

MILYONG DEBOTO, INAASAHAAN SA NAZARENO 2026 TRASLACION: 'HIJOS-PULIS' HANSA SA SEGURIDAD

Natapos na ng Simbahan ng Quiapo at ng Philippine National Police (PNP) ang mga paghahanda sa seguridad at lohistika para sa selebrasyon ng Nazareno ngayong 2026, kung saan nagpakilala sila ng isang espesyal na yunit ng "hijos-pulis" upang pamahalaan ang milyun-milyong deboto ng inaasahang dadalo sa taunang Traslacion.

Sa isang press briefing, kinumpirma ng mga opisyal mula sa Minor Basilica at National Shrine of Jesus Nazareno na daan-daang pulis na mismong mga deboto ay isasama sa balangkas ng seguridad.

Ang mga opisyal na ito, na tinaguriang "hijos-pulis," ay hindi magsusuo ng tradisional na uniporme ng pulis. Sa halip, magsusuo sila ng espesyal na idinisenyo ng kasuotan na may larawan ng Itim na Nazareno upang itaguyod ang damdaming pagkakaisa sa mga kahalok.

"Ang layunin ay maramdaman ng mga tao ang presensya ng pulisya para sa seguridad at kapayapaan nang hindi nag-iwan ng impresyon ng militarisasyon sa pagdiriwang," sabi ni PLT. Col. June Abrazado, Assistant Chief para sa District Operations Division ng Manila Police District (MPD).

Naghahanda ang mga awtoridad para sa napakalaking dadalo, kung saan tinitayang maaaring lumahok ang hanggang 8.1 milyong deboto sa 5.8-kilometrong prusyon mula sa Quirino Grandstand hanggang sa Quiapo Church.

Upang pamahalaan ang madla, magpapadala ang PNP ng humigit-kumulang 14,000 na tauhan, kasama ang mga karagdagang pwersa mula sa mga kalapit na rehiyon.

Ang "hijos-pulis" ay magsisilbing tulay sa pagitan ng mga tradisional na tagapag-ayos ng simbahan, ang Hijos del Nazareno, at ng mga yunit ng pagpapatupad ng batas.

Kabilang sa kanilang tungkulin ang pagtulong

sa paggalaw ng andas (kariton) at pagpilip sa mga menor de edad o mga mahihinang indibidwal na pumasok sa mga lugar na mataas ang panganib malapit sa mga lubid, kung saan madalas mangyari ang mga pinsala.

Naglabas ang Manila Police District ng mahigpit na listahan ng mga ipinagbabawal na bagay upang matiyak ang kaligtasan ng publiko.

Mahigpit na kokolektahan ng pulisya ang mga payong at basong bote ng tubig upang maiwasan ang sagabal at posibleng pinsala sa masiksikang tao.

Bukod pa rito, ipinagbabawal ng mga awtoridad ang mga matatalim na bagay, baril, at pirotekniks, dahil sa mataas na panganib ng aksidente sa panahon ng 5.8-kilometrong martsa.

Upang mapanatili ang kakayahang makita at seguridad, ipinatutupad din ng mga opisyal ang Anti-Balaclava Ordinance ng Maynila, na nagbabawal sa pagsusuo ng mga sumbrero at hooded jacket na nagtatakip ng mukha.

Higit pa rito, pagbabawalan ang mga nagtitinda sa kalye na magtayo ng mga panindahan sa loob ng itinalagang mga kontroladong lugar upang panatilihing malinis ang ruta ng prusyon para sa parehong mga deboto at mga rumespondeng pang-emergency.

"Kami ay magiging mahigpit ngunit may puso," sabi ni PMaj. Philipp Ines, tagapagsalita ng MPD, na binanggit na habang ipatutupad ang mga ordinansa, ang mga opisyal ay sinanay upang pangasiwaan ang emosyonal at espiritwal na tindi ng kaganapan nang may pasensya.

Inaasaahan na tatagal ng humigit-kumulang 15 oras ang Traslacion, ayon sa iskedyul ng nakaraang taon na kaganapan.

Ang pagpasok sa Simbahan ng Quiapo tuwing pista ay mahigpit na gagabayang pamamagitan ng itinalagang mga ruta sa kahabaan ng Quezon Boulevard, Carriedo, at kalye Villalobos.

HINDI nakaporma ang presidente ng Tricycle Operators and Drivers Association (TODA) matapos hulihin ng isang babaing pulis kamakailan sa Dasmariñas City, Cavite. Ang suspek ay nakilalang si alyas Jerry, na residente ng Dasmariñas City.

Bago ang pagkakaaresto ay dumating ang suspek sa terminal ng tricycle sa Barangay San Nicolas 2, Dasmariñas City nitong Disyembre 30, 2025. Galit umano ang suspek at pinagsisigawan ang mga miyembro ng TODA.

Isang biktima ang sumagot at habang nasa pagkokomprontahan ay

biglang bumunot ng baril ang suspek.

Nagawa naman itong mapigilan ng biktima at nakuha sa sispek ang baril ng suspek.

