Pananaw ng Commission on Elections na maging ang mga party-list na organisasyon ay laging nag-aasam ng isang bagong batas upang ipakita ang tunay na sentimyento ng mga marginalized at underrepresented na sektor.

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PGC RECOGNIZES TOP PERFORMING OFFICES AND FRONTLINERS FOR OUTSTANDING PUBLIC SERVICE IN CELEBRATION OF EASE OF DOING BUSINESS MONTH

In line with Presidential Proclamation No. 818, declaring May as Ease of Doing Business (EODB) Month, the Provincial Government of Cavite (PGC) proudly honored its top-performing offices and frontliners for their exceptional commitment to fast, transparent, and people-first public service on May 19, 2025 at the Function Hall of the New Provincial Capitol Building in Trece Martires City.

Carrying the theme "From Red Tape to Red Carpet: Better Business Movement in a Bagong Pilipinas," this year's celebration is a testament to the dedication of individuals and departments who continuously transform challenges into innovative solutions and bureaucratic processes into efficient services.

Governor Athena Bryana D. Tolentino personally led the recognition ceremony right after the PGC flag-raising ceremony. In her message, the Governor extended her heartfelt congratulations to all the awardees, expressing her delight that many employees have been recognized for their outstanding performance and dedication.

She also emphasized that the core of public service lies in a unified mission – that is to serve for the betterment of fellow Caviteños and the province.

Leading the roster of recognized offices is the Office of the Provincial Veterinarian (OPV) with an impressive 2,584 commendations, a reflection of their unwavering dedication to animal welfare and public health.

The Provincial Information and Communications Technology Office (PICTO) followed with 257 commendations, highlighting their crucial role in advancing digital governance and transparency.

The Office of the Provincial Governor (OPG) ranked third with 230 commendations, a nod to their continued efforts in steering impactful

governance.

Completing the Top 5 are Kawit Kalayaan Hospital, which garnered 70 commendations, and two offices tied in fifth place—Office of the Provincial Planning and Development Coordinator (OPPDC) and Doña Olivia Salamanca Memorial Hospital, each earned 15 commendations. On the other hand, this year's most commended frontliners have demonstrated exemplary service and compassion, inspiring their peers across the provincial government.

At the top of the list is Dr. Kristine Roraldo from the OPV with a remarkable 1,145 commendations, followed by Dr. Gladys Credo with 973 commendations, and Dr. Gerry Romen with 357 commendations, all of whom play critical roles in animal and public health services. From PICTO, Mr. Frederick Sayoc and Ms. Maria Isidra Bergunder received 88 and 87 commendations, respectively, for their outstanding service in ensuring seamless digital solutions, while Ms. Diwani Durano (30 commendations) and Ms. Maria Arianna Camille Dela Cruz (29 commendations) were likewise recognized for their dedicated support. From OPG, Ms. Tricia May Lorio, Ms. Rachel Mae Morancil and Ms. Mary Joy Alano earned 48, 47 and 27 commendations, respectively, for their consistent delivery of responsive public service. Awardees were identified based on the Client Satisfaction Survey Report for the year 2024 derived through the Client Feedback Mechanism of the PGC which covers 38 offices. Under the mechanism, the Customer Satisfaction Survey Form serves as a survey tool to appraise the services received by clients while Customer Commendation Form evaluates the personnel who rendered the service by providing specific commendation.

The feedback mechanism not only caters to commendation but also facilitates complaints,

should there be any dissatisfaction emanating from the clients during their transaction in any office of the provincial government. The recognition ceremony highlights the provincial government's ongoing mission to institutionalize ease of doing business, improve frontline services, and build a Bagong Pilipinas that prioritizes the welfare of every Caviteño. --- **OPIO**

DOST-Cavite conducts the 2nd Saliklakbay Solutions Mapping and Immersion in Cavite

The Department of Science and Technology - Cavite conducted the 2nd Saliklakbay Solutions Mapping and Immersion to identify additional possible grassroots innovations (GIs) last May 16, 2025 in the municipalities of Maragondon and Magallanes, Cavite. The first activity was conducted last May 7, 2025 in Indang, Cavite. Representatives from the pentahelix partners continued to support this initiative in bringing science and technology to the communities in Cavite. Batangas, Rizal and Cavite provinces have been known to be strongholds of political families for decades.

The Rectos of Batangas is an old political family whose generations stemmed from former Senator Claro M. Recto who played a key role in drafting the 1935 constitution.

