CAVITEX completes P78M road maintenance project

Cavitex Infrastructure Corporation (CIC), the concessionaire of the Manila-Cavite Expressway (CAVITEX), along with its Joint Venture (JV) partner, the Philippine Reclamation Authority (PRA) announced the completion of its Php 78 million heavy maintenance project on critical portions of the expressway.

Started February of this year, the project entailed rehabilitation and repair of road surface distresses such as pavement fractures, distortions, and disintegration along Longos, Bacoor Entry and Exit to CAVITEX, and 1-km portion of the mainline carriageway of Wawa Bridge to Zapote Interchange (Cavite and Manila-Bound).

"With the recently completed heavy maintenance project in CAVITEX, we now have safer carriageways and smoother roads that help improve the overall driving experience of our motorists. Despite challenges brought about by the pandemic, we continue to invest on projects that will ensure safety and convenience of our toll road users," said CIC President and General Manager, Roberto V. Bontia.

PRA General Manager and CEO, Atty. Janilo E. Rubi-

ato further adds "PRA and CIC are fully committed in providing a safe and high-quality expressway for our motorists. We ensure that they get what they pay for in terms of safety, ease and convenience in travelling through CAVITEX. Hence, we considered the high maintenance project a must to live up to that commitment, and with the results we now see and experience in the toll road, we consider it money well spent".

Last December 2020, CIC and PRA completed its road enhancements project for Segment 1 (R1 Expressway) which covers road widening for additional lanes in Paranaque, Wawa, and Las Pinas bridges from three (3) lanes to four (4) lanes.

The CIC is a subsidiary of the Metro Pacific Tollways Corporation (MPTC). Cavitex is part of a road network being developed by MPTC that will soon connect to the 7.7-kilometer C5 Link Expressway and the 45-kilometer Cavite-Laguna Expressway (CALAX). PRA, through its subsidiary PEATC performs the operation and maintenance of both the R-1 Expressway and R-1 Expressway Extension which currently makes up the CAVITEX.

Aside from the Cavitex and CALAX, MPTC's portfolio includes the concessions for the North Luzon Expressway (NLEX), the Subic-Clark Tarlac Expressway (SCTEX), the NLEX Connector Road, and the Cebu-Cordova Link Express-

68 kasong typhoid fever, naitala

UMABOT sa 68 kasong typhoid fever ang naitala sa CALABARZON (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal, Quezon) region mula January 1, 2021 hanggang May 29, 2021.

Ang probinsiya ng Laguna ang nagtala ng may pinakamataas na bilang kung saan umabot sa 30 kasong sumunod ang Cavite (26); Rizal (6) at Batangas (1).

Ayon kay DOH-CALABARZON Regional Medical Technologist, Kimberly B. Cu, ang typhoid fever ay laganap sa mga lugar kung saan may kakulangan sa kalinisan at marumung pinangkukunan ng mailinom na tubig.

"If you are unsure of the quality of the water, especially those taken from deep wells which are untreated, it is best to boil it for at least 2 minutes to kill bacteria," ayon kay Cu. Nagbabala rin si Cu sa pag-

kain ng mga street foods kung saan nadadapuan ng mga insektong pinakainam ang palaging naghuugas ng kamay bago at matapos kumain.

Ang typhoid ay isang infectious disease na sanhi ng bacteria *Salmonella typhoid* at nakukuha ito sa pamagitan ng pagkain o pag-inom ng tubig na kontaminado sa bacteria.

Ang isang tao na may typhoid fever ay nakakaramdam ng mataas na lagnat, pananakit ng ulo, panghina, walang gana sa pagkain, diarrhea constipation at kung nakakaranas ito ay kinakailangang dalhin sa ospital.

"The only effective treatment for the illness is antibiotics such as ciprofloxacin (for non-pregnant adults) and ceftriaxone for pregnant patients. Give them plenty of water to rehydrate," ayon pa kay Cu. **GENE ADSUARA**

Sta. Cruz, Laguna turns to poultry production to help underprivileged families

Santa Cruz, Laguna, which was among the municipalities chosen for the national government's anti-poverty program, has turned to barangay poultry production as a way to help uplift the lives of its underprivileged constituents.