Nabatid na nataong may isang policewoman mula sa Dasmariñas Component City Police Station malapit

Investments over momentary luxury is Delia's philosophy. Whenever she receives resources or earns an income, she treats it as a seed she can grow into another income-generating opportunity. This discipline, combined with her hard work and competence, has enabled her to own and operate multiple stores in Manila.

Delia took up a Bachelor of Science in Commerce and reached her third year in college. A natural risk-taker, she left her home province in Bicol and braved the fast-paced life of Manila. Her first jobs ranged from saleslady to security guard and later ship loader at a petroleum company.

First try

While being employed, she decided to run a small-scale vending business. From a modest PHP 4,000 capital, she began selling slippers and placed her goods along busy streets and sidewalks. Her beginning reflected the same: far from a wide, comfortable road to success, it was more like a narrow sidewalk that demanded her patience and persistence with every step. She would move from place to place, seeking spots with enough passersby to reach potential customers and maximize her sales.

While she continued selling, she was able to rent her own space to sell her goods and eventually a second space. During that time, she noticed the growing trend in beauty products. So in 2017, using the savings she had accumulated, she opened another space dedicated to cosmetics and personal care items, bringing her

total number of stores to three.

While others might celebrate their early success with small luxuries, Delia chose to keep saving and reinvesting. But as her business continued to grow and require more of her time, she eventually left her job to focus on it entirely. Embracing growth and competition

A year after opening her new space, a peer invited her to attend their CARD center meeting. It paved the way for her to become one of CARD, Inc.'s pioneering clients in Paco, Manila.

As a client, she took a PHP 50,000 loan, her first, which she used to help purchase a pick-up truck to support her business operations. She kept her stores thriving with this. CARD, Inc. later offered her bigger loans. It allowed her to expand her stores, opening one for baby care products, another for ready-to-wear clothing, and one for groceries.

But maintaining and growing these businesses was never easy. With the rise of online shopping and the emergence of competitors, her ready-to-wear store, baby care products, and beauty goods were heavily affected. Still, she embraced the competition. She searched for low-cost suppliers of her items to stay competitive and focused on high-quality yet affordable goods. And when competitors copied her products, she adjusted her prices. She

shifted prices and product selections strategically to stay competitive.

She believes that even if her profit decreases, what matters is that she keeps her capital moving and continues earning each day. "Para kahit malit ang tubo ko, lumalaban ako. Kasi sabi ko, kung ako'y magpapatalo o susuko, talunan ako." (Even if my profit is small, I keep fighting because I tell myself, if I let others beat me or if I give up, then I'm a loser.) For her, such challenges show her how much farther she can go. Keeping forward

It goes like this every time:

her competitiveness and reinvestment ensure that, whenever she earns and saves, she is also building something. At present, Delia operates six rental apartments totaling eight residential units and has six commercial spaces for her stores with six salesladies assisting her.

This discipline and hard

work have not only nurtured her business growth but also enabled her to purchase land properties in her hometown in Bicol and a house in Cavite. As she continues to grow her businesses, she now aims to make further property investments and save more.

Ask her about the secret to her success, and Delia will simply say: "Keep your personal wants out of your business money." She advises focusing on growing your funds and repaying your loan provider's trust by repaying responsibly. It is indeed a principle she has lived by from the very beginning.

From a few pairs of slippers on the sidewalk to the multi-business venture she runs today, Delia has proved that even when life gives you only a narrow sidewalk to run on, discipline and persistence can still take you far. (Jireh Pearl Casionan, Junior Writer)

As VIRES drops 900-MW fossil gas project in Batangas, CABATANG, Batangas communities win against LNG anew

Batangas, Philippines

— The Clean and Healthy Air for All Batangueños (CABATANG), Philippine Movement for Climate Justice (PMcj), and the people of Batangas celebrate another victory before the year's end. On Dec. 23, 2025, VIRES Energy Corporation (VIRES) announced the suspension of the 900-megawatt (MW) liquefied natural gas (LNG) power project in Batangas due to grid and supply challenges. It can be recalled that A Brown Company, Inc. released its decision to withdraw the fossil gas regasification unit last August 2024.

CABATANG and PMcj have long been fighting against the fossil gas project. In Sept. 2023, PMcj and CABATANG held a climate emergency and community consultation in Brgy. Simlong, Batangas City. The forum was conducted to strengthen the position of the affected communities against this fossil fuel project.

The consultation concluded with an action directed against all fossil gas projects in the pipeline, which include the VIRES gas plant.

"This is the best gift that we received this Christmas, and we celebrate this step away from dirty energy, which follows years of collective action by

communities in Batangas and across the country," said Restituto Bobadilla, a resident of Brgy. Simlong, and president of CABATANG, a community-led movement on climate justice and the right to health.

"We have been waiting for VIRES to pull its plug against gas. We stepped up the pressure against the plant after it suspended the construction of its import terminal last August 2023. We know that this is coming," Bobadilla continued.

The withdrawal protects the ecologically critical Verde Island Passage and addresses public health concerns, as Batangas City Health Office reported that the most common illnesses in the City were respiratory infection (10,650 cases) and hypertension (10,315 cases). The communities claim this is due to the high concentration of methane, which communities link to the area's heavy concentration of fossil gas facilities.

