## SENATOR PIA CAYETANO VISITS CAVITE, HIGHLIGHTS SUPPORT FOR HEALTHCARE, EDUCATION, SPORTS, AND WOMEN

**TRECE MARTIRES, CAVITE** - Senator Pia Cayetano continued her provincial visits yesterday with a stop in Cavite, where she met with Cavite Governor Athena Tolentino at the Provincial Capitol in Trece Martires. During the courtesy visit, Senator Pia was warmly welcomed by local officials, including Board Members and Mayors, as well as Capitol employees present.

As the youngest and first female governor of Cavite, Governor Tolentino and Senator Cayetano also took the opportunity to exchange insights on their shared advocacies for women empowerment and the importance of having more women in leadership roles—a fitting conversation this Women's Month.

The senator then headed to Cavite State University (CvSU) in Indang to check on the ongoing construction of the University's College of Medicine building—a key project she supported to help expand CvSU's

capacity to train future doctors.

The Senator recalled the collective effort put into the establishment of CvSU's College of Medicine, saying "It's not easy to get accredited, and it's also not easy to find the funding. But I'm so happy that it's happening now and we have our first batch of graduates coming up." Addressing the students, the Senator also challenged them: "I'm very excited kasi the College of Medicine is my project. But it remains on paper until you bring it to life."

In addition to the College of Medicine building, Senator Pia has also championed several other initiatives in CvSU, including the construction of dormitories, sports facilities for racket sports, the establishment of its Veterinary Biomedical Research Center, and the development of a smart campus—underscoring her commitment to holistic development in education, health, and sports.

## DSWD seeks public, media support vs. misinformation about aid programs

**CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA)** — The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) in Calabarzon has appealed to local government units (LGUs), the general public, and the media to support its fight against the spread of misinformation related to its social protection programs. During the Kapihan sa PIA Quezon on Feb. 26, DSWD IV-A Regional Information Officer Joseph Arceo told the media that one of the biggest challenges they face in implementing their programs is the spread of misinformation and disinformation. Citing recent reports of disinformation and fraudulent activities targeting their agency and programs, Arceo explained that misinformation puts beneficiaries at a disadvantaged position and affects the integrity of the agency. "The spread of [disinformation] puts our clients at a disadvantage and undermines the integrity of our office. No matter what we do, there are still those who deliberately spread false information," Arceo said. He also emphasized the media's vital role in helping the agency combat misinformation and serve as partners in disseminating accurate information about their programs and services. "We encourage the support and partnership of LGUs, especially media personnel, to provide the correct information and improve the various programs of our department," he added. Arceo also advised the public to remain vigilant and avoid engaging with unverified social media profiles that claim to offer educational assistance or financial aid linked to DSWD programs, particularly the Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situations (AICS). The DSWD continues to reiterate its warning that some social media pages and groups contain false information intended to mislead the public or, worse, collect personal

data that online scammers may use for fraudulent activities. It also said that all DSWD clients must undergo an interview and proper assessment before qualifying for the AICS. The DSWD further advised the public that financial assistance is extended only through the Crisis Intervention Unit/Section located at the Quezon City central office and all DSWD field offices nationwide. **(CM, PIA4A)**

## Calabarzon DRRMC on alert for 2025 elections

**CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA)** — The Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (RDRRMC) Calabarzon has placed its Emergency Operations Center on Blue Alert to ensure heightened monitoring and preparedness for the upcoming National and Local Elections. In a memorandum, Carlos Eduardo Alvarez III, Office of Civil Defense Calabarzon Regional Director and RDRRMC Chairperson, stated that the council is maintaining its Blue Alert status to ensure public safety and security throughout the election period. "The RDRRMC Calabarzon supports the safe and peaceful conduct of the forthcoming elections by ensuring that proper emergency preparedness measures are established and protocols are implemented," Alvarez said. He emphasized that large gatherings during the elections increase public vulnerability to human-induced hazards and could lead to significant impacts in the event of natural disasters. RDRRMC member agencies, particularly those involved in emergency response, have been directed to intensify their monitoring and risk reduction efforts to address any potential incidents within their respective areas of responsibility. ## DSWD vows to keep social aid politics-free ahead of 2025 polls