Through the local Poverty Reduction and Enterprise Development Office (PREDO) of the National Anti-Poverty Commission (NAPC), Santa Cruz was able to provide 150 families with 10 Ready-to-Lay chickens each as well as chicken feeds for the agreed 54-week assistance period.

Mayor Edgar San Luis also took the initiative to give additional funding from the local government unit (LGU) to replicate the project for 100 more families across 21 identified barangays, targeting its implementation and distribution within May or June this year.

On the other hand, the municipality has supported Barangay Gatiid with 500 ducks which were distributed to its seven Sitios. The project is already earning from the estimated 400 eggs that the ducks produce daily, covering operational expenses and still leaving some for savings. The area is also large and capable of handling more ducks.

However, both projects need more funds to expand, thus, the LGU is looking at the possibility of partnering with the Department of Labor and Employment, the Department of Agriculture, and the private sector for funding.

"We would like to express our appreciation to the municipality of Santa Cruz for eagerly carrying out our Kasambayan program. The continued support of Santa Cruz and the rest of the LGUs is crucial to

the success of our goal to fight poverty especially in the rural areas," said NAPC Secretary and Lead Convenor Atty. Noel K. Felongco.

To this, Kiko Labro, NAPC Head Executive Assistant, added: "We are excited to see these livelihood programs come into fruition, and through PREDO, we hope to enter into more collaborations to help our kababayans who are in need of assistance."

Santa Cruz, earlier, entered into a Memorandum of Agreement with the NAPC for the creation of PREDO to develop plans and programs geared towards improving the livelihood of its residents. PREDO serves as the NAPC's local counterpart in implementing various programs aimed at alleviating poverty in the country.

The municipal PREDO continues to look at creating conducive business opportunities and maximizing funds provided by the private sector to fuel and sustain implementation of poverty reduction projects. Poverty in the country continues to persist especially in rural communities with limited access to education, health, and roads and transportation, and in conflict and disaster-prone areas.

This prompted the NAPC to create a five-year development framework called Sambayanahan: Serbisyon Sambayanahan which provides guidance in carrying out a climate-responsive, culture- and gender-sensitive, and convergent and participatory anti-poverty strategy in line with the administration's target to bring down the country's poverty incidence from 21.6 % in 2015 to 14% by 2022.

DASMA FIRE VICTIMS TRANSFER TO NEW HOMES IN CAVITE TOWN

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite (PIA) --About 50 families affected by the fire that razed down more than 80 houses in Barangay Sta. Cruz 1 in the city of Dasmariñas on April 7, 2021 were recently transported to their new community in St. Mary Magdalene Ville in the coastal municipality of Naic.

The coordination between the city government of Dasmariñas thru the City Disaster Risk Reduction & Management Office (CDRRMO), and the City Social Welfare Development Office (CSWDO) and the municipal government of Naic made possible for the family relocatees to get a chance to have their own decent homes.

Dasmariñas City Mayor Jenny Austria-Barzaga personally came to oversee the orderly transfer of her constituents as she handed each family with financial assistance of P15,000 plus essential goods as they start their new life in the new community.

Likewise, Naic Mayor Junio Dualan was present during the activity to welcome the families to the town and assured LGU's support for their needs particularly in terms of livelihood.

Meanwhile, 40 families still remain in the city of Dasmariñas in which 20 of them are temporarily rent-

ing while the other 20 are still sheltered in the covered court.

According to Barangay Sta. Cruz 1 Head Kirby Andrade, the transfer of these families will take about two to three months, thus they will continue in supporting them particularly those staying in the covered court.

In an agreement with the National Housing Authority (NHA), the Naic LGU provided relocation sites for displaced families from neighboring cities and towns in the province, and in NCR who are affected by disasters like fire, typhoons and even for right of way on government projects like road construction and widening.

A unit has a floor area of 36-square meters, and lot area of 40-square meters with pre-approved installation for electric power, water supply, and the required understanding with the NHA.

