Sa isinagawang press conference, naging karagdagang kaalaman sa pagtalakay kaugnay ng Kapihang Wika ng Komisyon sa Wikang Filipino ng KWF na ginanap sa Auditorium ng PIA, Lungsod Quezon. Ipinahayag ni Katherine Chloe S. De Castro, Direktor Heneral ng PIA, ang kahalagang pagbibigay kaalaman ukol sa naisagawang proyekto at programa ng KWF para sa unang semestre ng 2026. Tinalakay din sa pagbibigay ng mga mga mahahalagang kaalaman patungkol sa AI Digitalisasyon ng sumusunod na pinuno ng KWF na sina Tagapangulong Marites A. Barrios-Taran; Komisyoner Carmelita C. Abdurahman, EdD; at Komisyoner Benjamin M. Mendillo, Jr., PhD. Kinikilala ng Komisyon sa Wikang Filipino (KWF) ang artificial intelligence (AI) bilang isang kasangkapan para tulungan palakasin

ang wikang Filipino at mga katutubong wika ng bansa, sinasabing dapat tingnan ang teknolohiya bilang isang pagkakataon. Kaugnay nito tinukoy ni KWF Chairperson Marites Barrios-Taran na makakatulong ang AI para palawakin ang paggamit at pag-unlad ng Filipino at mga katutubong wika. LRT-2 NAGLUNSDAD NG MOBILE PHONE, VISA, MASTECARD DEBIT, CREDIT CARD SSS CARD

Kasagsagan na sa kasalukuyan ang paggamit ng digital na pagbabayad ng mas mabilis at mas maginhawang pagbabayad sa pamasaha. Kasagsagan na ngayon ng pagbabayad ng pamasaha sa LRT-2 gamit ang Visa at Mastercard debit at credit cards, NFC-enabled na mobile at wearable devices, at iba pang digital payment options matapos ilunsad ang cashless payment system ng rail line kamakailan lang sa Legarda LRT 2 Station. Inutusan ni Pangulong Ferdinand Marcos Jr. ang Department of Transportation (DOTr) na ilunsad ang mga digital payment system sa lahat ng linya ng tren para mas madali at maginhawa ang pagbabayad ng mga pasahero.

Sinabi ni Transportation Secretary Banoy Lopez na ang mga cashless na opsyon sa LRT-2 line ay magpapahintulot sa mga pasahero na hindi na kailangan pumila sa mga counter, kaya makakatipid sila ng oras.

"Malaking bagay ito sa mga pasahero natin sa linya sa LRT-2 lalo na sa mga estudyante ngayong pasukan. Mas madali na ang pag-commute dahil mayroon na tayong digital payment system.

Alam naman natin na ang dinaraan ng LRT-2 ay University Belt kaya convenient ito lalo na sa mga pasahero nating estudyante," ani Secretary Lopez.

Ang bagong cashless na sistema ay naging posible sa pamamagitan ng pakikipagtulungan ng DOTr, Rizal Commercial Banking Corporation (RCBC), Light Rail Transit Authority (LRTA), at Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP). Bahagi ang inisyatibang ito ng mga pagsisikap ng

gobyerno na i-digitalize ang karanasan sa pampublikong transportasyon, kasunod ng matagumpay na paglulunsad ng cashless payments sa MRT-3 noong 2025. Sinabi ni Transportation Undersecretary for Railways Timothy John Batan na ang pagpapalawak ng mga opsyon sa pagbabayad ay magbibigay sa mga pasahero ng mas malaking flexibility habang nakakatulong din ito na matugunan ang kakulangan ng kard na naranasan noon sa pamamagitan ng pagbawas ng pag-asa sa mga stored-value card.

"At ang ginagawa po natin ngayong araw na ito, ay ang magdagdag ng pagpipilian. To give more choices to our commuters for LRT-2. At nang sa ganoon, yung mga nangyari po sa nakaraan na nauubusan po tayo ng cards, nauubusan po tayo ng chips, ay hindi na po mangyayari ulit. Goodbye card shortage, isa po yan sa mga pangako ng proof-of-concept na ito," Usec. Batan said.