PMcj and CABATANG urge all fossil gas developers to follow this example by abandoning LNG projects and redirecting investments toward clean, renewable, and community-sustaining initiatives that protect both the people and the environment.

Cavite PPO Reiterates Zero Tolerance on Indiscriminate Firing Under One-Strike Policy

in accordance with existing laws and PNP regulations. This firm approach reflects the PNP's dedication to discipline, accountability, and professionalism within its ranks.

In support of this policy, the Cavite Police Provincial Office reaffirmed its full commitment to strict and consistent implementation. The Acting Provincial Director, PCOL ARIEL R RED, emphasized that maintaining peace and order requires both firm

leadership and personal accountability among police personnel.

"The Cavite PNP will not tolerate any form of indiscriminate firing. Our police officers are expected to be models of discipline and responsibility at all times. Any violation of this policy will be met with swift and appropriate action. The safety of the public will always come first," the Acting Provincial Director said. The Cavite PNP further reminds the public that

celebrations should be moments of joy, not sources of danger. Every careless gunshot place innocent life at risk and erodes public trust. Through the strict enforcement of the One-Strike Policy and continuous community engagement, the Cavite PNP aims to ensure a safe, peaceful, and orderly province.

With this policy in full force, the Philippine National Police and the Cavite PPO call on everyone to promote a culture of safety and responsibility, reinforcing the shared duty of protecting lives and upholding the rule of law.

RD Lucas Leads Destruction of Confiscated Illegal Firecrackers in CALABARZON

Camp BGen Vicente P. Lim, CALABARZON —

Police Regional Office CALABARZON Regional Director, Police Brigadier General Paul Kenneth T. Lucas, led a media presentation and the destruction of confiscated illegal firecrackers, highlighting the intensified efforts and collaboration of various police operating units in the region.

During the press briefing, PBGen Lucas presented updates on the ongoing campaign against the sale, manufacture, and distribution of illegal firecrackers and other pyrotechnic devices. He reported that from December 16 to the present, PRO CALABARZON conducted a total of 238 police operations, resulting in the arrest of 12 suspects and the confiscation of assorted illegal firecrackers valued at ₱4,803,398.00.

PBGen Lucas also shared data on firecracker-related incidents, noting that five individuals are currently undergoing medical treatment due to injuries caused by firecrackers and other pyrotechnic devices. Additionally, one incident involving the illegal discharge of a firearm was recorded. The suspect is now in custody and facing charges for violation Republic Act No. 10591, or the Comprehensive Firearms and Ammunition Regulation Act.

Following the press briefing, members of the media witnessed the destruction of confiscated illegal firecrackers at the PRO CALABARZON covered court. The destroyed items included piccolo, five-star, whistle bombs, kwitis, sawa, assorted pyrotechnics, goodbye contractor, and improvised cannons or

"boga," all confiscated by various Provincial Police Offices across the region. Additionally, the Regional Explosive and Canine Unit 4A safely disposed of confiscated illegal firecracker through controlled detonation at the PRO 4A Grandstand.

PBGen Lucas expressed his gratitude to police operatives and the community for their cooperation in the successful operations against illegal

firecrackers. He also reiterated his call for public support in ensuring a safe and orderly celebration.

"I urge the public to refrain from patronizing illegal firecrackers and pyrotechnics. Let us use fireworks only in designated areas and report any information that can help stop the illegal trade of these dangerous items," PBGen Lucas said. (RPIO)

DILG Pushes Full Digital Shift in Barangays Through Nationwide LGUSS-BIMS Adoption

In a major push to accelerate digital transformation at the grassroots level, the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) has mandated the nationwide adoption of the Local Government Unit Support System – Barangay Information Management System (LGUSS-BIMS).

Beyond administrative functions, the system also supports evidence-based governance by enabling barangays to utilize system-generated data for development planning, budget preparation, peace and order programs, and disaster risk reduction initiatives.

As of the latest DILG report, 9,774 out of 42,011 barangays, or 23 percent, are actively using the system, while 14,008 barangays, or 33 percent, have already undergone orientation on the use of BIMS.

The DILG assured the public that data privacy and security remain a top priority. Access to barangay websites under the system is limited and strictly complies with the Data Privacy Act, particularly given the sensitive nature of the information being handled.

With the implementation guidelines now in place, the DILG expects increased adoption of LGUSS-BIMS nationwide, marking a significant step toward more transparent, efficient, and data-driven barangay administration across the country. (DILG)

During the meeting, the DOST CALABARZON team presented the SARAI systems and

technologies, highlighting how these tools can support the city in implementing climate-smart and data-driven agricultural practices. The Lucena City officials expressed interest in using CL-SEAMS to manage information on farmlots and monitor crop beneficiaries.

They also recognized the value of SPIDTECH for pest management, noting how both tools can enhance agricultural productivity and resilience.

The potential sites for the installation of Automated Weather Stations (AWS) were also discussed and later visited by the team to assess suitability. Both parties expressed commitment to formalizing the partnership through a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA), which is currently undergoing initial approvals at the LGU, further strengthening the city's capacity for climate-smart, technology-enabled agriculture.

