Itinatampok ng pagkilala sa mga nabanggit na awardees ang pangunahing layunin ng SALUDO Hotline—upang palakasin ang mahusay na gawain ng pulisya at pukawin ang kahusayan sa serbisyo.

Ang mga mensahe ng suporta ay inihatid din ng mga pangunahing stakeholder mula sa Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), local government units, at community organizations, na nagpapahiwatig ng malawak na suporta para sa inisyatiba. Ang pormal na paglulunsad ng SALUDO Hotline sa Cavite ay sumasalin sa kahandaan ng lalawigan na ipatupad ang proyekto sa malapit na koordinasyon sa mga lokal na pinuno at mga katuwang sa komunidad. Ito ay nagmamarka ng isang makabuluhanang hakbang sa pagpapalakas ng ugnayan ng pulisya-komunidad at pagtataguyod ng kultura ng pagpapahalaga at kahusayan sa serbisyo publiko.

Legarda itinutulak ang mas makakalikasan at matibay na plano sa pag-unlad sa gitna ng hamon sa ekonomiya

Matapos ang nauna niyang pahayag hinggil sa patuloy na hamon sa kalagayang piskal ng bansa, muling iginiit ni Senadora Loren Legarda sa kanyang talumpati sa Senado ngayong araw, ang panawagan para sa mas luntian at matatag na estratehiya sa paglago, kasabay ng babala na humihina ang makina ng ekonomiya matapos iulat ng Development Budget Coordination Committee (DBCC) na 3 porsyento lamang ang paglago ng gross domestic product (GDP) sa ika-apat na quarter at 63.2 porsyento ang debt-to-GDP ratio—pinakamataas sa loob ng dalawang dekada. "The figures speak loudly: three percent growth and a debt ratio breaching the 60 percent threshold. This is a flashing yellow light on our national dashboard," ani Legarda, na binigyang-diin na pumalya na ang lumang modelo ng paglago na nakasandal sa imprastruktura. Itinuro niya na sa kabila ng mga proyektong naantala at bumabang kalidad, patuloy pa rin ang pangungutang na naglilihis ng kita mula sa kalusugan, edukasyon, at serbisyong panlipunan. "Sa halip na ayusin ang mga prayoridad at tapalan ang mga tagas sa paggastos, patuloy pa rin tayong nagdadagdag sa ating utang," dagdag pa niya. Binigyang-diin ni Legarda na mayroon nang batayang batas ang Pilipinas para sa mas matatag na ekonomiya, kabilang ang Ecological Solid Waste Management Act, Clean Air Act, Clean Water

Act, Climate Change Act, at ang People's Survival Fund. Binanggit niya na ang hindi wastong pamamahala ng basura ay nagdudulot ng P45–51 bilyon na lugi kada taon, habang ang maling pagtatapon sa paligid ng Manila Bay ay nagreresulta ng P4 bilyon na pagkawala sa turismo, pangisdaan, at kalusugan ng publiko. "Environmental and climate-responsive governance is a fiscal imperative," diin ni Legarda. Ipinunto niya ang Philippine Ecosystem and Natural Capital Accounting System (PENCAS) law na nagsisiguro na ang mga kagubatan, bahura, at yamang tubig ay nabibigyang-halaga sa pagpapalano ng ekonomiya. Binanggit din niya ang ecosystem-based approaches sa flood control, gaya ng pagpapanumbalik ng mga ilog, wetlands, at bakawan upang mabawasan ang korapsyon sa procurement at pangmatagalang gastos. Bukod sa ekosistema, nanawagan si Legarda ng mas matibay na pamumuhunan sa human capital, binanggit ang Universal Access to Quality Tertiary Education Act, UniFAST Act, at ARAL Program Act bilang kritikal sa pagbuo ng kompetitibong lakas-paggawa. "Unless we invest in human growth, our progress will remain uneven and fragile," aniya. Binigyang-diin ni Legarda na dapat sabay na umuusad ang reporma sa edukasyon at pagpapalano sa ekonomiya, gaya ng binanggit sa ulat ng EDCOM II. Tinukoy din niya ang Philippine Innovation Act, Creative Industries Development Act, at Green Jobs Act bilang mahahalagang kasangkapan upang lumipat sa kaalaman-based at sustenableng ekonomiya. "By offering fiscal incentives and tax deductions to enterprises that generate 'green jobs'—employment that restores or preserves our environment—we strategically future-proof the Filipino

