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PAPI GATHERS NATION'S MEDIA LEADERS FOR 29TH NATIONAL PRESS CONGRESS IN BULACAN

BALIWAG, BULACAN — In a powerful show of unity and purpose, the Publishers Association of the Philippines, Inc. (PAPI) is set to host its 29th National Press Congress on December 3–4, 2025, at The Greenery in Baliwag, Bulacan.

The event, held in partnership with the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) Region III, the City Government of Baliwag, and the Provincial Government of Bulacan, promises to be a landmark gathering of media professionals, public servants, and science advocates.

With the theme “Unmasking Deception: The Role of Investigative Media in Exposing Fake News and Corruption,” this year's congress aims to inspire a renewed commitment to truth-telling and ethical journalism. It highlights the vital role of the press in building an informed, resilient society—especially in an age where misinformation spreads rapidly online.

The two-day event will open with messages of solidarity from national and local leaders, followed by a keynote address from a respected investigative journalist. Plenary sessions will explore cutting-edge science initiatives from DOST Region III and tackle the pressing issue of fake news in social media, offering fresh insights and practical tools for local media practitioners.

A festive Governor's Night will cap off the first day, celebrating cultural diversity and media excellence. Attendees will don United Nations-themed attire as they enjoy a night of performances, networking, and inspiring messages from champions of public service, science, and journalism.

Day 2 will spotlight the synergy between media and local governance, featuring a hands-on investigative journalism workshop led by a leading media watchdog. Participants will also engage in a cultural tour of the Historic City of Malolos and visit

innovative DOST project sites, gaining firsthand insight into community-driven development. As a steadfast advocate of press freedom and public service, PAPI continues to empower community newspapers and media leaders across the country. Through its annual congresses and advocacy programs, the organization champions ethical journalism and inclusive storytelling that uplifts communities and strengthens democracy.

Northwestern University (NWU) marked a historic milestone with the inauguration of the NWU-DOST Innovation Hub—the first university-based innovation hub in Region I—during a ceremonial launch on November 20, 2025, at 1:00 PM. The event brought together key science and technology leaders whose presence underscored the hub's transformative impact on the Northern Philippines. Leading the ceremony was DOST Undersecretary Sancho Mabborang, whose attendance signified strong national support for NWU's

expanding role in research, innovation, and technology development. He was joined by several DOST Regional Directors from across Luzon, highlighting the spirit of multi-regional collaboration and the increasing recognition of NWU's pioneering contributions to innovation. The newly opened Innovation Hub features state-of-the-art facilities, including smart boards, 3D printers, prototype fabrication tools, and collaborative ideation spaces. Designed to nurture creativity and accelerate research

translation, the hub aims to support student- and faculty-led innovations, foster stronger academe-industry partnerships, and cultivate start-ups that provide solutions to real-world community challenges. As the first DOST-supported university innovation hub in Region I, this development positions Northwestern University at the forefront of technological advancement and entrepreneurial growth in the Ilocos Region. Officials from the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) convened with members of the local and national media during the 2025 NSTW Press Conference held on November 19 at La Preciosa, Arabella Place, Laoag City. The event provided an overview of what the public can expect at the upcoming National Science, Technology, and Innovation Week (NSTW) celebration set to take place in Ilocos Norte. During the briefing, DOST representatives highlighted the various activities, exhibits, and technology showcases designed to bring cutting-edge innovations closer to communities in the region. They emphasized that the 2025 NSTW continues the agency's commitment to expanding access to science and technology—ensuring that advancements are felt not only in major urban centers but across the entire country. The press conference also served as a platform to discuss the Department's ongoing and future programs, particularly those supporting inclusive development, regional innovation, and stronger collaboration with local government units, academic institutions, and private-sector partners. During the engagement, Publishers Association of the Philippines, Inc. (PAPI) President Rebecca Madeja-Velasquez raised a critical question on why many homegrown technologies showcased in NSTW (Regional Science, Technology, and Innovation Week), NSTW, and Handa Pilipinas fail to take off despite their promise. She emphasized the persistent gap between invention and market readiness, pointing to the need to better understand the role of the Philippine

Higher Education Validation and Innovation Testbed (PHI-TEST) in elevating local technologies to the global market.