"Mabuti na rin ito kahit malayo kami sa aming dating pinanggalingan. Mahirap, pero kahit paano ay may masasabi kaming sariling amin," a remark of relief from a mother of a family luckily picked out during the raffle of names for the first batch of relocatees. CDA continues to provide assistance to cooperatives amid pandemic

CALAMBA CITY (PIA) --The Cooperative Development Authority Region IV-A (CDA IV-A) assured its stakeholders that they will continue to support cooperatives in the region during the COVID-19 pandemic.

In a recent interview with the Philippine Information Agency IV-A's Sulong Calabarzon online program, CDA IV-A Regional Director Salvador Valeroso admitted that some of their services were limited due to the imposition of community lockdowns at the height of the pandemic.

"[Our roles are mainly] Regulation, developmental and adjudication. Mas matimbang para sa amin ang developmental function dahil dito namin mas nararamdamang ang assistance na ibinibigay para umunlad ang mga cooperative," Valeroso said.

[Our roles are mainly regulation, developmental and adjudication. But for us, the most important is the developmental function because we are able to provide

more assistance to help cooperatives develop.]

Data from the CDA IV-A show that around 2,768 cooperatives in the CALABARZON region have already registered with the government. This includes 555 cooperatives in Batangas, 546 in Cavite, 716 in Laguna, 566 in Quezon province and 441 in Rizal province.

"Karamihan ng mga kooperatiba ay nasa Laguna, pero karamihan sa mga ito ay micro [scale cooperatives].” Valeroso explained. But as of December 31 2020, only 1,252 cooperatives were able to submit their compliance reports and other administrative requirements in order to be considered as compliant to government standards.

As the primary agency mandated to promote the viability and growth of cooperatives in ushering social justice and economic development, the CDA is at the forefront in regulating and implementing programs to help develop cooperatives in the region.

Despite being one of the smaller national government agencies in terms of funding, Valeroso said the CDA provides technical assistance such as training and education to registered cooperatives.

They also link cooperatives to other government agen-

During the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, the CDA also provided Regulatory Relief to provide registered cooperatives funds for paying their balances and interests. Reporting periods for cooperatives were also extended until June 30.

"If we convert the amount since the first lockdown in March last year, in Calabarzon alone halos P1-B ang nai-contribute ng ating mga kooperatiba," Valeroso said.

Aside from providing financial assistance to its members, some cooperatives in the region also provided personal protective equipment (PPE), cash assistance and other services to frontline workers during the pandemic.

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SC APPROVES CA RULE OF PROCEDURE IN BANK INQUIRIES RELATED TO ANTI-MONEY LAUNDERING OFFENSES

MANILA -- The Supreme Court has recently approved A.M. No. 21-03-05-CA or The Court of Appeals Rule of Procedure in Cases of Bank Inquiry Into or Examination of Deposit and Investment Accounts Relating to an Unlawful Activity or a Money Laundering Offense Under Republic Act No. 9160, as Amended.

This Rule, which takes effect on May 31, 2021, shall apply to ex parte applications for authority to inquire into, or examine, deposit or investment accounts with any banking institution or non-bank financial institution and their subsidiaries and affiliates, representing, involving, or relating to an "unlawful activity" under Section 3(i) or a "money laundering offense" under Section 4 of RA 9160, or the Anti-Money Laundering Act of 2001, as amended, except in cases of unlawful activities as defined by the same law.

Under the Rule, the Republic of the Philippines, represented by the Anti-Money Laundering Council (AMLC), through the Office of the Solicitor General (OSG), may file an ex parte application for bank inquiry before the Court of Appeals (CA) when it has been established that there is probable cause that the deposits or investments involved, including related accounts, are in any way related to an unlawful activity or a money laundering offense.