workforce," paliwanag ni Legarda, na binanggit ang pagtataya ng International Labour Organization na ang pagtupad sa Paris Agreement ay maaaring lumikha ng netong 18–24 milyong trabaho sa buong mundo pagsapit ng 2030. Binigyang-diin din niya ang Magna Carta for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) at Barangay Livelihood and Skills Training Act bilang mahalaga sa pagpapalakas ng mga green startups at sa paglipat ng mga ideya mula sa pananaliksik tungo sa aktuwal na paggamit. Iginiiit niyang ang katatagan ay hindi lamang nakabatay sa imprastruktura kundi nakaugat din sa tao, kaya't kailangan ang pamumuhunan sa upskilling, reskilling, at matibay na social protection systems. Ayon kay Legarda, nakahanda na ang bansa sa balangkas para sa katatagan, at ang kinakailangan na lamang ay ang matibay na pasya upang kumilos nang tiyak. "We must choose: Do we double down on 'old school' expansion that scars our environment and leaves our growth anemic, or do we fully activate the greener, more resilient blueprint that we have already spent decades codifying into law," ani Legarda. "What is now being asked of us is the political will and collective courage to implement them—and to implement them correctly this time around." Sa pagtatapos, naglatag si Legarda ng bisyon para sa matatag na ekonomiya. "Economic growth, environmental stewardship, and human development are not competing priorities. Together, they form a stronger, more coherent, and more future-ready development strategy. Let us maximize the tools that already exist within our laws, our institutions, and most importantly, within our people," aniya.

Editorial

Dakila ang pag-aampon

NITONG Enero at sa mga unang bahagi ng kasalukuyang buwan ay nasa anim na kaso ng iligal na pag-aampon ng sanggol o bata ang naitala. Labis itong ikinababahala ng Philippine National Police–Women and Children Protection Center. Nasagip ng kapulisan ang isang two-day old baby boy na ibineben-

ta online sa halagang P30,000 kasabay ng pagkakaaresto sa ina. Mayroon ding three-month baby girl ang nailigtas na ibinebenta sa halagang P130,000 at ang ina, tiyahin, at lola ng sanggol ay pawang nadakip. Dakila ang pag-aampon ng bata o sanggol subalit dapat ay su-mailalim sa lehetimong sangay upang ito ay maging ligtas at legal. Mga kasong paglabag sa batas laban sa human trafficking, child abuse, cybercrime, at iba pa ang maaaring kaha-rapin kung ang pag-aampon ay iligal.

Glynn grew up on the island of Negros. Fresh out of college, she worked as a promodiser in a department store, never imagining that the bagger who often helped her on shift would one day become her husband. They married young, started a family at 25, and welcomed their first child a year later.

She once dreamed of becoming a teacher and completed a Bachelor of Science in Education, majoring in Technology and Livelihood Education. However, without the opportunity to take the licensure exam, she had to set that dream aside and focus on raising their family. In 2012, her husband was transferred to Iloilo City to work as an office clerk for a major holding company. The couple moved there, hoping the change would bring stability.

But the years between 2007 and 2012 were anything but stable.

With only her husband's minimum-wage salary, Glynn found herself juggling a series of sidelines just to make ends meet. She sold cosmetics and skincare products through a direct-selling company. She cooked dishes and set up makeshift food trays in front of busy establishments, hoping passersby would stop for a meal. When she became pregnant with their second child, she opened a small sari-sari store from the window of their rented home, starting with only PHP 500 in capital.

Still, the income was never enough for their first child entering school, a baby on the way, and a family adjusting to a new life in

Iloilo.

But there was one thing Glynn knew she had: baking.

It had been her passion for as long as she could remember. So quietly, between school errands and household chores, she returned to her mixing bowls and measuring cups. She baked cookies, breads, and pastries, and anything she could sell. Her first loyal customers were her husband's workmates, then fellow parents at her children's school, and finally neighbors who followed the sweet smell that wafted from her kitchen.

Her bread pudding became a neighborhood favorite.

Her business journey took a turn in 2014 after she was invited to a CARD center meeting. Encouraged to open a savings account, she and her husband later became clients of CARD Bank, a microfinance-oriented rural bank. Soon after, she took her first loan of PHP 5,000, just enough to buy a refrigerator for her expanding baked goods and to add capital

for her sari-sari store. Over the years, the habit of saving through CARD Bank helped her grow her business slowly but consistently, giving her the confidence to keep going even after setbacks.

And there were setbacks, especially health challenges. There were days when large orders came in, but her body could not keep up. Yet each time, Glynn found her way back to the kitchen and continued baking with eagerness. Soon enough, she is also baking customized cakes for specific customer orders. Today, that future is finally taking shape. Her eldest is now a first-year college student, a CARD scholar; her youngest is in fifth grade. Her business, first driven by necessity, has grown into a trio of thriving ventures: a sari-sari store, baked pastries and customized cakes, and, later, fuzzy-wire creative crafts—all run with the same consistent diligence.

When asked what she would tell others dreaming of starting their own business, Glynn advises knowing your market. "Dapat hindi lang yung gusto nila kumita, dapat passion din nila (ang kanilang negosyo) para may eagerness din na mag-grow ang business nila... (It shouldn't just be about wanting to earn money; their business should also be their passion, so they'll have the eagerness to grow it)," she said, and advice clearly reflected in her own dedication, as she continues with heart despite any setbacks. She also advises always managing any loans carefully, as timely repayment keeps your business healthy.

Her words are simple. But like her soft, warm, love-baked bread pudding, they carry the quiet strength of a woman who built a life day by day with both hands deep in the dough. (*Jireh Pearl Casionan, Junior Writer*)

Itinatag din niya ang National Arts and Crafts Fair (NACF) noong 2016, na patuloy na nagbibigay ng pambansang eksposyur at oportunidad sa merkado para sa mga lokal na artisan.
