree on that, that will help us largely," he said.

DA Secretary William Dar previously urged farm cooperatives to import fertilizers directly from international producers and suppliers.

He also ordered Roldan to look into a balanced strategy which will utilize non-traditional fertilizer. (PNA)

ECCP exec cites reforms needed to be prioritized by next admin

MANILA – Policy reforms of the next administration should focus on curbing corruption and human capital development, an executive of the European Chamber of Commerce of the Philippines (ECCP) said.

ECCP president Lars Wittig said a transparent government that upholds public trust is important in attracting investors.

"Denmark has the least corruption in the world, and I've seen first-hand how it benefits business. Because when there is a very high trust level and transparency, that really makes business very adaptable and very willing to make investments," he said in a briefing Monday.

The Philippines will lure more investors if the government increases its spending on human capital development through allocating a higher budget for education and nutrition, Wittig said.

"We are spending less

money of our GDP (gross domestic product) on education," he added.

Wittig said the country's spending on education based on the percentage of the economy is relatively low compared to other developing countries.

"And finally, nutrition. It sounds very basic, but nutrition is one of the biggest hurdles in this country to ensure higher likelihood of a productive life from your 50 to 65 (years)," he said. The ECCP executive said the next administration should bat for inclusive growth and address poverty to enable Filipinos to afford better nutrition.

"It's the ability to pay money for the right food, not just food, for your children and yourself," Wittig said.

He also supports new reforms that will improve the country's agriculture sector as a large population of the poor is working in this sector. (PNA)

Filipino priest is new apostolic nuncio to Rwanda

MANILA – Pope Francis has appointed Rev. Msgr. Arnaldo Sanchez Catalan as the new Apostolic Nuncio to Rwanda, the Archdiocese of Manila said on Monday. Manila Archbishop Jose Cardinal Advincula said the Pope announced Catalan's appointment on January 31.

In a statement, Advincula expressed gratitude to the Holy Father "for this gift and honor and considers the appointment of Archbishop-elect Catalan as historic being the first priest of the Archdiocese of Manila to become a Nuncio."

He also greeted the new archbishop in the name of the clergy, religious men and women, and the laity of the Archdiocese. Advincula also assured

archbishop-elect of their support and prayers as he takes on this new mission in Rwanda.

The 55-year-old Catalan has been serving as the Chargé affaires of the Apostolic Nunciature in China since 2019.

He has worked in the Diplomatic Service of the Holy See for the past 20 years. His previous assignments were in the Apostolic Nunciatures in Zambia, India, Kuwait, Turkey, Argentina, Canada, and the Philippines.

The newly elected archbishop was ordained to the priesthood on March 25, 1994.

The archdiocese said the details of Catalan's episcopal ordination are yet to be announced. (PNA)

All threats on public officials subject to probe: DOJ

MANILA – The National Bureau of Investigation (NBI) has a month to report on the alleged slay attempt on presidential candidate Ferdinand "Bongbong" Marcos Jr. made on video-focused social media platform TikTok.

Department of Justice (DOJ) Secretary Menardo Guevarra said on Monday the government investigates all threats on public officials, past and present, including candidates running for public office, upon prompt receipt of information.

"Thirty days is our standard reporting period but the NBI immediately reports if it finds something early enough," Guevarra told reporters via text message.

He said the DOJ Office of Cybercrime and NBI may

also track down individuals who threaten to kill or rape public officials.

"All that is necessary is for the information to reach the proper authorities," Guevarra said.

A death threat is an unlawful act whether one believes it or not and even if it is unlikely, he added. Vice President Leonor Robredo, who is also running for president, was likewise the subject of death threats before.

The TikTok user allegedly posted "we are meeting everyday to plan for BBM's (Bongbong Marcos) assassination. Get ready." Lawyer Vic Rodriguez, Marcos' chief of staff, said in a statement on Sunday "we are not cowered by such threat" and all their campaign activities will continue. (PNA)

P541-M cash aid released to 27K ECC pensioners

MANILA – More than PHP541 million in financial assistance have been paid by the Employees' Compensation Commission (ECC) to its pensioners nationwide since its establishment in June 2021.