Such ex parte application shall be verified and accompanied by a sworn certification of non-forum shopping personally signed by an authorized AMLC official, and shall contain the following: a) the account number, or any other specific description of the deposit or investment accounts sought to be inquired into or examined, the owner or holder of the deposit or investment accounts, the address of such owner or holder, the name of the banking institution or non-bank financial institution where such account is maintained, and their location, if known; b) the ground relied upon for the grant of authority to inquire into or examine the deposit or investment account; and c) the supporting evidence showing the existence of probable cause that the subject deposit or investment accounts are in any way related to an unlawful activity or a money laundering offense under RA 9160.

In cases involving a mix of banks with the main office in Manila or Luzon and local banks which do not have offices in Luzon, the ex parte application shall be filed with the CA in Manila. In cases where two or more local banks (SC)

without offices in Luzon are involved, but one or some have offices in the Visayas while the others are based in Mindanao, the application shall be filed with the CA station where the main office of the local bank is located.

The application shall be raffled immediately on the same day it is filed to a specific Justice who is not on official leave of absence. All members of the CA Division to which the assigned Justice belongs shall resolve the ex parte application within 24 hours from its receipt.

If the CA finds no merit in the application, it shall dismiss the same, stating the specific reasons for such dismissal. A resolution denying an ex parte application for bank inquiry can only be reviewed through a Petition for Certiorari to the Supreme Court under Rule 65 of the Revised Rules of Court. The Rule provides that the bank inquiry order issued by the CA shall:

a) issue in the name of the Republic of the Philippines, represented by the AMLC; b) describe with particularity the deposit or investment account sought to be inquired into or examined, as well as the names of the account owners/holders; c) direct the banking or non-bank financial institution concerned to allow the AMLC full access to all information, documents, and objects relating to the subject deposit or investment account within a specific period of time; d) forbid the aforesaid institution, or any of its directors, officers, and employees, from disclosing, divulging, or communication directly or indirectly, or in any manner, to the owners or holders of accounts inquired into, or to any other person, the fact that said accounts are being inquired into or examined, with warning that a violation thereof constitutes contempt of court; and e) direct the OSG to inform the court of the institution of a civil forfeiture proceedings within five calendar days from its filing.

Such bank inquiry order issued by the CA shall be effective for a period of 120 calendar days from the date of the receipt by the AMLC, and shall have the same effect as that of a freeze order under Section 2(d), Rule VI, of the 2009 Internal Rules of the Court of Appeals.

The court, upon motion of the AMLC and before the expiration of the 120-day period, may, for good cause, extend the effectiveness of the bank inquiry order for a period not exceeding one hundred and twenty (120) calendar days. (SC)

"Bahagi ito ng aming kompanya na lisin ang mga recruitment agency. May mahigit tayong 600 Saudi recruitment agency, ngunit maaari nating ibaba ang bilang na ito ng hanggang 100 o mas mababa pa sa mga darating na buwan. Hindi natin kailangan ng maraming recruitment agency, kailangan lang natin ng ilang matitino, na maaari nating maging katuwang," wika ni Macauley. Ito lamang ang paraan upang mabawasan ang mga kaso ng pambibiktima sa ating mga OFW, dagdag niya.

Sinabi din ng Labor Attaché na nagbuo ang POLO ng isang grupo ng mga lalaking welfare officer at support staff na tinawag nilang "Team Camel", at kanilang ide-deploy upang tulungan ang ating mga OFW na may problema.

Upang tiyakin na lehitimo at sumusunod sa batas, mahigpit na ipinatutupad ng POLO Riyadh ang onsite verification ng mga kompaniya, batay sa kautusan ng Philippine Overseas Employment Administration.

Nitong nakaraang linggo, personal na nagpunta si Macauley sa Alkhobar upang tingnan ang estado ng tirahan ng mga OFW sa Saudi Recruitment Agency sa Eastern Region bago ito bigyan ng job order at akreditasyon ang kanilang Philippine Recruitment

Agency.