SSS marks 2025 with pension reform and program upgrades; Looks forward to 2026

Quezon City, Philippines

The Social Security System (SSS) closes 2025 with implementation of the Emergency Loan Program (ELP) capping off achievements that strengthened social protection for millions of Filipinos highlighted by successful implementation of the Pension Reform Program, loan program enhancements, expanded membership coverage, and significant strides in digital transformation.

SSS President and CEO Robert Joseph Montes De Claro said, "This year was a turning point for SSS. From the directive of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. and with guidance from former Finance Secretary Ralph G. Recto and current Finance Secretary Frederick D. Go, we delivered on our promise to provide better benefits and programs, faster services, and wider coverage for our members. These milestones reflect our unwavering commitment to social security protection for all Filipino workers and their beneficiaries."

Key Achievements in 2025

1. 2025 SSS Pension Reform Program featuring annual pension increases for all 3.8 million pensioners every September from 2025 to 2027 – 10% increase for retirement and disability pensioners and 5% increase for survivor pensioners;

2. Salary Loan Program enhanced with reduced interest rate to 8% (from 10%) for more than 600,000 member-borrowers;

3. Calamity Loan Program enhanced with reduced interest rate to 7% (from 10%) and with faster activation for about 630,000 member-borrowers;

4. Pension Loan Program for SSS Retiree and Surviving Spouse Pensioners implemented featuring loanable amount up to P300,000 for retiree pensioners and P150,000 for survivor pensioners for more than 30,000 pensioner-borrowers;

5. Issued MySSS Card with 2-in-1 functionality, a valid SSS ID and automatic enrollment as a disbursement account with almost 10,000 cards received already by SSS members and almost 100,000 disbursement accounts enrolled;

6. Emergency Loan Program implemented with low interest rate of 7% and 6-month moratorium on loan repayment for more than 26,000 member-borrowers;

7. Contribution Subsidy Provider Program rolled out led by Double Dragon Corporation paying P18.2-M to fully subsidize SSS contributions for 2,000 informal sector self-employed workers in Iloilo City and Roxas City for 12 months – local government units, religious groups, and others also registering as subsidy providers;

8. Accredited 25 Cooperatives as Coverage and Collection Partner to facilitate SSS registration, contributions collection, benefit and loan applications for more than 200,000 members of cooperatives;

9. Partnered with various government entities for social security coverage of Job Order/ Contract of Service (JO/COS) workers who are not covered by GSIS – more than 500,000 JOS registered and more than 200,000 JOS regularly paying SSS contributions; and

10. Implemented Run After Contribution Evaders (RACE) Programs nationwide to exact compliance from delinquent employers.

Looking forward to 2026 "We also look forward to 2026 where we continue implementation of existing programs, develop new ones, strengthen member servicing, and expand footprint of SSS nationwide and abroad," De Claro added.

The year 2026 brings with it Tranche 2 (of 3) of the Pension Reform Program for another round of pension increase for all pensioners in September. Also available for 2026 is the Emergency Loan Program up to 9 December 2026 or until the calamity declaration is lifted. Micro loan program

From 17 December 2025 approval by the Social Security Commission of the guidelines for micro loan program, we expect implementation of this loan program early in 2026.

"With guidance from Finance Secretary Frederick D. Go, SSS is looking to implement this micro loan program through partner institutions very soon as a safer and affordable option

to borrow cash for short-term needs with 15- to 90-day tenor and interest rate of 8% per annum or 0.67% per month," De Claro said.

Expanding footprint in the Philippines and overseas Toward ensuring that no Filipino worker is left behind, we shall pursue opening of local and overseas branches in 2026. SSS is looking to establish Foreign Representative Offices in Madrid, San Francisco, and Macau while looking to establish 10 new branches locally.

Massive recruitment of personnel

For 2026, SSS is looking to hire about 1,800 personnel toward completely providing manpower resources in the frontlines – be it physically or virtually through electronic means. This recruitment effort aims to address gaps in service delivery and handling of requests for assistance and various complaints.

Other initiatives for 2026

Other programs being explored include potential partnership with the National Commission of Senior Citizens (NCSC) through Chairperson Ma. Merceditas N. Gutierrez for the Annual Confirmation of Pensioners (ACOP) Program, special programs for gig economy workers, and contribution subsidy program for 2,000 OFWs through P28.8-M commitment from Double Dragon Corporation.

"Looking back at 2025 and forward to 2026, we remain committed to our goal of making SSS relevant in the life of every Filipino at every point in their lives by providing quality social protection, continuous enhancement of member servicing platforms, and espousing the value of saving for the future," De Claro emphasized.

DOE paves the way for 200 power projects with over 1GW installed

As part of the Department of Energy's (DOE) ongoing monitoring of the timely completion of 200 power generation projects, Stage 1 of the Terra Solar Project is advancing key grid interconnection milestones with the National Grid Corporation of the Philippines (NGCP), following the energization and cut-in of the Terra Solar 500-kilovolt (kV) substation on 21 December 2025 along the Nagsaag-San Jose 500 kV Line 2. Stage 1 represents 364 megawatts (MW) of the project's planned 2,500 MW solar capacity with battery energy storage systems (BESS), operated by Terra Solar Philippines, Inc.