ECC Executive Director Stella Zipagan-Banawis said PHP541,440,000 were divided among 27,072 EC pensioners, who received PHP20,000 each.

"ECC considered our pensioners in the provision of assistance as they have also been affected by the Covid-19 pandemic because of their vulnerabilities and the prolonged economic impact brought by the pandemic," she said in a recent statement. The pensioners are persons with permanent partial

disability or permanent total disability, incurred due to their work or working environment. They can also be the beneficiaries of the employees who died due to work-related contingencies during the prescribed period Jan. 1, 2020 to May 31, 2021.

The financial assistance was released by the Social Security System and the Government Service Insurance System, the implementing agencies of the EC Program.

"These were automatically credited to the pensioners' accounts or granted through checks," Banawis added.

President Rodrigo Duterte signed Administrative Order No. 39 on April 19, 2021 which authorized the ECC to release the financial assistance to qualified pensioners. (PR)

Over 24K barangays now 'drug-cleared': PDEA

MANILA – More than 24,000 barangays across the country have been cleared from illegal drugs since the start of the Duterte administration's crackdown on illegal drugs in 2016.

Based on the latest Real Numbers data released by the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) on Tuesday, the number of barangays declared drug-free as of Dec. 31, 2021 reached 24,253 while a total of 11,175 barangays have yet to be cleared of illegal drugs.

PDEA spokesperson Derrick Carreon earlier said that before declaring that a barangay is free from illegal drug activities, the Inter-Agency Committee on Anti-Illegal Drugs must validate the non-availability of drug supply, the absence of drug transit activity, clandestine drug laboratory and chemical warehouse, marijuana cultivation site, drug den, drug pushers and users in the area. Authorities also dismantled a total of 993 drug dens and 18 clandestine shabu

laboratories from July 2016 to December 2021.

Various types of illegal drugs worth PHP75 billion were seized and this amount includes PHP63 billion worth of shabu.

A total of 14,240 high-value targets across the country were arrested since the anti-illegal drugs campaign was launched on July 1, 2016.

Authorities also arrested 323,579 persons involved in illegal drugs during the period.

The consolidated reports as of December 31 also showed 6,225 drug suspects have died during 224,215 anti-illegal drug operations.

From July 2016 to December 2021, authorities also arrested 4,110 minors.

These rescued minors will be turned over after court proceedings to the Bahay Pag-asa centers of LGUs within eight hours of police custody, before turning them over to the Department of Social Welfare and Development. (PNA)

Gov't agencies urged to make sure contact lines 'reachable'

MANILA – Secretary Jeremiah B. Belgica, director general of the Anti-Red Tape Authority (ARTA), renewed his call to the government agencies to establish their official contact lines and ensure that their offices are reachable by the public. Belgica said this is an important aspect of public service, especially now during the Covid-19 pandemic.

The statement came after ARTA continued receiving reports of government offices that are unreachable through their contact lines. "We need to understand that it is a disservice to the public if they are not able to reach those in the government for assistance. This is yet another form of red tape that hampers the efficient delivery of government services to Filipinos," Belgica said in a news release on Tuesday.

"If we continue receiving complaints like this, we shall be issuing notices

to explain to erring government offices," he added.

He said setting up contact lines is as important as putting up Public Assistance and Complaints Desks, which are mandated under Republic Act 11032 or the Ease of Doing Business and Efficient Government Service Delivery Act of 2018.

This is in line with the Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines issued by the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases and Memorandum Circular No. 87 released by the Office of the President.

Both issuances provide that the government must be at full operating capacity even during the Covid-19 pandemic or enhanced community quarantine which later shifted to Alert Level System. (PR)

Cimatu elated over DENR achievements becoming part of PRRD's environmental legacy

QUEZON CITY -- Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) Secretary Roy A. Cimatu said the milestones and achievements made by the agency will be a significant part of the Duterte administration's legacy on the conservation and protection of the environment.

In the DENR's Expanded Executive Committee Conference held last January 18, Cimatu praised the employees for rising to the challenge and meeting the expectations of President Rodrigo Roa Duterte. Cimatu said that being tasked by President Duterte to head three important inter-agency bodies—the Boracay Inter-Agency Task Force, Manila Bay Task Force, and Task Force Build Back Better (TFBBB)—to facilitate the government's restoration and rehabilitation efforts through whole-of-government and society approach, "bespeaks of his high regard for our competence and capabilities."