Nagbibigay din ng onsite lecture ang POLO team sa mga recruitment agency. "Sinasabihan namin ang mga may-ari ng recruitment agency na dapat ay mayroon silang welfare officer na may kakayahang mangalinga para pangalagaan ang ating mga OFW, lalo na iyong mga may problema. LUNGSOD CALOOCAN (PIA)-- Malaki ang potensyal na bumaba ang presyo ng mga electric vehicles (EVs) lalo na kung uusborg ang paggawa sa bansa ng ganitong makabagong klase ng sasakyang sasabayan pa ng pagmamandato ng paglalagay ng mga charging stations sa mga pampubliko at pribadong gusali, ayon kay Senator Win Gatchalian.

Sinabi ni Gatchalian, pangunahing may akda at sponsor ng Senate Bill (SB) No. 1382 o ang panukalang Electric Vehicles and Charging Stations Act, na tiyak na bababa na ang dami ng inaanak ang suplay na krudo dahil sa kabawasan ng paggamit sakaling dumami na ang mga tumatangkilik ng e-vehicles.

Malaking bagay din ang pakinabang nito sa kapaligiran dahil nakakabawasan sa polusyon ang mga EVs, ayon sa senador.

"Ang pinakamahalagang layunin ng panukalang ito ay tiyakin ang seguridad ng suplay ng enerhiya lalo na't 100% na nakadepende sa importasyon ng krudo ang mga ginagamit ng sasakyang natin. Malaking kabawasan sa polusyon

ang mga EVs dahil hindi ito nagdudulot ng greenhouse gas emissions. Magbibigay daan din ito sa pag-usborg ng sektor ng pagawaan ng mga EVs dahil ang panukalang batas ay sakop hindi lang ang paggawa ng mismong mga sasakyang kundi pati na rin ang mga spare parts, batteries at ang konstruksyon ng mga charging stations," ani Gatchalian.

Sa naturang SB No. 1382, itatag ang national energy policy and regulatory framework para sa paggamit ng mga EVs at pagkakaroon ng mga electric charging stations. Ipag-uutos din nito ang paglalagay ng mga parking slots na eksklusibo para sa mga EVs at magsisilbi ring charging stations sa mga pampubliko at pribadong mga gusali samantalang ang mga malalaking kumpanya, mga operator ng mga pampublikong transportasyon, mga ahensiya ng gobyerno ay oobrigahan na gumamit ng EVs. Ang mga lokal na pamahalaan naman ay kailangang maglagay ng green routes para sa mga pampublikong EVs habang ang mga gasoline stations ay aatasan rin na maglagay ng mga charging stations.

Kailangan na nilang magbayad at saka lumayas. Iba't ibang klase ng krimen ang nakakabit sa pagpapasok ng mga POGO, mula kidnapping hanggang prostitusyon. The social costs that came along with the spike of POGOs in our country will always outweigh any revenue that the government may generate from them. Hindi natin sila kailangan," ani Hontiveros.

Noong 2019 naman ay umabot sa P14.230 bilyon ang hindi nababayarang buwis, habang noong 2020, pumalo ito sa P10.78 bilyon. Dahil dito, may kabuuang P40.295 bilyong utang sa franchise tax ang mga POGO.

Isiniwalat din na noong 2020, ininspeksyon ng joint task force ng BIR, BI, at Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) ang nasa 196 na tanggapan ng POGO, kung saan mayroong 23,000 foreign nationals at 1,632 dito ang walang Alien Employment Permits.

"I am sure there is more to this number of over 1,000 illegal POGO workers. Hindi na panibagong balita na may mga ilegal na POGO workers. Malamang, sila din itong mga kasali sa mga krimen laban sa ating sariling mamamayan. Kapag hindi sila dokumentado, mas malakas ang loob nilang maghasik ng lagim sa ating lipunan," ani Hontiveros.

"Paghusayan pa sana ng joint task force ng BIR, DOLE, at BI ang pag-a-update at pagbibigay ng datos sa bilang ng mga iligal na manggagawa sa POGO. Kung hindi natin alam kung sino ang mga iligal, paano din natin malalaman kung sino ang mapapanagot? Hindi natin kailangan ang mga POGO at mas lalong hindi natin kailangan ang mga ilegal na POGO. At the end of the day, I remain resolute in my position that POGOs should pay up and ship out," pagtatapos niya. PR

-- Binigyang-diin ng ilan sa mga kilalang young Filipino environmental at climate advocates ang papel ng kabataan sa paggamit ng kani-kanilang kakayaan sa pagiging malikhain at teknolohiya upang maging changemakers tungo sa isang better normal sa ginanap na ika-46 na episode ng "Stories for a Better Normal: Pandemic and Climate Pathways," na may temang, "Pinoy Changemakers."