Dagdag pa ni Usec. Batan, ang pagpapalawak ng mga opsyon sa pagbabayad ay magbibigay-daan din sa gobyerno na ma-access ang real-time na datos sa pagbiyahe, na makakatulong upang mabilis na malaman kung saan at kailan kailangan ng karagdagang biyahe ng tren, ma-optimize ang mga ruta, at makagawa ng mas maayos na desisyon sa pamumuhunan sa riles.

"Dahil po sa ginagawa natin ngayon, mas mapapadali po sa gobyerno, mas mapapadali po sa DOTr at sa atin pong ibang mga ahensya ng gobyerno na malaman kung saan po nagmumula at saan po nagtutungo ang ating mga commuters. At real-time, malaman po natin, mas kailangan pala ng dagdag

MATAGUMPAY NA NAST PHL SCIENTIFIC MEETING AWARDING CEREMONY

Ang National Academy of Science and Technology, Philippines (NAST PHL), isang kaakibat na ahensya ng Department of Science and Technology, at ang pinakamataas na pagkilala at payong kinatawan ng bansa sa agham at teknolohiya, ay matagumpay na naisagawa ang 48th Annual Scientific Meeting (ASM) sa The Manila Hotel, Manila.

Nakatuon sa temang "UN SDGs: Agham, Teknolohiya, at Inobasyon para sa Napapanatiling Pag-unlad," pagtitipunin ng ASM ngayong taon ang mga nangungunang siyentipiko, mananaliksik, lider ng polisiya at industriya, kasosyo sa pag-unlad, at iba pang stakeholders sa bansa upang suriin ang progreso ng Pilipinas sa pagtamo ng United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) at tukuyin ang mga estratehiyang pinapatakbo ng agham para

pabilisin ang napapanatili at inklusibong pag-unlad.

Ang ika-48 na ASM ay nagpapatuloy sa sigla ng mga katatapos lamang na 2026 Regional Scientific Meetings (RSMs) na ginanap sa Luzon (Lungsod ng Muntinlupa, Metro Manila), Visayas (Lungsod ng Tacloban, Leyte) at Mindanao (Lungsod ng Butuan, Agusan del Norte).

Ang mga regional na pagpupulong na ito ay nagbigay-daan sa malawakang pakikipag-ugnayan sa mga lokal na stakeholder at nakabuo ng mga rekomendasyong batay sa ebidensya na makakatulong sa paghubog ng pambansang talakayan sa ASM.

Naging pangunahing tagapagsalita si Dr. Arsenio M. Balisacan, Kalihim ng Department of Economy, Planning, and Development (DEPDev). Ipinakita ni Kalihim Balisacan ang kasalukuyang progreso ng bansa patungo sa pagtamo ng UN Sustainable Development Goals, tinalakay ang mga bagong prayoridad sa kaunlaran, at itinampok kung paano makakatulong ang agham, teknolohiya, at inobasyon (STI) sa pagpapaunlad ng ekonomiya nang sustainable at sa pagsuporta sa pagtamo ng mga SDGs.

Camp BGen Vicente P. Lim--Sa isinagawang Case Conference on Theft and Robbery Incidents ngayong araw, Hulyo 13, 2026, pinuri ng pamunuan ng Electronic Transfer and Advance Processing (e-Tap) Inc. management sa pangunguna ni Ms. Janna Darm ang Police Regional Office 4A sa ilalim ng pamumuno ni Acting Regional Director PBGen Dominic L. Baccay, dahil sa matagumpay nitong kampanya laban sa mga krimeng kinasasangkutan ng mga E-Tap machines sa buong rehiyon ng CALABARZON.