Decades later, former actress Vilma Santos-Recto—wife of Claro's grandson and Finance Secretary Ralph— is leading the charge as the new governor-elect. Her son, Ryan Christian, is joining the House of Representatives as the newly-minted sixth district representative.

The Remullas, Bautistas, and Revillas of Cavite are also forming their impenetrable stronghold with Abeng Remulla and Ram Bautista-Revilla as Governor and Vice Governor-elect, respectively.

Meanwhile, the Ynareses of Rizal remained undefeated with Governor Nina continuing her duties at the Capitol alongside Pining Gatbalayan as Vice Governor.

Quezon: undefeated

Quezon Province has long rid of its very own dynasty through the triumph of Angelina Tan in 2022. Three years later, the physician-turned-politician is continuing her duties as the province's chief executive alongside Third Alcala as vice governor.

Tan, who won over the Suarezes in the previous election, remained unchallenged thanks to her health programs in the province. Meanwhile, Alcala—whose political ties can be traced to the father and son tandem in the Capital, Lucena—will continue to lead local legislation as Vice Governor.

Laguna: a tale of two women

It may have been wrong to pit women against women, but Laguna province was promised with a very different leadership style in Sol Aragones, a former journalist and outgoing Laguna Third District Representative, after winning against Ruth Mariano-Hernandez, outgoing Second District Representative and wife of outgoing governor-now-turned Congressman Ramil Hernandez.

Both Aragones and Mariano-Hernandez were members of the House of Representatives and have built respective networks of their own right. Aragones has found strong support in the 3rd district where she started the Alagang Sol program, while Mariano-Hernandez, who also shared popularity with her governor husband in the second district, kickstarted the Serbisayong Tama Kababaihan—a program for the Lagunense women. Barely a day after the elections, but the electorate of CALABARZON is seeing clear winners who will be sworn into office by June 30. The only question that stands: will the (relatively) new faces live up to the expectations that go with their names?

‘Benteng Bigas Meron Na’ rolls out in Calabarzon

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) — Vulnerable sectors in various parts of Cavite, Laguna, and Rizal were able to purchase rice at just P20 per kilo through the Department of Agriculture’s “Benten Bigas, Meron Na” program.

In Dasmariñas City, residents of Barangay Salitran III expressed their gratitude to President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. for fulfilling his promise to make rice more affordable for the public.

“Maraming salamat po kay Pangulong Bongbong Marcos sa pagsasakatuparan ninyo ng pangakong gawing bente pesos ang presyo ng bigas. Sana po ay laging may ganito dahil malaki po talaga ang maitutulong nito sa amin,” said Bella Maneses, who lined up early to avail of the discounted rice.

Maneses added that the low-cost rice is a big help to her family, especially amid the rising prices of basic goods.

According to City Agriculturist Jennifer Ibayan, the program prioritizes members of the vulnerable sector, such as senior citizens, persons with disabilities (PWDs), solo parents, and beneficiaries of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps).

“Suportado ng pamahalaang lungsod ang pagbebenta ng murang bigas na layuning tulungan ang ating mga kababayang kabilang sa vulnerable sector upang magkaroon sila ng sapat at masustansyang pagkain,” Ibayan said.

In Santa Rosa City, Laguna, the local government has also begun rolling out the P20-per-kilo rice program, made available every Friday through the Kadiwa ng Pangulo Center.

“Maraming mamamayan ng Santa Rosa ang tumangkilik sa pagbebenta ng mas murang bigas—lalo na ang mga senior citizen, PWD, solo parents, at 4Ps beneficiaries. Alinsunod ito sa direktiba ni Pangulong Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. na palawigin ang access ng publiko sa abot-kayang at dekalidad na bigas,” the Santa Rosa City Agriculture Office said in a statement. Aside from affordable rice, the Kadiwa ng Pangulo also offers a variety of quality

agricultural products, including fresh fruits and vegetables, other food items, and locally made goods from various parts of Calabarzon.

The Santa Rosa City Agriculture Office reaffirmed the local government’s full commitment to ensuring continuous access to affordable and nutritious food for its constituents.

Meanwhile, in Antipolo City, stocks of P20 rice were quickly sold out, reflecting high demand and strong community support for the initiative.

Antipolo City Mayor Andeng Ynares also underscored the local government’s full support for the “Bente Bigas, Meron Na!” program, which she said aligns with efforts to make rice more accessible to the general public.