Tampok sa talakayan sina Antoinette Taus, United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) Goodwill Ambassador at Founder ng CORA at ng The Sustainable Planet; Carmela Ellaga, isang fisheries technologist; Gab Mejia, conservation photographer at environmental storyteller; at Ranielle Navarro, guro mula sa Albay Central School na kinilala bilang 2021 National Geographic awardee. Nagbahagi ang mga panauhin ng kani-kanilang mga environmental advocates, at nagsulong ng makabuhuanhang pakikipag-ugnayan ng mga kabataan sa larangan ng pangangalaga at pagprotektahan sa kapaligiran pati na ang pagpapanumbalik ng siglang-buhay ng mundo ngayong new normal.

Ibinahagi ni Taus kung paanong ang pagmamahal, tapang, at layunin ng isang indibidwal, ang siyang magtutulak para aksyunan ang lumalalang environmental degradation at climate change.

"Kung mayroong pagmamahal, katapangan at magandang layunin... Maaari mong ayusin ang lahat ng mga problema sa daigdig para sa parehong tao at mundo – pagmamahal para sa kapuwa tao at pagmamahal para sa kalikasan. At siyempre, ang lakas ng loob na kumilos para sa mga bagay na pinaniniwalaan. At layunin, paniniwalang maski ang maliliit na pagkilos ay sadyang napakahalaga kung ito'y makalilikha maski na kakaunting pagbabago lamang. Walang maliliit na pagbabago lamang at wala ring maliliit na gawang kabutihan. Ang lahat ng ito ay napakahalaga sa isang tao o di kaya'y para sa ating mundo," anya ni Antoinette Taus.

Kinilala si Ellaga ni dating U.S. First Lady Michelle Obama dahil sa kaniyang pagsisikap na maprotektahan ang planeta, iginiit ni Ellaga ang kahalagan ng pakikipag-ugnayan sa pagitan ng mga tao para makamit ang sustenableng kinabukasan.

"Ang konserbasyon ay 'di nangangahulugang pagprotektahan lamang sa mga hayop at kahikanan kun' di nangangahulugan din itong pagprotektahan sa mga tao, at pagkilos kasama ang isa't isa. Kinakailangan talagang magtulungan ang mga mamamayan, kaisa ang komunidad sa sama-samang pagkilos para sa pamamahala ng mga yamang baybayin at sa pagprotektahan ng mga likas na yaman," diin ni Carmela Ellaga.

"Bagi ng pagiging isang conservation photographer ang kaalaman na ang konserbasyon ay hindi lamang tungkol sa pagprotektahan ng mga kalupaan at ng mga hayop na mayroon tayo, kun' di tungkol din sa pagbibigay-lakas at pagprotektahan sa sangkatauhan na naninirahan dito - tulad ng lokal na komunidad, at mga mahihirap at napapabayang mga pamayanan, pati na ang mga mulisipalidad na nakapalibot sa mga protektadong lugar. Dahil sa totoo lang, lahat tayo'y nakakuha ng mga benepisyo mula sa kapaligiran, protektadong mga lugar, at biodiversify," paahayag ni Mejia habang binibigyang-tuon ang papel ng photography sa sa pagbuo ng kamalayan at pagpapakilos sa kapaligiran at climate action.

Si Ranielle Navarro ay siyang utak sa likod ng "A Call to Solution: Goals for Environmental Oversight (ACS Geo)," isang proyekto na naglalayang linangtin ang kaalaman ukol sa siyensiya, pamamahayag, at pamamahala sa kapaligiran sa pamamagitan ng digital storytelling, geocaching, at paggamit ng mga digital application tulad ng Marine Debris Tracker. Binigyan diin niya ang kahalagan ng paglikha ng mga bagong oportunidad upang matuto sa kabilang mga limitasyon dulot ng pandemya para higit na maimpluwensyahan ang iba na kumilos.