Tuluyan nang naresolba ang kabuuang 22 insidente mula Enero 1 hanggang Hulyo 11, 2026 na kinasasangkutan ng theft at robbery ng mga E-Tap machines, na binubuo ng 17 robbery cases at 5 theft cases. Isang makabuluhang tagumpay ang pagkakahuli ng mga suspek sa Cainta Rizal sa pamamagitan ng masusing imbestigasyon, mabilis na police response, at pinaigting na operasyon ang nagging susi sa pagkalutas ng lahat ng 22 naitalang insidente sa rehiyon. Patunay ito ng epektibong pagpapatupad ng batas, koordinasyon at paglapit ng pulisya sa komunidad, at matatag na kampanya laban sa mga grupong sangkot sa ganitong uri ng kriminalidad.

Bilang pagkilala sa tagumpay na ito, nagpahayag ng pasasalamat ang pamunuan

bilang pormal na pagtanggap sa mga kilalang siyentipikong Pilipino na ang natatanging kontribusyon ay nakatulong sa pag-unlad ng agham at teknolohiya at nagpabuti sa pambansang kaunlaran.

Inoorganisa taun-taon ng NAST PHL, ang ASM ay nananatiling pangunahing pagtitipon ng komunidad ng agham sa bansa. Higit pa sa pagiging lugar para maipakita ang mga pananaliksik, nagsisilbi ang ASM bilang mahalagang plataporma para sa interdisiplinaryong usapan, palitan ng kaalaman, at pagbubuo ng mga rekomendasyong batay sa ebidensya na sumusuporta sa pambansang pag-unlad at tumutulong sa pagtugon sa mga pinakamahalagang hamon ng bansa sa pamamagitan ng agham, teknolohiya, at inobasyon. Habang ipinagpapatuloy ng Pilipinas ang pagsusumikap nito para sa mga Sustainable Development Goals, binibigyang-diin ng ika-48 ASM ang mahalagang papel ng ST&I sa paghubog ng matatag na mga institusyon, maalam na patakaran ng publiko, at mas sustainable na hinaharap para sa lahat.

Hitman?

Sa online press conference noon ay hindi naman maikakaila ang isa sa mga kontrobersiyal na pahayag ni Vice President Sara Duterte.

May kinalaman ito sa kinontak o kinontratang tao na magsasagawa ng pagpatay kina Pangulong Ferdinand Marcos Jr., First Lady Liza Araneta-Marcos, at dating House Speaker Martin Romualdez.

Isasagawa lamang ang pagpatay kung

mapapatay ang bise presidente na dahil may kondisyon ay nahati ang pananaw ng taumbayan maging ng mga abogado. Gumugulong ang pagdinig hinggil dito sa Senate impeachment court at tinatalakay ang posibleng magiging hitman.

Maliwanag ang pahayag ni National Bureau of Investigation Regional Director Atty. Jeremy Lotoc sa ikaapat na araw ng impeachment trial na ang ahensiya ay wala umanong nakitang kumpirmadong impormasyon ng katauhan o pagkakakilanlan ng hitman.

Sadyang mahirap itong tukuyin dahil paano kung wala naman talagang hitman at sa halip ay pamamaraan o istilo lamang ni VP Sara ang paglalalahad nito noon.

Tagumpay na hinubog sa tahanan

Sa Cagayan de Oro, hindi lamang pinagkakakitaan ang itinayo nina Jaime at Candelaria Bedro kundi isang buhay na nakaugat sa sipag, tiyaga, at matibay na pagpapahalaga sa pamilya.

Tubong Cebu si Jaime at maaga niyang naranasan ang hirap ng buhay. Dahil sa limitadong kita ng kanilang pamilya, hindi niya natapos ang kanyang pag-aaral. Sa kabila nito, nanatili siyang determinado na makatulong sa paghahanapbuhay ng kanilang pamilya.

Ang pagsisimula ng kuwento

Dahil isa sa kanyang mga kapatid ay nagtatrabaho sa paggawa ng longganisa, nagsimula si Jaime bilang katulong sa produksyon at kalaunan ay natutuhan niya mismo ang buong proseso ng paggawa nito. Habang tumatagal at nadaragdagan ang kanilang kaalaman at kakayahan, natuto rin silang gumawa ng iba pang produktong pagkain gaya ng chicharon.

