CAVITE LEADS THE REGION IN IMPLEMENTING ARREST WARRANTS ON RAPE CASES; 25 WANTED INDIVIDUALS HAVE BEEN APPREHENDED

Camp BGen Pantaleon Garcia, City of Imus, Cavite - Cavite Police Provincial Office, led by the Provincial Director, PCOL Dwight E. Alegre once again showed its unwavering commitment to justice by placing first in the region in the recent Simultaneous Implementation of Warrants of Arrest for the crime of rape from March 1-11, 2025, which was held in line with the Women's

Month Celebration. Cavite PPO served 25 arrest warrants in total, more than any other Police Provincial Office, according to the official review of operations. This remarkable accomplishment demonstrates Cavite PPO's commitment to upholding peace and security across Cavite by making sure that those who are wanted are brought to

justice. This successful operation demonstrates PCOL Alegre's strategic and all-encompassing leadership, which continues to prioritize community involvement and proactive law enforcement in the battle against crime, particularly in rape cases. Finding and apprehending people with standing arrest warrants was made possible in large part by the cooperative efforts of this provincial office, other government and non-government organizations, and communities.

A total of 77 people were arrested as a result of the region-wide effort, Cavite PPO leading the way with 25 arrests, followed by Laguna PPO with 16 arrests, Quezon PPO with 14 and Rizal PPO with

13 arrests, respectively, and Batangas PPO with 9 arrests. Collectively, these efforts demonstrate the PRO4A's commitment to upholding justice throughout the region.

PCOL Alegre commended the dedication of Cavite PNP personnel in its fight against criminality and lawlessness in the province. "This achievement demonstrates our unwavering dedication to the rule of law. We will keep stepping up our efforts to protect Cavite residents' safety and security".

MOST WANTED PERSON LISTED REGIONAL LEVEL ARRESTED BY TRECE MARTIRES PNP

Camp BGen Pantaleon Garcia, City of Imus, Cavite - Warrant Personnel of Trece Martires Component City Police Station successfully conducted police operation resulting in the arrest of most wanted person listed regional level on March 11, 2025 in Brgy Cabay Sitio Juiza, Tiaong, Quezon.

PLTCOL ORLANDO A CARAG JR, Officer-In-Charge identify the suspect as alias Arman, most wanted person listed regional level and a resident of Brgy Paradahan 2, Tanza, Cavite.

The operation of the Warrant Personnel of Trece Martires Component City Police Station while utilizing an Alternative Recording Device (ARD), led to the arrest of the accused by virtue of Warrant of Arrest dated December 23, 2024 for "Rape" with Criminal Case No. TMCR-1424-24 issued Presiding Judge, Family Court, Branch 5, Trece Martires City, with no bail recommended.

The accused was informed of his constitutional rights in a dialect he knew while he was being held at the Trece Martires Component City Police Station Custodial Facility.

Our steadfast dedication to putting an end to criminal activity in Cavite is demonstrated by the successful apprehension of this Most Wanted Person. We are unwavering in our resolve to safeguard our local communities and advance peace across the province.

Calabarzon Dev't Council welcomes PIA as regular member

CALAMBA CITY (PIA) — The Calabarzon Regional Development Council (RDC) welcomed the Philippine Information Agency (PIA) and six other agencies as new voting members during its First Quarter Full Council meeting on Thursday, March 6. Among the new regular member-agencies of Calabarzon's RDC are the Department of Energy, Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development, Department of Information and Communications Technology, Department of Migrant Workers, National Commission on Indigenous Peoples, Philippine Information Agency, and the Office of Civil Defense.