Commercial operation of Stage 1 is expected in the first quarter of 2026.

President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr., in his 4th State of the Nation Address (SONA), directed the DOE to accelerate the construction of 200 power generation projects over the next three years to strengthen the country's energy security. In line with this directive, the DOE continues to track project progress and coordinate closely with stakeholders to ensure that committed capacity is delivered on schedule and in a manner consistent with safety and grid reliability requirements.

As of November 2025, about 956 MW of new power generation capacity have been added to the Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao grids, complemented by 160 MW of new energy storage capacity located in Luzon and Visayas. These additions form part of the DOE's broader efforts to ensure sufficient and reliable power supply in support of the country's growing economy and increasing electricity demand.

The 956 MW of new generation capacity comes from fourteen (14) power plants: twelve (12) facilities using renewable energy (RE) technologies, one (1) oil-based power plant, and one (1) natural gas-fired power plant, most of which entered commissioning in the second half of 2025. Collectively, these projects help strengthen the grid's ability to meet peak demand, reduce the risk of supply shortfalls, and improve operational flexibility in managing baseload requirements and variable demand.

To help ensure that committed capacity is delivered as scheduled, the DOE is implementing active project monitoring across generation and energy storage developments. This includes close coordination with project

proponents and NGCP on grid interconnection readiness, regular tracking of construction and commissioning milestones, and early identification of bottlenecks that may affect timelines, such as permitting constraints, right-of-way issues, equipment delivery risks, and site-level implementation challenges. Through these efforts, the DOE aims to strengthen accountability, address issues before they escalate into delays, and ensure that new capacity additions can reliably support the grid when they are needed most.

PBBM backing pushes TESDA's success and key reforms in 2025

The Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) capped 2025 with major policy reforms, international recognition, and expanded access to skills training, reaffirming its commitment to deliver quality training that leads to decent jobs.

With strong backing from President Ferdinand "Bongbong" Marcos Jr., a consistent advocate of technical vocational education and training (TVET), TESDA strengthened the role of skills development as a pillar of the country's education and workforce agenda.

"Napatunayan na nating mabisa ang tech-voc. Kaya, unti-until nang pinapasok sa senior high ang TVET ng TESDA. Diretsa pagkagraduate, puwe de na kaagad na maghanapbhay kung gugustuhin, dahil para na rin siyang nakapag-aral sa TESDA at nakakuha ng NC II or NC III," the President said during his State-of-the-Nation Address in July.

The Philippines achieved historic success in global skills competitions in 2025. As the host of WorldSkills ASEAN Manila 2025, the country delivered its best performance to date, winning 30 medals. The Philippine team also earned four medals at WorldSkills Asia 2025 in Taiwan, underscoring the world-class competence of Filipino skilled workers.

TESDA likewise intensified alignment with international standards. Secretary Kiko Benitez represented the Philippines at the Education World Forum 2025, where he shared strategies on aligning TVET with evolving labor markets and digital transformation.

At the national level, TESDA strengthened collaboration with the Department of Education (DepEd) and the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) to ensure smoother transitions from education to employment.

Key initiatives in 2025 included the integration of TechPro programs into basic

education, free assessment for senior high school tech-voc graduates, and the creation of a Tripartite Council with CHED and the Professional Regulation Commission to harmonize standards across learning pathways.

TESDA also advanced lifelong learning through the expansion of micro-credentials, with 375 registered courses now offered by 190 training providers nationwide. Major policy milestones included the rollout of the Early Childhood Care and Development Services NC III following the passage of the ECCD Law. The implementation of the Enterprise-Based Education and Training (EBET) was also strengthened after the signing of its Implementing Rules and Regulations, with latest data showing 240 enterprises implementing 410 EBET programs nationwide.

To support innovation and regional development, TESDA broke ground on Regional TVET Innovation Centers in Tuguegarao City, Tacloban City, and General Santos City. Meanwhile, it can also be remembered that President Marcos visited TESDA headquarters on October 10, highlighting the administration's continued priority for skills development. The President toured the facilities of TESDA Regional Training Center – National Capital Region (RTC-NCR), and the National Training Center for Women (NTCW), both located within the TESDA Complex in Taguig City.

"These gains reflect the collective efforts of TESDAns, industry partners, and stakeholders nationwide. By working together and breaking silos, we are building a stronger, more inclusive skills ecosystem for Filipinos," TESDA Secretary Kiko Benitez said.

As TESDA moves into 2026, the agency aims to build on the momentum of 2025 to further expand access to quality, industry-aligned skills training. (TESDA)

DSWD IV-A builds stronger pathways for 4Ps families through multi-sector partnerships

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna

— The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) Field Office IV-A continues to reinforce its commitment to empowering Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) households by widening access to education, employment, and healthcare services through strategic partnerships across the CALABARZON region.