"Indeed, I look forward to the pleasure of submitting to the Supreme Court at the end of my term a report on our compliance with the Writ of Continuing Mandamus for the cleanup and restoration of the water quality of Manila Bay," he said, noting that it is only during the Duterte administration that the concerned agencies have substantial compliance with the writ issued in December 2008.

Cimatu led the DENR conference via onsite and online platforms aimed at shaping the direction of the environment and natural resource sector for 2022.

"We managed to accomplish so much in so short a time despite the distractions caused by the pandemic and natural disasters. I believe we could have accomplished more, and we will certainly do so," Cimatu said, as he called on the DENR workforce to "push harder in the months ahead."

The DENR chief also noted

that the rehabilitation efforts in Boracay Island are expected to be completed by mid-2022 which included the restoration of wetlands, clearing of 25+5 easement, and upgrading of the island's drainage and sewerage system.

Moreover, Cimatu underscored the DENR's performance as the head of the TFBBB, which was created in November 2020, to strengthen rehabilitation and recovery efforts in the Marikina River, Cagayan River, and Bicol River after being adversely affected by two destructive typhoons.

"We have responded not only to disaster and rehabilitation and recovery work but have also put in place measures to prevent or mitigate a repeat of those disasters in these three priority areas," Cimatu said.

He added that TFBBB is now working on a template to guide government agencies on what to do in the aftermath of every typhoon.

"We already started studying the cases of Siargao Island, Surigao, Leyte, Cebu, Bohol, Negros, and Palawan, all devastated by typhoon Odette," Cimatu said. Cimatu likewise cited the closure of some 335 illegally operating dumpsites nationwide in line with the enforcement of the two-decade old Republic Act 9003 or the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000.

"Another accomplishment worth noting is the completion of the closure of all the 335 illegally operating dumpsites," Cimatu said, stressing that running after illegal dumpsites was a feat "past administrations failed to do for over one and a half decades despite the command of the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000."

"Let us work and push harder as we keep score of our successes so that at the end of this administration's term, we shall be able to report our milestones and legacies that will forever be etched in the environment and natural resources sector," he said. (DENR)

POPCOM: PHL population's health challenged by highest mortality rate in 63 years

QUEZON CITY -- The first 11 months of 2021 saw more registered deaths across the Philippines, which stood at 768,504—higher by 154,562 than all of 2020.

This number hiked the country's mortality rate to 6.98 per thousand, as against 5.8 per thousand in 2020, according to the Commission on Population and Development (POPCOM), with initial data from the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA).

This latest release already shows a 25% increase in mortality, with still a month-and-a-half worth of data to be reckoned for 2021. This also set a record in the number of Filipinos dying in a year since post-World War 2.

Covid-19, classified either as "identified" or "unidentified" by medical practitioners, was the underlying cause of death (COD) for 75,285 Filipinos—higher than the 30,140 deaths from the same cause from March to December 2020. It was the second-leading COD to ischemic heart disease responsible for 110,332 deaths up to October 2021 from 86,164 the previous year.

Aside from both CODs, mortalities were also up for cerebrovascular disease (from 53,082 to 58,880) hypertension (from 26,079 to 32,614) and diabetes mellitus (from 32,830 to 38,584). Meanwhile, neoplasms (from 55,700 to 48,937) were markedly down from January 2021 to October 2021. Overall, there was increased mortality in five of the 10 leading CODs last year.

"The increasing number of deaths indicate a health system severely challenged by the pandemic and its consequences," explained Dr. Juan A. Perez III, Undersecretary for Population and Development. "Diseases with higher mortalities are also those causing the highest incidences of illnesses in the entire population, since respiratory diseases, hypertension and diabetes contribute to heavy caseloads of

clinics and health centers nationwide. If consultations for these are delayed, exacerbations and complications happen."