Sa paghahanap ng mas magandang oportunidad at bagong simula, lumipat si Jaime at ang kanyang pamilya sa Cagayan de Oro noong 1982. Habang sila ay naninirahan sa kanilang bagong tahanan, ginamit nila ang kanilang kakayahan sa paggawa ng lutong-bahay na pork longganisa na kanilang ibinebenta sa kanilang komunidad, mga kalapit na mall, at pribadong tanggapan.

Makalipas ang ilang taon ng pagsisikap, nakilala ni Jaime si Candelaria, isang residente sa Cagayan de Oro na kalaunan ay naging kanyang asawa. Ikinasal sila noong 1987 at magkasamang nagsimula ng kanilang sariling negosyo ng longganisa. Upang makatulong sa lumalaking pangangailangan ng kanilang pamilya, nagtayo rin sila ng maliit na sari-sari store sa kanilang tahanan na nagsilbing dagdag na pinagkukunan ng kita para sa kanilang pang-araw-araw na pangangailangan.

Habang lumilipas ang panahon, hindi sila nakuntento sa kanilang kinikita at patuloy na naghanap ng iba pang mapagkukunan ng kabuhayan. Noong 1998, nagsimula silang gumawa ng pork chicharon na kanilang ibinebenta sa mga tindero sa palengke at mga may-ari ng tindahan sa kanilang komunidad, partikular sa Cogon Market at Bulua Public Terminal. Nanatiling buhay ang kanilang pagmamahal sa paggawa

ng longganisa. Bawat linggo, maingat silang gumagawa ng tatlo hanggang apat na batch ng longganisa gamit ang sariwa at lokal na karne ng baboy. Sa kanilang mahabang karanasan, natutuhan nilang mahalaga ang kalidad upang mapanatili ang kasiyahan ng mga mamimili at ang masarap na lasa ng kanilang produkto.

“Sa ganitong business, ang major na challenge namin ay ang mga imported na karne ng baboy. Masusi naming tinitingnan kung local at fresh ba ang karne dahil hindi maganda ang kalidad ng longganisa kapag imported pork ang ginagamit,” ani Jaime.

Samantala, hindi rin naging madali ang pamamahala sa kanilang negosyo ng chicharon. Karaniwan silang gumagawa nito nang dalawang beses sa isang linggo at nangangailangan ito ng mahabang proseso. Mula sa paghahanda at pagpapatuyo ng balat ng baboy hanggang sa tamang pagprito nito, bawat hakbang ay nangangailangan ng tiyaga at pagiging maingat. Bukod sa pagtaas ng presyo ng mga hilaw na materyales, isa rin sa kanilang pinakamalaking hamon ang pabago-bagong panahon. Kapag tag-ulan, mas matagal matuyo ang balat ng baboy na nagiging sanhi ng pagkaantala sa produksyon at nakaaapekto sa kanilang regular na iskediyul.

“Sa chicharon business naman, nakadepende sa quality ng pork skin o rinds ang dami ng magiging finished products mo, kaya hindi pare-pareho ang benta at kita,” paliwanag niya. Sa kabila ng lahat ng ito, hindi sila sumuko at patuloy na nagsikap upang mapanatili ang kanilang kabuhayan.

Isang bagong pagkakataon Kasabay ng paglago ng kanilang negosyo ay ang paglaki rin ng pangangailangan ng kanilang pamilya. Nang mangailangan sila ng karagdagan puhunan, ipinakilala ng isang kapitbahay si Candelaria sa CARD noong 2012. Matapos malaman ang tungkol sa mga produkto nitong pautang at insurance, nagpasya siyang maging kliyente.