On December 15, 2025, the regional office entered into new partnership agreements with five institutions from the education, training, and health sectors—National University (NU) Dasmariñas, University of Batangas, Dualtech Training Center Foundation, Inc., Technovative Training Center, Inc., and San Antonio Medical Center of Lipa, Inc.

Assistant Regional Director Mylah Gatchalian said the partnerships are aligned with the Department's thrust to equip 4Ps beneficiaries with the necessary skills, knowledge, and health support needed to achieve self-reliance as they prepare for transition or graduation from the program.

"These collaborations strengthen our capacity to deliver more responsive and comprehensive services, particularly in education, skills development, and health, which are critical to improving the long-term outcomes of 4Ps households," Gatchalian noted.

Through the partnership, NU Dasmariñas and the University of Batangas will extend scholarship opportunities, competency-building initiatives, and community-based programs that aim to enhance the academic performance and employability of 4Ps college students.

Meanwhile, Dualtech Training Center Foundation, Inc. and Technovative Training Center, Inc. will provide enterprise-based training programs designed to link technical education with actual industry requirements, offering beneficiaries pathways toward certification and employment through partner companies.

Dualtech Training Center President Engr. Jerry Web Muhi emphasized the broader impact of the collaboration, stating that the initiative seeks to develop learners who can contribute meaningfully to their communities and to national development.

To further support the well-being of 4Ps families, San Antonio Medical Center of Lipa, Inc. will deliver medical assistance and preventive

healthcare services, helping reduce health-related expenses that often hinder economic progress.

Currently, DSWD Field Office IV-A maintains active partnerships with 49 external stakeholders from civil society organizations, private institutions, and higher education sectors in the region.

The Department underscored that sustained collaboration with various sectors remains essential in advancing inclusive development, ensuring that 4Ps families are not only assisted but are fully equipped to build healthier, more productive, and self-sustaining lives. (CCM/PIA4A)

PBBM shields Filipino families with sustained low inflation and strong economy in 2025

President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr.'s administration has protected the poorest Filipino families by keeping inflation under control and maintaining a strong economic growth path in 2025.

Inflation, or the rate at which prices of basic goods and services rise as measured by the Consumer Price Index (CPI), was cut by more than half from 3.4% in 2024 to just 1.6% from January to November 2025. This continues a downward trend since President Marcos, Jr. assumed office, from 5.8% in 2022 and 6.0% in 2023.

The sustained slowdown reflects the Marcos, Jr. administration's decisive and coordinated actions to stabilize prices, secure food supply, and protect household purchasing power particularly for rice, which accounts for the largest share of spending of low-income families.

"To put this in perspective, a 6% inflation rate means that your PHP 100 can buy only about PHP 94 worth of goods and services. But with inflation down to just 1.6% in 2025, that same PHP 100 can now buy about PHP 98.4 worth of goods and services," Executive Secretary Ralph G. Recto explained.

"Kaya napakahalaga nito para sa bawat pamilyang Pilipino, lalo na ang mga mahihirap. Kapag mababa ang inflation, napapanatili natin na abot-kaya ang mga pangunahing bilin, lalo na ang pagkain," he added.

Rice prices continue to improve, with the Department of Agriculture (DA), upon President Marcos, Jr.'s directive, delivering on its commitment to bring rice

LAUREL, Batangas (PIA)

— In its continued effort to inspire local government-led initiatives, particularly among barangays to keep waterways and water bodies clean and trash-free, the Department of Environment and Natural Resources—Environmental Management Bureau (DENR-EMB) Region IV-A gave honors for cleanup efforts during the Gawad Taga-Ilog (GTI) Awarding Ceremony on December 19.

According to DENR-EMB Regional Director Robert Angelo Metin, the program aims to enhance water quality and maintain the cleanliness of rivers in the Province of Cavite, demonstrating that the Gawad Taga-Ilog

(GTI) Program, which was successfully implemented in the National Capital Region, can also be adopted by nearby regions as part of collective efforts to protect the environment.

"This is anchored on the Clean Water Act and the Supreme Court Mandamus that calls for the cleaning and rehabilitation of Manila Bay. Here in the Province of Cavite, we can see a portion of Manila Bay, which is why the Gawad Taga-Ilog Program was initially launched here," Director Metin said. Through the dedication of barangay officials and residents, these initiatives serve as inspiring models of sustainable environmental governance and shared responsibility for the preservation of natural resources for present and future generations.

Barangay Daine 1 in Indang, Cavite, led by Barangay Chairperson Arnold Pegollo, was hailed as the winner in the Upland Category, with the Gawad Taga-Ilog (GTI) Award serving as a testament to the community's collective efforts in promoting cleaner waterways and a sustainable environment.

"There were so many preparations from paperwork, weekly clean-up activities, and the maintenance of the river and the materials recovery facility (MRF), to Hapag ni PBBM, our community garden, vertical garden, and composting facility because everything required hard work and constant maintenance to ensure that all of these is in good condition for the Gawad Taga-Ilog," the chairperson explained.

Pegollo added that even before receiving recognition from the DENR-EMB, the barangay had already been working with partner

(IMF) project expansion at 5.1% for 2025.