"The fact that neoplasms are down should not be a comforting thought, as hospitals are heavily burdened with Covid-19," the POPCOM executive director noted. "Diagnosis of all forms of cancers may also be delayed or remain undiagnosed, leading to deaths attributed to other causes."

About 105,425 deaths, or 11.04% of 954,585 deaths from April 2020 to October 2021, were classified as caused by Covid-19. Death rate tagged to the disease was 95.8 per 100,000 population.

Classifying Covid. Dr. Perez explained that there are two kinds of Covid-19 affecting the country: Covid-19 "identified," which can be confirmed via RT-PCR tests, and Covid-19 "unidentified," with laboratory tests or clinical findings by a doctor indicative of Covid-19, but without a confirmatory test up to the time of death. Both are considered valid CODs, and are methods accepted by the World Health Organization to report the disease.

From zero deaths in March 2020, Perez said Covid-19 became the fifth-leading COD that year. In the first 10 months of 2021, the PSA reported 51,514 deaths from Covid-19 "identified" and 23,771 as Covid-19 "unidentified," for a total of 75,285. In 2020 there were only 9,300 Covid-19 "identified," and 20,840 Covid-19 "unidentified."

This showed an improved testing capacity for Covid-19 in 2021. "Thus, the statistics above elevated Covid-19 as the second-deadliest killer of Filipinos in 2021," the POPCOM chief further stated. "We are expecting more numbers from November and December of last year. We can presume that there were about 800,000 deaths or more then."

With the January-November 2021 births only

Imported vehicle sales grow 14% in 2021

MANILA – The appetite of the local market for imported vehicles

at 1,076,770, Dr. Perez said the Philippines' year-end population growth rate will be markedly lower than 2020. Based on the latest release by PSA, there were 308,266 more births than deaths up to November 2021.

Highest in 60+ years. Dr. Perez estimated that the 2021 number of deaths already indicate the highest annual death statistic in the Philippines' recorded medical history: "In 2019 and 2020, the mortality rate was about the same at 5.8 per 1,000 Filipinos. By the end of 2021, I believe it reached 7.5 or 8 per 1,000—not the highest mortality rate ever in the country, but certainly the highest number of Filipinos dying in a single year."

Referencing the Department of Health's earlier editions of Philippine Health Statistics, POPCOM's executive director disclosed that the last time the Philippines experienced the same level of mortality rates were in 1958 to 1959, where it reached between 7.3 and 8.4, but at that time "only 218,816 died."

From a health standpoint, he enjoined concerned national and local governments agencies to increase investments in the health workforce and public-health programs dealing with increased morbidity of the leading causes of disease which require improving primary health-care systems throughout the country. Mortalities at high numbers also indicate the need for acute health-care services at higher levels of care, such as provincial hospitals and regional medical centers.

"The challenge to the Philippine health system is both acute and unprecedented. Local health systems would need to be augmented by additional investments in health systems capacity and its resilience to respond to acute health crises," Dr. Perez recommended. (POPCOM)

recovered in 2021 as sales grew 14 percent compared to 2020 numbers, the Association of Vehicle Importers and Distributors (AVID) reported Monday. AVID said imported vehicle sales last year increased to 58,916 units from 51,851 units in 2020. The double-digit growth in sales of light commercial vehicles offset the 9 percent decline of passenger car sales last year.

Imported light commercial vehicles sold 42,871 units in 2021, higher by 23 percent than the 34,896 unit sales in 2020.

Sales of outsourced passenger cars in the previous year decreased to 15,092 units from 16,650 units sold a year ago.

On the other hand, commercial vehicle sales jumped 212 percent to 953 units from 305 units in the same period.

Month-on-month, AVID members' cumulative sales increased by 7 percent to 5,259 units in December last year from 4,903 units in November.

Some 4,110 units sold in the previous month were light commercial vehicles, 1,140 units were passenger cars, and nine units of commercial vehicles.

AVID president Maria Fe Perez-Agudo said easing the mobility towards the latter part of the year has contributed to the recovery of the industry.

"You cannot downplay the importance of mobility in the reopening of the economy, gradual though it may be," Perez-Agudo said. "With unwavering confidence in the market and in the quality of our product and service offerings, AVID members are determined to build on these gains and look forward to an even better normal in 2022."