**LUCENA CITY (PIA)** — The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) in Calabarzon has assured the public that its social protection programs will remain free from political influence, especially with the upcoming 2025 national and local elections. DSWD Calabarzon Regional Information Officer Joseph Arceo said that they will strictly adhere to the Commission on Elections (Comelec) guidelines, which prohibit candidates from being

present at payout areas during cash aid distribution. "Kami talaga ang mismong nagbibigay at hindi namin pinapasa kung kanino man, at lahat po ng ating beneficiaries ay dadaan sa assessment ng social workers. Gusto natin straight payout ito at tayo po ang nagse-set ng mga schedules," Arceo told the media during the Kapihan sa PIA Quezon on Feb. 26. He assured the public that no politicians will be involved in the distribution of cash aid, particularly for the Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation (AICS) and Ayuda Para sa Kapos ang Kita (AKAP) programs, as mandated by the Comelec. "Sinigurado po namin na kami ang magbibigay at ina-assess po lahat ng aplikante. Ina-assess po natin 'yan para sigurado na kwalipikado sila at mayroon talaga silang pangangailangan." Arceo also emphasized that DSWD Calabarzon has partnered with Land Bank of the Philippines and other digital financial institutions to ensure secure, efficient, and convenient aid distribution. "With the help of Land Bank of the Philippines, we have digital partners handling the disbursement of payouts, ensuring that assistance reaches our clients safely, quickly, and conveniently," Arceo said. In a memorandum issued last month, the Comelec granted DSWD Secretary Rex Gatchalian's request to exempt the AKAP and other social welfare programs from the 45-day spending ban for the May 2025 elections. One of the three conditions that DSWD must comply with is ensuring that no candidate or politician is present during the distribution of aid in any form. The Comelec also stressed that politicians should refrain from participating in the distribution of exempted DSWD projects and must not influence the conduct of the elections. The DSWD assured the Comelec and the public that "mechanisms are in place to ensure that our programs will not be used for political activities." **(RMO, PIA Quezon)**

officers to implement key measures, including strict adherence to election-related protocols, particularly those outlined in Commission on Elections (COMELEC) Resolution No. 11060, which prohibits the use of public funds for social services and housing projects during the election period. ## COMELEC taps DOST and DICT for secure and transparent 2025 midterm poll

The Commission on Elections (COMELEC) wants to ensure a secure, transparent, and reliable midterm election in May 2025 by seeking the expertise of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) and the Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT).

On March 4, 2025, at COMELEC's Palacio del Gobernador office in Intramuros, Manila, COMELEC Chairperson George Erwin Garcia, DOST Secretary Renato U. Solidum Jr., and DICT Secretary Ivan John Uy signed a tripartite Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) to achieve what they called a technological, efficient, and credible electoral process this May.

In his speech, COMELEC Chair Garcia acknowledged the vital role of DOST in the conduct of the automated election. He explained that DOST is responsible for conducting various tests on Automated Counting Machines (ACM)—including stress tests, electrical tests, and others—to ensure that equipment is reliable and in good working condition.

"Ang DOST ang nagsagawa ng iba't ibang pagsusuri sa ating mga makina—mula sa stress test, electrical test, at iba pa—upang matiyak na maayos at maaasahan ang ating mga gamit," said Chair Garcia.

(Even our ballot boxes underwent their assessment, including a waterproofing test to ensure they would not leak. With the guidance of the DOST, we were able to select the best equipment for our elections)

Chair Garcia believes that the law requires an international certifying body for the machines. However, they observed that the findings of the international certifying body were the same as those of the DOST.

"Ibig sabihin, ang ating sariling institusyon ay may kakayahang magsagawa ng parehong antas ng sertipikasyon. Kaya't naniniwala kaming maaari nating isulong ang pagbabago sa batas upang kilalanin ang DOST bilang pangunahing certifying body sa bansa, hindi lamang para sa ating automated election system, kundi maging sa iba pang teknolohiyang ginagamit sa rehiyon," said Chair Garcia.

(This proves that our institution can conduct certification at the same level, which is why I believe the law can be amended to recognize DOST

as the primary certifying body in the country, not just for the automated election system but also for other technologies used in the region)

Meanwhile, DOST Secretary Solidum shared that under Republic Act 9369, the science department ensures Electoral Board Members are trained to operate ACM. This year's election process will use ACMs with upgraded features, replacing the Vote Counting Machines (VCM) used in previous years.

"As we anticipate these significant enhancements in the voting process, particularly with the introduction of new Automated Counting Machines, we are gearing up for more comprehensive training programs, the enhancement of our certification materials, and closer coordination with COMELEC and our Regional Offices," said DOST Secretary Solidum.

Sec. Solidum shared that DOST's main task is certifying Electoral Board Members to ensure they can confidently operate ACMs. Through its EB Certification Program, the department ensures at least one member of each board has the necessary expertise. In previous elections, DOST mobilized its resources to certify board members nationwide.

Sec. Solidum shared that in 2016, 182,790 Electoral Board Members were certified with a 90.7% passing rate. In 2019, 171,144 members were certified, achieving a 94.1% passing rate. The 2022 elections saw 205,413 members certified with a 94.23% passing rate. For the 2025 elections, DOST has established a pool of over 600 certifiers across all 18 regions. These certifiers underwent a Training of Trainers (TOT) program from February 4 to 21, with additional support for local and overseas voting Special Board of Election Inspectors.