This outperforms the 1.6% average growth projection of advanced economies this year, including the United States (2.0%), Japan (1.1%), and the Euro area (1.2%), according to the IMF.

The Philippines' projected expansion is also higher compared to the 4.2% average growth for ASEAN-5 in 2025. In fact, it is second best among its peers, following Vietnam at 6.5% and higher than Indonesia at 4.9%, Malaysia at 4.5%, Singapore at 2.2%, and Thailand at 2%.

By 2026, the IMF projects that the Philippines will be the fastest-growing economy in ASEAN, tied with Vietnam at a 5.6% growth rate. (PCO)

HSAC in 2025: Strengthening housing justice through institutional reforms

In 2025, the Human Settlements Adjudication Commission (HSAC) made significant progress in strengthening housing justice by introducing key institutional reforms, improving its performance systems, and expanding support for communities seeking fair and timely resolution of housing and real estate disputes. The year's accomplishments showed how the Commission is continuously building a more accessible and dependable adjudicatory body for the public.

The issuance of the 2025 Revised Rules of Procedure marked HSAC's most significant development this year. The updated rules simplify case processes, provide clearer guidance to litigants, and improve the overall pace of adjudication. The new rules emphasize that strengthening HSAC's procedural framework is central to ensuring that people can resolve their housing issues with confidence and fairness.

Paired with its mission of

resolving housing disputes is the Commission's goal of operational excellence through continual enhancement of internal performance and financial systems. HSAC earned an 'unmodified opinion' from the Commission on Audit for its 2024 financial statements, signifying trustworthy and reliable financial management. The Department of Budget and Management likewise gave the Commission a 'Very Satisfactory Rating' for its

overall performance. HSAC's efforts toward strengthening its systems were further recognized through national awards. The Commission received its fourth 'Outstanding Accounting Office Award' for excellence in financial reporting. It also attained a 'Silver Award' in the Anti-Red Tape Authority Report Card Survey 2.0 for its service quality and remarkable compliance with public service standards.

To reach a broader range of stakeholders, the Commission expanded its institutional linkages. Through agreements with the Local Government Unit of Bacoor City and the New Era University College of Law, HSAC strengthened collaboration with local governments and train future practitioners in dispute resolution. HSAC also began reaching out to Overseas Filipino Workers, starting in Riyadh, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. Through the Serbisyo Caravan of the Department of Migrant Workers, HSAC provided legal information about property ownership and housing disputes that OFWs experience.

These citations and accomplishments reflect the institution's sustained efforts to advance good governance and strengthen the adjudicatory process for its stakeholders. As HSAC moves forward, it remains committed to sustaining these reforms and ensuring that every Filipino has access to a fair, efficient, and transparent resolution of housing-related disputes. Pilipinas may lakas pa rin sa Olympics sa kampanya ng SEA Games 2025

Maaaring nagtapos ang Pilipinas sa ikaanum na pwesto sa kabuuan sa ika-33 na Southeast Asian Games, ngunit ang kanilang pagganap sa mga disciplina ng Olympics ay nagkuwento ng mas maliwanag na kuwento, na namumukod-tangi kumpara sa karamihan ng mga karatig-

bansa at kahit na nilampasan ang host na Thailand sa porsyento sa mga larong isinasagawa sa pandoigdigang entablaido.

Habang tinutukoy ng mga kritiko ang kabuuang bilang ng medalya bilang sukatang ng kabiguan, ang mas malalim na pagtingin ay nagpapakita ng ibang larawan.

Pitumpu porsyento ng 50 gintong medalya ng Team Philippines ay nagsimula sa mga larong Olimpyko, na nagtutugma sa Singapore para sa pinakamataas na porsyento sa pagitan ng 11 bansang nakipagkumpetensya, ayon sa vnewspres.net, isang Vietnamese na online na pahayagan.

Natapos ang Singapore sa panglimang pwesto sa kabuuan na may 52 gintong medalya, 61 pilak, at 87 tanso, kabilang ang 20 sa aquatics—isang pangunahing bahagi ng Olympics.

Samantala, namayagpag ang Pilipinas sa iba't ibang disciplina, mula sa atletiks (5 ginto) at paglangoy (3) hanggang sa gimnasya (3), triathlon (3), at modern pentathlon (3).

Ang boksing, na tradisionyal na Pinagtugpuyang ng mga Pilipino, ay napatunayang kontroversyal. Si Eumir Marcial ang naghatiid ng tanging ginto para sa bansa, habang winasak ng Thailand ang 14 sa 17 kategorya.



Ang Philippine Olympic Committee (POC) ay tinapos ang 2025 nang matagumpay at ngayon 2026 ay mas malalaking ambisyon.

Sinabi ng pangulo ng POC na si Abraham "Bambol" Tolentino na nagbigay ng higit pa sa sapat na dahilan para maging positibo ang mga atletang Pilipino, na tinutukoy ang isang taon na hindi lamang puno ng medalya, kundi pati na rin ng mga panalo sa mga isport na talagang mahalaga sa pandoigdigang entablaido. "Magkakaroon pa ng mas maraming kompetisyon sa ibang bansa at mas marami pang makasaysayang tagumpay para sa Team Philippines ngayong 2026," sabi ni Tolentino, na bagong tapos sa isang kampanya na napakita ng lumalaking lakas ng bansa sa mga disciplina ng Olympics. Ipinagmamalaki ni Tolentino ang ipinakita ng Team Philippines sa katatapos lamang na ika-33

na Southeast Asian Games sa Thailand.