The inclusion aligns with President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s Executive Order No. 82, which reorganized the RDCs to strengthen their role in advancing regional socio-economic development. As a newly appointed voting member, PIA Region IV-A Regional Head Ma. Cristina Arzadon assured the agency's continued support for accelerating the region's economic and social growth, as well as its sustainable development. "We are grateful for the inclusion of other national agencies as regular members of the RDC, pursuant to President Ferdinand Marcos Jr.'s Executive Order 82, which seeks to accelerate socio-economic development in all regions," Arzadon said. Since its inclusion in the RDC, PIA IV-A has actively leveraged its platforms to raise awareness of government programs aimed at enhancing the region's socioeconomic landscape. "The PIA, even as a non-voting member, had been in full support of the RDC's pursuit of regional socio-economic transformation under the Philippine Development Plan 2023-2028. Based on the official recap of operations, PRO 4A recorded a total of 125 warrants of arrest served, the highest among all regional police offices. This outstanding achievement reflects PRO 4A's dedication to maintaining peace and security in CALABARZON by ensuring that wanted persons are held accountable. This successful operation is a testament to the holistic and strategic leadership of PBGEN Lucas, who continues to emphasize proactive law enforcement and community engagement in the fight against criminality, especially in rape cases. DOT banking on faith tourism to improve visitor traffic in Calabarzon

TAGAYTAY CITY, Cavite (PIA) — The Department of Tourism (DOT) in Calabarzon plans to intensify the promotion and development of faith tourism to cater Catholic pilgrims that will visit the region this Lenten season. DOT Calabarzon Regional Director Marites Castro shared that they are working on improving pilgrimage tourism in the region. This initiative aims to attract more people to visit various Catholic churches and historical sites in Calabarzon, especially during Lenten season where Filipinos often take time to observe religious and cultural traditions. "We really want to intensify our pilgrimage tourism, or faith tourism, which is why we are coordinating with local tourism officers and the churches to create local tour packages that include the churches," Castro said during an open forum with local media on the

weekly Kapihan sa Bagong Pilipinas. Castro mentioned that DOT Calabarzon is providing ongoing training for tourism workers as well as with churches to offer guidance. She added, "We also introduced the Virgenes Coronadas de Calabarzon with the aim of attracting more visitors. This initiative is coordinated with the churches to give people the opportunity to see the original religious images, which are not often seen by many." For this year's Holy Week, Batangas Province will offer a pilgrimage tour to the public. To further encourage people to join the tour, the Tourism department has coordinated with tour operators to maximize the promotion of visiting churches for Visita Iglesia. "This coming Holy Week, in Batangas they already have a pilgrimage tour. So, with our proposal to the tour operators, we need to ensure that in one day, there are many places we can promote, and many churches to visit," the director explained. In addition to coordinating

with local government units, tourism offices, and churches, DOT will also collaborate with other government agencies, including the Department of Health, Philippine National Police, and Office of Civil Defense, to ensure the safety and security of visitors to the region. In anticipation of the influx of tourists, Castro added that they will seek the assistance of the Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management

Council (RDRRMC) in mobilizing local DRRM offices to ensure safety measures and preparedness plans are in place including traffic schemes. Updates and tour recommendations will also be posted by DOT on their social media platforms during Holy Week, as well as for other summer destinations in Calabarzon. **(CO, SI/PIA-4A)**

DOT pushes edutourism to enhance students' cultural awareness

CALAMBA City, Laguna (PIA) — Aside from sustainable tourism, the Department of Tourism (DOT) in Calabarzon is eyeing to further promote educational tourism to enrich students' knowledge and understanding of the country's history and culture. In an interview during the Kapihan sa Bagong Pilipinas, Marites T. Castro, Regional Director of DOT Calabarzon, stated that it is crucial to enhance the younger generation's knowledge to instill the

importance of history and culture, and to emphasize their significance in shaping our identity as Filipinos. To achieve the goals of this initiative, Castro fully supports the implementation of educational tourism and encourages schools to prioritize educational school field trips where students can visit various cultural heritage sites, landmarks, and museums, instead of allocating time staying in commercial areas like malls. "We, at the Department of Tourism, hope that through this edutourism initiative, we can enhance student awareness of our culture and history. We also aim for this effort to help the tourism industry thrive and make younger generations more informed," Castro said. She also expressed concerns regarding the commercialization of education, which may be seen as the cause of why some students lack awareness about our history and culture. "Because education is now commercialized, the DOT hopes to bring back the old joy of learning—encouraging students to research more rather than just scrolling through their gadgets," Castro added. She reiterated that by collaborating with the Department of Education (DepEd) and the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) this will lead to fostering important values in younger generations including resilience, industriousness, and patriotism. For this year, prioritizing edutourism is one of the strategic initiatives and programs that DOT Calabarzon will roll out in partnership with the University of the Philippines Los Baños (UPLB), who have launched their edutourism program last 2023. **(MM, CO; PIA-4A)**