"Hindi lamang natatapos sa pagkukumento ang aming solusyon. Iniiimbithaan namin ang aming mga estudyante na maging citizen scientists at journalists sa pamamagitan ng Marine Debris Tracker App. Naniniwala kami na sa aming ACS GEO project ay maaari itong unti-unting mag-ambag sa pagligtas ng ating marine ecosystem. Kaya patuloy kamming lilikha ng mga oportunidad sa pagkatuto gaya ng proyektong ito para sa aming mga mag-aaral sa kabilang remote learning setting sa gitna ng pandemya," sabi ni Navarro.

Bilang isang online discussion upang maiusulog ang kalusugan, kamalayang pangkapaligiran, at mga kasaysayan sa pag-angkop sa klima, naglalayon ang "Stories for a Better Normal" na baguhin ang kaisipan ng mga tao, mga pamilya, at mga pamayanan sa pamamagitan ng pagpapakita ng mga pamamaraan kung saan maaaring magkaroon tayo at isabuhay natin ang isang 'better normal' sa loob ng ating mga pamayanan.

Na-organisa ang online na talakayang ito mula sa pagtutulungan ng tanggapan ni Deputy Speaker Loren Legarda at ng Climate Change Commission (CCC) na binigyang-suporta naman mula sa Department of Education, Philippine Information Agency, Philippine Commission on Women, Institute for Climate and Sustainable Cities, The Climate Reality Project-Philippines and Mother Earth Foundation. SC TURNS DOWN EX-BUDGET EXEC APPEAL TO DISMISS PDAF-RELATED CASE

MANILA – The Supreme Court (SC) has turned down a petition filed by former Budget Undersecretary Mario Relampagos and his staff who questioned their indictment before the Sandiganbayan for their alleged part in anomalies involving lawmakers' pork barrel fund, or the Priority Development Assistance Fund (PDAF).

In a 16-page decision written by Associate Justice Henri Paul Inting of the SC's Third Division and recently made available online, the high tribunal affirmed the anti-graft court ruling on September 18, 2017 that denied Relampagos and his co-respondents' motion for the dismissal of the charges for graft and malversation.

The previous ruling stated there was probable cause against the petitioners when they facilitated with "undue haste" the process-

ing of the Special Allotment Release Orders (SARO) and Notice of Cash Allocations for former Davao del Sur Rep. Douglas Cagas' PDAF allocation.

Aside from Cagas and Relampagos, the other respondents were Department of Budget and Management (DBM) employees Rosario Nunez, Lalaine Paule, and Marilou Bare. The cases arose mainly from the revelations in March 2013 of witness Benhur Luy, who accused his former boss, Janet Lim Napoles, and the latter's sibling, Reynald Lim, of illegally detaining him.

Luy claimed he was detained to prevent disclosing what he allegedly knew of anomalies in government projects funded through the PDAF and the JLN Group of Companies.

The revelations prompted the Field Investigation Office of the Ombudsman to conduct a parallel fact-find-

ing investigation based on reports of the Commission on Audit and its findings on PDAF allocations and disbursements from 2007 to 2009.

The National Bureau of Investigation and the Ombudsman subsequently filed their complaints against a number of lawmakers, including Cagas. "The Sandiganbayan's findings of probable cause prevails over petitioners' one-sided and self-serving allegations of grave abuse of discretion on the part of the Sandiganbayan," the court said.

According to the Ombudsman's findings in Cagas' case, it involved the DBM processing the SARO for the defunct Technology and Livelihood Resource Center, which then released the disbursement voucher to a non-governmental organization (NGO), Countrywide Agri and Rural Economic Development Foundation

Inc.