Habang natapos ng bansa sa ika-anim na puwesto sa kabuuan na may 50 gintong medalya, binigyang-din niya na ang mga medalya ay kalakhan mula sa mga atletikang Olimpiko, isang palatandaan, ayon sa kanya, ng pangmatagalang pandoigdigang kakayahan sa kompetisyon.

"Ilan iyon sa pinakamahalaga, ang gintong medalya mula sa mga isport sa Olympics," sabi ni Tolentino.

Ayon sa isang pagsusuri ng Philippine Sports Commission (PSC), na nagbabaggit sa Vietnamese outlet na vnewspres.net, ipinakita na ang Pilipinas ay katumbas ng Singapore sa pinakamataas na porsyento ng gintong medalya na napanalunan sa mga Olimpikong sports sa pagitan ng 11 bansang kalahok. Nakaagaw din ng gintong medalya ang mga Pilipinong atleta sa pambabaeng football, pantalaking baseball, tennis sa pamamagitan ni Alex Eala, beach volleyball, basketball (dalawa), judo (dalawa), skateboarding (dalawa), softball (dalawa), taekwondo (dalawa), rowing, sailing, short-track speed skating, weightlifting, at wrestling. "At doon nakapaloob ang maraming puntos ng layunin ng Olimpiko," sabi ni Tolentino.

Sa likod ng momentum, inirango ni Tolentino ang pinahusay na koordinasyon sa mga opisina ng pamahalaan sa larangan ng palakasan.

"Ngayon, nagtutulungan kami kasama ang PSC Philippine Sports Commission sa isang maayos na paraan," sabi niya.

Anya niya, ang pataas na takbo ay hihiigpit na sa lumalampas pa sa SEA Games.

"Magiging hamon ito sa pagkakataong ito dahil makikilahok tayo sa tatlong Asian multi-sports events at mayroon din tayong

Milano Winter Games at saka ang Youth Olympic Games," sabi niya. "Ang ating mga atleta at pambansang samahang pampalakasan ay patuloy na umuunlad bawat taon at ako'y labis na natutuwa na makita iyon."

Kasama rin sa iskedyul ang Dakar Youth Olympic Games mula Oktubre 31 hanggang Nobyembre 13, ang unang Olympic Games na gaganapin sa Africa, at ang Asian Indoor and Martial Arts Games sa Riyadh

Para kay Tolentino, malinaw at matatag ang misyon. "Lahat para sa Pilipinong atleta, lahat para sa palakasan ng Pilipinas," sabi niya.

Unang numero 5 sa pag retiro sa ROS ni Gabi nasa proseso na

Sinabi ng tanyag na coach agad pagkatapos ng huling laro ng Quarterfinals na manlalaro sa PBA na plano ng koponan na i-retire ang jersey.

"Talagang iminungkahi namin na i-retiro ang kanyang numero bilang tanda ng pagkilala at paggalang sa nagawa niya, kaya sa tingin ko ay magiging handang gawin iyon ng pamunuan," sabi ni Guiao.

Kung sakali, ang numero 5 ni Norwood ang magiging unang jersey na i-retire ng koponan sa kasaysayan nitu mula nang bilhin ang Shell franchise noong 2006.

Ang nagpapa-espesyal sa karera ni Norwood, gayunpaman, ay ang katotohanang hindi siya umalis sa Welcoat franchise mula pa noong Unang Araw.

"Sa palagay ko dapat pa rin nating bigyan ng pagkilala ang ginawa niya para sa franchise sa huling 17 taon. Siya ang sagisag ng katapatan, disente, at pagiging tapat sa pagiging isang propesyonal. Madalas kong sabihin na wala kung mapintipas sa kanya kahit sa anong bagay," dagdag pa ni Guiao.

Ipinahayag ni Norwood sa simula pa lang ng PBA Philippine Cup na magreretiro siya sa pagtatapos ng kumpetisyon.

Nagkaroong ng malaking pagkakataon ang Elasto Painters na bigyan si Norwood ng malalim na laro sa playoff sa kanyang huling laban bilang manlalaro nang makuhang nila ang bentaha na kailangang manalo ng dalawang beses sa quarterfinals.

Gayunpaman, nalampasan ng Meralco Bolts ang mga balakid at pinigilan ang Elasto Painters na magkaroon ng kanilang ikalimang sunod-sunod na semifinal appearance, na nagpadala kay Norwood sa pagreretiro sa isang mapait na pagtatapos sa pamagitan ng 98-89 panalo sa Game 2 sa Smart Araneta Coliseum.

Nakalista na bilang isang playing assistant coach, dagdag ni Guiao na kasalukuyan nilang pinag-aaralan ang posibilidad na mapanatili si Norwood sa coaching staff, ngunit sa pagkakatao ngito sa full-time na kapasidad.