DOH Calabarzon warns of heat-related illnesses amid rising temperatures

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) — The Department of Health (DOH) in Calabarzon has warned the public against heat-related illnesses as the region continues to experience rising temperatures. In a Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (RDRRMC) meeting held on March 6, DOH officials advised the public to take necessary precautions, such as staying hydrated and avoiding prolonged exposure to heat. "We have to be frequently hydrated, drink as much water as possible throughout the day, and avoid exposure to direct sunlight to prevent heat-related illnesses such as heat cramps, heat syncope, heat exhaustion, and heat stroke," the agency said. DOH Calabarzon has emphasized that prolonged exposure to heat may increase the risk of heat stroke, a serious health condition that might result in severe complications. The high heat index in some parts of the region has prompted some local government units to suspend face-to-face

classes, while others have shifted to online modular learning. The Department of Education (DepEd) has also approved the implementation of schedule adjustments to ensure the safety of students and school personnel amid the high temperature. Meanwhile, the Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (RDRRMC) Calabarzon has urged local DRRM offices to intensify public information campaigns and advisories on heat-related illness prevention. According to state weather bureau Pagasa, temperatures in the region are expected to remain high for the rest of the week, with extreme caution about heat index levels. PAGASA said prolonged activity and exposure could lead to heat cramps and exhaustion, which may lead to heat stroke. The state weather bureau continues to advise the public to monitor weather updates and follow safety guidelines to prevent heat-related health risks. **(FC, PIA4A)**

CAVITE POLICE FORCE INTENSIFIES CRACKDOWN ON ILLEGAL FIREARMS AND DRUGS THROUGH SUCCESSFUL POLICE OPERATIONS

Camp BGen Pantaleon Garcia, City of Imus, Cavite – In an intensified campaign to maintain peace and order, authorities successfully conducted a series of police operations under OPLAN PAGLALANSAG OMEGA and OPLAN BIG BERTHA, resulting in multiple arrests and the seizure of illegal firearms, ammunition, and illegal drugs.

The joint efforts of the Criminal Investigation and Detection Group (CIDG) RFU 4A, Regional Intelligence Division (RID 4A), Regional Intelligence Unit (RIU 4A), Special Action Force (SAF), Regional Mobile Force Battalion (RMFB 4A), and the Cavite Provincial Mobile Force Company (PMFC) led to the coordinated implementation of Search Warrant No. 2025-89 against alias "Olan." While Olan remains at large, while alias "Jess" was arrested for violating Republic Act 10591 in connection with the COMELEC Gun Ban.

At about 6:30 AM in Barangay Salawag, Dasmariñas City, Cavite, the search warrant was executed, leading to the confiscation of several illegal firearms and live ammunition. The items seized included a Smith & Wesson .38 caliber revolver, a 5.56 Armalite rifle, and various rounds of ammunition.

In addition, alias Jess was arrested for unlawful possession of a .22 caliber firearm with a silencer, along with a magazine and live ammunition. Barangay officials were present to ensure transparency during the operation.

Meanwhile, at about 9:00 AM, of same date

the Operatives of CIDG Laguna PFU (Lead Unit), CIDG RFU 4A, RIU 4A, RID 4A, RMFB 4A, 74th SAC, 81st SAC, 82nd SAC, 83rd SAC, 7SAB, RDB, SAF, PIU 4A, EOD-SAF, Cavite PPO and Dasmariñas CCPS successfully conducted a buy-bust operation in Barangay Salawag, Dasmariñas City, Cavite, led to the arrest of alias Mark, alias Trixcy, and alias Eddie. The suspects were apprehended with unlicensed firearms and illegal drugs, violating RA 10591 (the COMELEC Gun Ban) and RA 9165 (Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act). Seized items included one (1) unit caliber .22 Rifle (Marlim model 99 automatic), one (1) unit caliber .22 Rifle (No brand), live ammunition, boodle money, seven (7) pieces transparent heat-sealed sachet containing white crystalline substance suspected to be shabu, and drug paraphernalia.