A legislator or his representative would ensure the release of the pork barrel by identifying a specific project, the particular NGO which will serve as a project proponent, and the implementing agency of the government to which the PDAF allocation will be released and which will disburse the same to the NGO selected by the lawmaker, according to investigators. The SC also stated "there is no evidence that the Sandiganbayan abused, or acted in capricious and whimsical exercise of judgment...in finding probable cause for the issuance of warrants of arrest against all petitioners."

"There is likewise no showing that the Sandiganbayan's power was exercised in an arbitrary and despotic manner," the court added in dismissing the appeal. (PNA)

Court grants Kuwait Airways P11-M tax credit

MANILA – The Court of Tax Appeals (CTA) ruled in favor of a tax credit for Kuwait Airways Corporation amounting to PHP11.97 million.

In a decision dated May 28, 2021, Associate Justice Juanito Castañeda Jr. of the tax court's Second Division partially granted the firm's petition and ordered the issuance of the tax credit certificate.

The amount represents overpaid income taxes on its Gross Philippine Billings (GPBs) for the year 2016. GPB refers to the amount of gross revenue derived from carriage of persons, excess baggage, cargo and mail originating from the Philippines in a continuous and uninterrupted

flight, irrespective of the place of sale or issue and the place of payment of the ticket or passage document.

An international carrier doing business in the Philippines pays a tax of 2.5 percent of its GPBs. A tax credit may be used as payment or converted as a cash refund.

The CTA said the petitioner filed its administrative and judicial claims on time and there was erroneous overpayment of income tax. Kuwait Airways also has flights to Dubai and Abu Dhabi in the United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia, Doha in Qatar, London, Istanbul in Turkey, and Beirut, Lebanon. (PNA)

SC laments delaying tactics in final rulings

MANILA – Parties pleading before the Supreme Court (SC) must honor rulings instead of filing "clarificatory" motions which unduly delay proceedings.

The SC issued the reminder in a recent resolution on a labor case originally decided in 2012.

The High Court denied a "motion for clarification" and warned the parties not to file any further pleadings or motions under pain of contempt.

"Parties must accept and respect the final and executory decisions of this court. They are not at liberty to continue filing clarificatory motions in disregard of a previous directive that no further pleadings would be entertained," the court said.

"Like all other orders of this court, it must be strictly observed rather than circumvented through motions ill-disguised as requests for clarification," it added.

The ruling arose from consolidated cases for illegal dismissal against the Philippine National Oil Corp. (PNOC) Energy Development Corp. filed by Igmedio J. Tumanda.

The labor arbiter ordered the PNOC in 1997 to pay

complete their vaccination and have additional protection against the Covid virus.

"An added dose of protection will provide the needed resistance against the virus," she emphasized. **(PNA)**

full back wages, other privileges, and benefits due Tumanda, computed from May 1991 until reinstated. The amount stood at PHP1.547 million as of December 1996.

The arbitration was upheld by the Court of Appeals and the SC, with the High Court handing down a final ruling in 2012.

However, a second case for illegal dismissal was filed by Tumanda after the PNOC, instead of reinstating him to his former position as head of the drilling and cementing department, reduced him to an assistant in violation of his right to reinstatement without loss of seniority right.

PNOC claimed that despite the reinstatement, Tumanda abandoned his job and worked for another company.

The CA dismissed the second complaint for constructive dismissal filed by Tumanda, noting that he had been admitted back to work under the same terms and conditions prevailing before his dismissal.

On this second case, the High Court agreed with the CA and said "there was no constructive dismissal to speak of" in the second case.

"Petitioner cannot complain of discrimination amounting to constructive dismissal just because he was reinstated pending appeal to a position which is against his wishes and not commensurate to his self-worth or personal qualifications," the SC said.

In its resolution, the SC clarified that its two decisions should both be implemented and that there had been nothing to clarify in its two decisions granting him back wages in the first case and dismissing the second case after his reinstatement by the employer did not work out.

"All that needs to be done and can be done in these consolidated cases that have long attained finality is to faithfully execute the dispositions and adhere to their letter. Any deviation therefrom would be nothing less than a violation of the doctrine of immutability of judgment," the SC said. **(PNA)**