In response, Science and Technology Secretary Renato Solidum Jr. explained that the challenge is not unique to the Philippines. “Kadalasan, 10% lang ‘yan sa ating innovation, and that is not only the statistics for the PH but all over the world,” he said, noting that many innovations falter because they lack a clear market perspective during development.

He added that innovators often focus solely on the invention itself and overlook how technologies will be implemented or adopted by users. “When people develop technologies, innovation lang ang kanyang naisip, pero ‘yung paano i-implement at paano gagamitin ng ibang mga tao o paano pa mahikayat ‘yung iba na gamitin ito, ay kailangan i-improve pa ‘yung produkto,” he remarked.

According to Solidum, PHI-TEST aims to address this gap by validating technologies in real-world settings nationwide. “Kaya ‘yung PHI-TEST gagawin ng DOST and universities and inventors, if you want, ‘yung kaniyang technology, pero kailangan ipakalat sa buong Pilipinas at tingnan kung ano pang improvement ang kailangan gawin,” he said. He added that the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) will play a major role in the effort—“at good news, sila daw ang magpopondo.”

DOST Assistant Secretary Napoleon K. Juanillo Jr. further explained: “Unang-una po, may konteksto naman ito. Ang SUCs kasi, ang tawag sa kanila ay experimental stations... So binabalik lang natin sa kanila ‘yung mandate nila to test out all of

these innovations that they themselves have initiated.” He also emphasized that PHI-TEST will not be limited to SUC-developed technologies, but will also include privately funded innovations and those from regional and provincial innovation hubs. He noted that CHED has given its consent, enabling nationwide testing

Farmers, fisherfolks receive over P47 million worth of interventions in Bulacan

CITY OF MALOLOS – More than 700 members of farmers and fisherfolks cooperatives and associations in the province received agricultural and fisheries assistance during the ‘Distribution of Agriculture and Fisheries Interventions’ held yesterday, November 19, 2025, at the Bulacan Sports Complex, Sta. Isabel in this city, as part of the Provincial Government of Bulacan's, through the Provincial Agriculture Office's, continuing efforts to uplift the livelihood of agricultural workers and boost local food production. Qualified beneficiaries, who underwent careful evaluation and validation, were given various farm machineries and fisheries equipment totaling to P10,414,800.00, funded by the Provincial Government of Bulacan, and aimed at supporting their operations and increasing productivity, including 643 pieces of gillnets, 58 units of marine engines, 50 units of cisterns, 27 units of water

across diverse demographics, environments, and conditions. “Kung sakali man ang results n'on ay revision, reformatting, pivoting, then at least meron tayong evidence as to what to do next. At kung successful, then well and good, we can tell the investors ready for investments,” he added.

Through these initiatives, DOST reinforces its goal of empowering Filipinos through science, technology, and innovation. **(Nelson Santos)**

pumps (STW), 12 units of grasscutters, 10 units of hand tractors, six units of portable rice mills, and four solar-powered irrigation systems.

Additional support from partner national agencies was also turned over, wherein the Philippine Center for Postharvest Development and Mechanization (PhilMech) provided four units of 4-wheel drive tractors amounting to P35,779,000.00; while the Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) distributed 20 units of fiberglass reinforced plastic (FRP) boats equipped with 12HP engines worth P1,300,000.

In his message, Governor Daniel R. Fernando reaffirmed the provincial government's commitment to the farming and fishing communities.

Legarda: Women, Peace, Security
Agenda dapat maging gabay
sa bawat sektor ng pamahalaan

Nanawagan si Senadora Loren Legarda para sa ganap na institusyonalisasyon ng Women, Peace, and Security (WPS) Agenda sa lahat ng sektor ng pamahalaan sa kanyang keynote address sa 7th International Forum on Law and Religion in the Philippines na ginanap sa University of the Philippines BGC Campus sa Lungsod ng Taguig noong Nobyembre 21.