Alias Richard was also apprehended for obstruction of justice under Presidential Decree 1829 in a separate operation.

In a separate operation in Sugarland, Barangay Salawag, Dasmariñas City, authorities apprehended alias Ernie for illegal drug and firearm possession. Items seized included a .22 caliber revolver with live ammunition, several sachets of shabu, and digital weighing scale.

These successful operations underscore the Philippine National Police's unwavering commitment to combating crime and protecting public safety. By employing intelligence-driven strategies and maintaining close coordination with law enforcement agencies, we have once again demonstrated that illegal firearms and drugs have no place in our communities. We commend the dedication of our officers and the cooperation of local authorities in ensuring the success of these operations. Let this serve as a warning to individuals engaged in illegal activities: We will not rest until justice is served.

DOST seeks out grassroots Innovations for inclusive dev't program

LEGAZPI CITY, Albay (PIA) — The Department of Science and Technology (DOST) is seeking potential grassroots innovations in Bicol as the Grassroots Innovation for Inclusive Development (GRIND) Program begins its second year of implementation.

DOST Bicol Regional Director Rommel Serrano said that the main objective is to actively search for innovators, identify those with potential for growth, and determine how the government can assist them in bringing their ideas to mainstream platforms. The DOST is particularly encouraging innovations developed by Indigenous peoples and communities, women, out-of-school youth, and other groups in society, such as farmers, fisherfolk, artisans, pastoralists, and workers, according to Sydney Rose Oliquino, the GRIND focal point in Bicol.

These individuals often lack support from the formal sector but demonstrate the ability to innovate and provide solutions to community challenges, ultimately creating positive impacts on society, Oliquino said.

One of the resource speakers, Antonette Alarcon from the GRIND technical working group, defined grassroots innovation as the development of products, services, and processes aimed at addressing specific local challenges and opportunities, which have the potential to provide economic benefits to the community.

Grassroots innovation can include innovations in heirloom recipes and heritage foods, artisanal and endangered crafts, ethnobotanicals, solutions addressing health hazards, and initiatives related to the circular economy, Alarcon said.

Alarcon said the technical evaluation committee for these grassroots innovations consists of at least five stakeholders from various sectors, including government, industry, media, and representatives from academic institutions and civil society groups.



Alvin Mahawan, the director of research and development services at the Dr. Emilio B. Espinosa Sr. Memorial State College of Agriculture and Technology, emphasized that committee members must be competent, skilled, and discerning when selecting grassroots innovations that will benefit from interventions from the DOST.

Oliquino said that the GRIND training activity has empowered provincial science and technology officers, local government units (LGUs), and the technical evaluation committee in preparation for the SalikLakbay program, which focuses on mapping potential Geographical Indications (GIs) in communities and is scheduled to take place in March.

She added that they are advocating for this program among LGUs to create ordinances that will support local innovators, thereby increasing community awareness.

The DOST in Bicol had allocated some P1.5 million for the first year of program implementation.

Currently, DOST has identified and documented 606 grassroots innovations across the country, with 59 GIs already funded and deployed.

Additionally, 61 innovators have been provided with the necessary tools and equipment to enhance

their creativity, productivity, and product quality, opening up entrepreneurial opportunities for them and their communities.