Sec. Solidum also said that DOST's role in the 2025 midterm election extends beyond local and overseas EB certification. As a non-voting special member of the COMELEC Advisory Council, we provide technical advice and submit position papers to improve the electoral process. Additionally, we are preparing to deploy personnel to staff the COMELEC Technical Hubs in collaboration with DICT.

"DOST's involvement in the 2025 NLE does not end with local and overseas EB certification. As a non-voting special member of the COMELEC Advisory Council

(CAC), we also provide technical advisory services and submit position papers to further enhance the electoral process," said Sec. Solidum. **(With information from Karen Vivien Conducto, Office of the DOST Secretary)**

## Comelec trains gov't media, officials on proper use of Automatic Counting Machines

QUEZON CITY, (PIA)

— The Commission on Elections (Comelec) conducted a roadshow and demonstration on the proper use of automated counting machines (ACM) for members of the government media and government personnel at the Philippine Information Agency in Quezon City.

The event aimed to educate voters on the technology utilized by the ACM and to familiarize them with the steps involved in voting before and after using the machine.

During the demonstration, the Comelec showed that the voting process remains similar to previous elections—voters will shade their ballots and feed them into the machine—but enhancements have been integrated into the ACM for the upcoming mid-term elections.

Notable features include QR codes on voting receipts, a summary of selected candidates displayed on-screen, and a hybrid voting system.

Due to these enhancements, Comelec emphasized the importance of bringing the ACM closer to voters.

Buenafe De Guzman, a participant in the demonstration, expressed enthusiasm about the improvements made to the ACM.

"It was quick, in just a few seconds the machine has already printed the receipt, and the result was accurate," she said in Filipino.

In addition to the demonstrations, COMELEC provided information on what voters can expect on election day, including early voting hours and priority polling places.

## DOST integrates S&T in Biliran's development plan

**NAVAL, Biliran (PIA)**— The Department of Science and Technology (DOST) has conducted a series of workshops aimed to integrate science, technology and innovation (STI) plans into the provincial development plan to ensure that innovation plays a key role in the province's growth and governance. The Provincial Science and Technology Office (PSTO) in Biliran, in collaboration with the provincial government through the Biliran Provincial Science, Technology and Innovation Council, conducted on February 18-20, 2025 the second workshop validating the workshop outputs last

year to formulate STI Plan for the province. DOST Provincial Director Romeo L. Dignos said the workshops primarily aim to develop a comprehensive STI Plan that aligns with the province's overall development agenda. "The provincial development plan previously lacks an STI perspective, so this initiative is necessary to integrate science and technology into the overall strategy. The establishment of the DOST Provincial Office in July 2022, through the enactment of Republic Act 11914, solidified our role in driving STI initiatives," Dignos emphasized. He highlighted that stakeholder collaboration plays a key role in this initiative where various government agencies, including the Biliran Province State University, and other organizations were involved in shaping the STI Plan. The collective effort ensures that all sectors contribute their expertise and resources to drive development effectively, he said. Dignos also expected that the output from these workshops will be included in the revised Provincial Development Plan.

"This is timely, as the new provincial administration will update its plans, and we can seamlessly integrate the STI Plan into their development agenda," Dignos said. Dignos said the integration of STI into Biliran's development agenda is also expected to open funding opportunities as LGUs may seek financial assistance from institutions that support STI programs, adding that the DOST itself has funding mechanisms that can be tapped for eligible projects. Dignos informed that Biliran is currently the third province in Region 8 to receive funding for this initiative, with technical assistance provided by consultants from the University of the Philippines Los Baños (UPLB). Said workshop was facilitated by Dr. Edgar M. Reyes, chairperson of the department of community and environmental resource planning, Professor Janssen Andrew S. Calvelo and Ms. Mary Joy J. Ancheta of UPLB. Once the data from all relevant agencies will be consolidated, the next step will involve drafting the STI Plan, which will then be submitted to the Provincial Development Council for

review and endorsement. He added that with funding support, Biliran is among the first provinces in the country to take proactive steps in developing its STI Plan. He further said that the Plan is also expected to guide various local government units (LGUs) in incorporating science and technology into their respective development strategies. Notably, the municipality of Naval, the capital of Biliran, is a focal point of this initiative. "Our priority is to develop a roadmap for LGU Naval, ensuring that it aligns with our vision of a Smart Sustainable Community. This involves leveraging ICT and smart technologies to enhance governance and public services," he added. Dignos said the provincial government aims to complete the STI Plan within the semester, with the roadmap for LGU Naval also expected to be finalized before the year ends. Once completed, the STI Plan will serve as a guide for future development projects, ensuring that science, technology, and innovation remain at the forefront of Biliran's progress. *(RSV/PIA Biliran)*