Other LGUs participating in this initiative are Naic in Cavite; and Rodriguez, and Binangonan in Rizal, which are scheduled to sell the affordable rice every Thursday and Friday at designated Kadiwa Centers.

Meanwhile, Kadiwa Centers in Kalayaan in Laguna; and San Mateo, Rizal will offer the subsidized rice every Friday.

DA: Poultry supply sufficient amid impending Brazil import ban

Agriculture Secretary Francisco Tiu Laurel Jr. assured the public of a sufficient supply of poultry products despite the impending temporary import ban on Brazil following reports of its first bird flu outbreak.

Tiu Laurel confirmed that the Department of Agriculture (DA) will impose a countrywide poultry ban on Brazil, the country’s top meat supplier.

During the Palace press briefing on Monday, Tiu Laurel said Brazil is not the Philippines’ sole supplier of poultry, noting the imposition of the poultry import ban will result in market diversion.

The advantage of Brazil is its lower prices compared

Gov’t stamping out drug syndicates, says PBBM

President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. said the government is pursuing both primary and small-scale drug dealers while strictly upholding due process and carrying out the anti-drug

campaign without resorting to killings. In the maiden episode of the BBM Podcast on Monday, President Marcos assured the public of the government’s renewed focus on addressing the country’s illegal drug problem.

“So ngayon, in the same vein, part of the lesson of this election, let’s go back to ‘yung sa grassroots level. Kung inaalala ng tao, sinasabi, nagbabalikan (ang drugs) dito, sige, tuloy natin ‘yung malalaking drug bust,” President Marcos said during the podcast’s first episode.

“Tuloy natin... ikukulong natin ‘yung mga sangkot diyan sa drugs. Pero tingnan na muna natin ‘yung mas small offender,” the President said.

President Marcos said the renewed anti-narcotics efforts is part of the campaign, in which policemen conduct daily street patrols.

He noted that while anti-drug agencies focus on small drug dealers, due process is observed.

“Kasi talaga, iniwasan ko, ‘yung basta may suspect

“Maraming nagsasabi sa akin niyan. Eh anong gagawin ko? Maging masamang tao? Hindi ko na mababago ‘yung ugali ko,” the Chief Executive said.

The BSP has received reports of unsolicited Viber messages from a sender using the Deputy Governor’s photo, offering jobs in an e-commerce company with daily earnings ranging from ₱500 to ₱5,000.

To guard against possible illegal activities, the BSP urges the public to refrain from engaging with and providing personal information to unknown individuals.

The public is also encouraged to verify the authenticity of any messages or transactions claiming to involve BSP personnel, and to report unauthorized activities through the following:

Marcos admin adds 16,000 new teaching posts to boost education system

In line with President Ferdinand Marcos Jr.’s directive to strengthen the education system, the government has created 16,000 new teaching positions in time for the opening of classes in June this year.

Presidential Communications Undersecretary and Palace Press Officer Claire Castro said on Monday’s press briefing that the 16,000 new positions are part of the first phase of a larger plan to hire 20,000 teachers.

Castro also emphasized that President Marcos wants to address the teacher shortage and improve the quality of education

The President also acknowledged the difficulty of neutralizing drug syndicates in the country, considering the large amount of grease money involved.

for Filipino students. She said that PhP4.19 billion in funding for this initiative has already been allocated to the 2025 General Appropriations Act (GAA).

“Unang-una po, it is the directive of our President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. to strengthen the education system. Ang gusto po talaga ng Pangulo ay mapabawasan ang kakulangan ng mga guro sa bawat eskwela,” Castro said. “[The] 16,000 teaching positions ay unang parte lamang po dahil ang target po ay 20,000 teaching positions,” she added.

The initiative supports the efforts of the Department of Education (DepEd) to address the 56,000 shortage of teachers in 2024, and a move toward a more effective teacher-student ratio.

The new teaching positions aim to reduce overcrowding in classrooms, particularly in schools with sufficient infrastructure but that struggle with high student-to-teacher ratios.

The national classroom-to-student ratio is 1:40, above DepEd’s ideal of 1:30. Many primary schools also exceed the 1:35 target. Smaller classes allow teachers to give more focused attention and improve learning outcomes.