DOST set to install more e-weather stations in Oriental Mindoro

CALAPAN CITY, Oriental Mindoro (PIA) — The Department of Science and Technology (DOST), in partnership with Mindoro State University (MinSU), is set to install additional e-weather stations in the various municipalities of Oriental Mindoro, particularly in Naujan and Calapan City, in the coming months. In an interview with PIA, DOST Oriental Mindoro Provincial Director Jesse Pine said that this initiative aims to enhance local disaster preparedness and mitigation efforts through real-time weather monitoring. An e-weather station is automated facility equipped with sensors to measure and transmit weather data such as temperature, humidity, wind speed, and rainfall. These stations provide local government units (LGUs) and disaster response agencies with crucial data that can aid in early warning systems and

disaster risk reduction. This planned expansion follows the success of Project MOSES (Monitoring and Observation of Site-specific E-weather Stations), initially implemented by MinSU. The project, funded by DOST-MIMAROPA, aims to establish a network of real-time weather monitoring systems to support disaster response efforts. Pine highlighted the significance of expanding the network of e-weather stations. "Ico-compliment niya [Project MOSES] ang mga installed weather monitoring stations, hindi ito ilalagay para mangibabaw sa lahat ng weather monitoring stations, bagkus ito ay mag-compliment. Kasi minsan mayroong pumapalya. Alam niyo naman ang mga weather monitoring stations, kapag naluluma na, nag ba-bug down ang iba dito, kung

DOST-developed technology helps PH prepare, respond to earthquakes

The Philippines often faces destructive earthquakes, typhoons and floods, making disaster preparedness a necessity. To help local government units plan and respond more effectively, the Rapid Earthquake Damage Assessment System (REDAS), developed by the Department of Science and Technology-Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (Phivolcs), provides science-based data for quick and informed decision-making. This technology simulates earthquake impacts, monitors hazards and provides near-real-time risk assessments — essential tools for reducing disaster risks. However, while local government units are the first responders during disasters, not all have the technical resources needed for effective planning and response. To address this gap, REDAS offers free training and access to hazard simulation tools like ground-shaking simulation, flood risk projection and tsunami travel time modeling. These tools enhance local

disaster risk reduction and management strategies. Dr. Maria Leonila P. Bautista, associate scientist at Phivolcs, highlighted the importance of REDAS in empowering local governments and communities. "REDAS is more than just a tool; it is an empowerment platform for local government units and communities. By providing them with science-backed data, they can plan better, act faster and ultimately save more lives," she said. To expand the use of this technology, Phivolcs and the Department of Science and Technology conduct REDAS training nationwide. The next session is scheduled for March 10-14, 2025, in San Juan, La Union, where local government units from Pangasinan will undergo training on hazard simulation, risk assessment and exposure database development. REDAS is not only useful for disaster response but also plays a vital role in urban planning and policymaking. Recognizing its importance, the Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council 1 recently passed a resolution recommending its adoption by local government units, ensuring science-based disaster preparedness becomes a standard practice in local governance. Richard Caplis, supervising economic development specialist at the National Economic and Development Authority Region 1, stressed the value of integrating REDAS into development plans. "As we prepare the Region 1 Physical Framework Plan, the integration of REDAS will help in creating science-based land use policies. This ensures that we are responding to disasters and proactively mitigating their risks," Melca said. With climate change increasing the frequency and severity of disasters, tools like REDAS are essential for building safer and more resilient communities.

DOST implements barangay digitalization in Siquijor

LARENA, Siquijor (PIA) — The Department of Science and Technology (DOST) and the Larena municipal government trained 44 barangay officials from the town's 22 barangays on Barangay eSystems and Tools (BeST). BeST is an online e-Governance solution designed to streamline the management of resident profiles, judicial information, and document generation for effective planning and monitoring at the barangay level. Barangay officials will have direct, real-time hands-on experience with BeST, allowing them to store, retrieve, and update information using the Information and Communication Technology. The training, held at the Convention Center of Siquijor State College (SSC), aims to teach the participants basic hardware operations, data encoding, and report generation using the Barangay eSystems and Tools. Engr. Mario de la Peña, provincial S&T director of DOST here, said that Larena is one of the three towns in the province that have so far availed of the program conducted under the approved Grant-in-Aid (GIA) Project of Larena. "Pipila pa lamang ang naka avail ani nga programa sa DOST. Ang LGU Larena, usa sa tulo ka munisipalidad diri sa atong isla nga naka-avail niani nga program sa GIA program kaniadtong sakop pa kita sa DOST 7," said de la Peña. (Only a few local government units have availed of this program from DOST. In fact, Larena is one of three towns who have availed of this GIA program.) "Ako nanghinaut nga maposlan ninyo pagmaayo kaning mga computer

servers installed with the BeST software sa pag-generate ninyo ug report sama sa barangay clearance," he added. (I expect you will be able to maximize these computer servers installed with the BeST software in generating your reports and forms such as barangay clearance.) Under the GIA program, Larena was able to buy computer servers installed with the BeST software after their project proposal was approved. The training tackled the Barangay e-Systems and Tolls, account profiling and residents information profiling, actual data encoding, and barangay website content management. The Central Visayas Information Sharing Network Foundation, Inc. (CVISNET), which is the developer of the BeST software, served as the training provider. Lunda Sebuyan, the barangay secretary from Barangay Catamboan, is thankful she was able to join the training. "Dako kaayo ni ug ikatabang namo. Sa pagsugod sa training, maka-ingganyo kay makat-on mi aning upgrade nga gitudlo. Kaming mga participants naminaw ug tarong para pag-uli sa barangay, ma-apply namo ug dili pud sayang ang among pag-ari within three days kay magamit namo ang among nakat-onan. Dako ko ug pasalamat sa DOST," said Sebuyan. (I am very grateful that our barangay was given the opportunity to attend. This will be a big help to us. It is encouraging because we are learning the upgrade being taught. As participants, we are listening carefully so that when we return to the barangay, we can apply what we have learned and make the most out of our three days here. I am very thankful to DOST.) Mas matatag at inklusibong Blue Economy, isinulong ni Legarda sa UK-PH panel discussion

Pinagtibay ni Senadora Loren Legarda ang kanyang pakikiisa at paninindigan para sa pagprotekta ng likas na yamang dagat, sustainable development, at pagpapalakas ng kababaihan sa ginanap na “Blue Horizons – Accelerating the UK-Philippines Partnership for a Sustainable Blue Economy” panel discussion sa The Conservatory, Manila Peninsula Hotel, Makati City. Ang pagtitipon, na inorganisa ng embahada ng United Kingdom sa Maynila sa okasyon ng pagbisita ni UK Foreign Secretary Rt. Hon. David Lammy, ay sumentro sa talakayan patungkol sa proteksyon ng biodiversity at ng karagatan.

Ang pangunahing prinsipal author at sponsor ng Blue Economy Bill, binigyang-diin ni Legarda ang kahalagahan ng ocean accounting at environmental valuation sa ating mga karagatan.

Ang ocean accounting at environmental valuation ay ang siyektipong pag-aaral at paglalagay ng halaga sa likas na yaman, tulad ng karagatan, kagubatan, biodiversity, at tubig, upang maisama ito sa paggawa ng mga desisyon sa ekonomiya at pamamahala. Dahil dito, mapapag-aralang mabuti kung paano mababalanse ang pag-unlad ng ekonomiya at pangangalaga sa kalikasan.

“Sa pamamagitan ng Blue Economy Bill at PENCAS Law, masusukat at mabibigyan natin ng tamang halaga ang ating coral reefs, mangroves, at iba pang yamang-dagat. Kailangan natin itong gawin upang maunawaan kung ano ang mga likas na yaman na meron tayo, ano nga ba ang halaga ng mga ito kung ekonomiya ang pag-uusapan at kung paano natin ito pangalagaan,” dagdag niya.

nais pahinain ang mga proteksyong pangkalikasan at pangmamamayan na nilagay sa Blue Economy Bill.

Kasabay rin ng pagdiriwang ng International Women's Day, naging tampok sa diskusyon ang mahalagang papel ng kababaihan sa pangangalaga ng karagatan at sustainable fisheries.

Binigyang-diin ni Legarda ang pangangailangan mas malawak na access sa pondo, suporta sa mga negosyong pangkabuhayan, at paggamit ng Indigenous Knowledge Systems o ang mga tradisyunal na kasanayan, paniniwala, at pamamaraan ng pangangalaga sa kalikasan ng mga katutubong pamayanan.