DOST Region 1, PNRI Strengthen Local Capacities on Radiation Safety and Emergency Preparedness

The Department of Science and Technology Region 1 (DOST Region 1), in partnership with the DOST-Philippine Nuclear Research Institute (DOST-PNRI) and in coordination with the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Offices (PDRRMO) in Region 1 hosted the Specialized Seminar on Radiation Safety and Nuclear Emergency Preparedness and Response on May 20, 2025, at the DOST-La Union Provincial Science and Technology Center in Sevilla, City of San Fernando, La Union. The seminar gathered key stakeholders, including PDRRMOs, Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Officers (LDRRMOs), Provincial and Municipal Health Office-La Union representative, and members of the Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council 1 (RDRRMC 1), aiming to strengthen their capacities through essential knowledge on radiation hazards and emergency response strategies aligned with Republic Act 10121's decentralized DRRM framework. In her opening message, DOST Region 1 Director Teresita A. Tabaog, represented by Assistant Regional Director for Technical Operations Services Racquel M. Espiritu, underscored the significance of the initiative. “As we continue to strengthen our disaster preparedness programs, this initiative plays a vital role in supporting our national goals for a safe and secure nuclear energy program, while ensuring the safety and well-being of our communities.” DOST-La Union Provincial Director Jonathan M. Viernes, represented by Engr. Bernadine P. Suniega, Supervising Science Research Specialist, welcomed the participants by highlighting the importance of their role: “Your presence shows your commitment to a safer and more prepared La Union. Sana ay maging makabuluhan, kapaki-pakinabang, at higit sa lahat, makapagbigay ng bagong kaalaman ang seminar na ito para sa ating lahat.” Experts from the Radiological Impact Assessment Section (RIAS) of DOST-PNRI's Nuclear Regulatory Division led the technical sessions. agriculture, industry, and research. She also highlighted that a single uranium pellet can power an average household for about six months and noted how radiation has increased agricultural yields by up to 30% through DOST-PNRI's Carrageenan Plant Growth Promoter. Additionally, she discussed the network of radiation monitoring stations nationwide, which helps ensure public safety through real-time detection and assessment of radiological conditions. Meanwhile, Mr. Christopher O. Mendoza, Senior Science Research Specialist, discussed the National Radiological Emergency Preparedness and Response Plan (RADPLAN), the official framework for managing radiation-related emergencies in the country. He detailed the types of radiological emergencies, the preparedness and response objectives, and the national coordination mechanisms under RADPLAN, which was tested during major international incidents such as the 2011 Fukushima Dai-ichi nuclear power plant accident. In his closing remarks, Mr. Michael John C. Maquiling, Supervising Science Research Specialist and DRRM Focal of DOST Region 1, expressed gratitude to all participants who joined the seminar on-site, via Zoom, and through Facebook Live, emphasizing the importance

feed her family of five when combined with the rice her bedridden husband also bought. “I left my husband at home to buy rice. I am very thankful to the organizers. I hope that there will be more [P20 rice programs] where we can buy [affordable] rice.” Dubbed ‘Benteng Bigas Meron Na’, the P20 rice program is part of the Marcos Jr. administration's bid to make rice more affordable especially to the vulnerable sector, including senior citizens, Persons With Disability (PWD), and pregnant mothers. Jennifer Ibayán, City Agriculturist, said they were prepared to cater to the senior citizens who needed more assistance. “Barangay Salitran 3 is just a sample where a lot of residents wanted to avail the P20 rice. We are expecting to make stops at other barangays in the coming weeks, if we have rice to sell.” Raul Valles, barangay captain of Barangay Salitran III, said there are more than 2,500 residents who are part of the vulnerable sector in their community: of which 2,000 are senior citizens, more than 100 solo parents, and more than 400 PWDs. Valles, over the microphone, announced that they will prioritize their residents and will cater other barangays once they are sure that his kabarangays have bought rice for their families. “There are already more than 2,000 senior citizens in our barangay alone. I think we would not be able to cater to everyone if we will also cater to those from other barangays,” Valles admitted. Barangay Salitran III has prepared for the expected influx of residents who will buy the P20 rice, barangay peacekeepers to keep the lines organized. Barangay Health Workers and emergency medical personnel were also on standby in case senior citizens needed their assistance. “Our lupong tagapamayapa, our medics, BHWs, and tanod are on standby outside to assist in managing the traffic flow around this place.” According to the City Agriculturist Office, Barangay Salitran 3 was the first among the many barangays in the city to host the P20 Rice Program. **(PB/PIA4A)**