Nagsimula siya sa halagang PHP 5,000 na loan at unti-unting tumaas ito sa paglipas ng mga taon hanggang umabot sa PHP

100,000. Malaki ang naitulong ng karagdagan puhunan upang mapalakas ang kanilang negosyo at matugunan ang mga gastusin ng kanilang pamilya. Nang makita ang positibong epekto nito sa kanilang kabuhayan, nagpasya rin ang kanyang asawa na maging kliyente noong 2020.

Ginamit ng mag-asawa ang kanilang loans nang responsable at maayos upang mapalago ang kanilang negosyo. Sa pamamagitan ng disiplina, sipag, at tiyaga, unti-unti nilang napabuti ang kanilang kalagayan sa buhay habang patuloy na sinusupportahan ang edukasyon at pang-araw-araw na pangangailangan ng kanilang mga anak.

“Bukod sa aming negosyo at suporta ng aming pamilya, malaki rin ang pasasalamat namin sa CARD SME Bank dahil nabigyan kami ng oportunidad na magkaroon ng mapagkukunan ng dagdag na puhunan para sa aming negosyo. Sa 14 years ko bilang client, napaayos namin ang aming bahay at nasuportahan ang pangangailangan ng aming apat na anak. Isa pa sa aming ipinagpapasalamat ay ang pagiging CARD scholar ng aming bunsong anak,” pagbabahagi ni Candelaria.

Sa kabila ng tumitinding kompetisyon sa kanilang negosyo, patuloy na nagsisikap sina Jaime at Candelaria. Higit pa sa paghahanapbuhay, ibinahagi rin nila ang kanilang kaalaman at kasanayan sa kanilang mga kamag-anak, at ilan sa mga ito ay nagsisimula na rin ng sarili nilang mga negosyo.

Ang kanilang mga sakripisyo ay nagbukas din ng mas magandang oportunidad para sa kanilang mga anak. Sa kasalukuyan, dalawa sa kanila ang nagtatrabaho na sa Manila at mayroon nang sariling pamilya. Ang isa naman ay tumutulong sa pamamahala at pagpapatuloy ng kanilang negosyo, habang ang kanilang bunsong anak ay kasalukuyang kumukuha ng kursong Bachelor of Science in Marketing Management sa Cagayan de Oro College bilang CARD scholar.

Sa maraming taon ng pagsisikap, nakapagpatayo sila ng sariling bahay, nakabili ng bahay at lupa, napalawak ang kanilang sari-sari

store, at napanatili ang kanilang negosyo sa kabila ng maraming hamon na kanilang pinagdaanan.

The signing marks Tayabas City as the first local government unit (LGU) in CALABARZON to subscribe to the National ID Authentication System (NIDAS), the official authentication platform of the Philippine Identification System (PhilSys). Through the agreement, the Tayabazen Digital Platform is authorized to operate as a National ID Authentication Relying

Party, enabling the City Government of Tayabas to securely verify the identity of individuals using their National ID credentials. In his message, Mayor Anthony A. Lim expressed his gratitude to the PSA, the Sangguniang Panlungsod, the City Civil Registrar's Office, the Information Technology Office, and all stakeholders whose collaboration made the initiative possible. He emphasized that the partnership reflects the city's commitment to digital transformation by providing more secure, efficient, and accessible government services to its constituents. NIDAS enables government agencies and authorized private sector entities to authenticate an individual's identity through the National ID while ensuring compliance with established security and data privacy standards. The Subscription Agreement was signed by Mayor Anthony Abustan Lim and City Administrator Atty. Voltaire Dela Cruz for the City Government of Tayabas, and by Assistant Secretary and Deputy National Statistician Rosalinda P. Bautista and PhilSys Registry Office-UCDMS Director Atty. Henedine P. Palabras for the PSA. Witnesses to the signing included City Civil Registrar Maide Jader, City Legal Officer Atty. Christopher Juniar, ICT Head Raymond Bermudez, PSA Regional Director Charito C. Armonia, PSA Quezon Officer-in-Charge Normita Pagkatipunan, and PhilSys Registry Office-GSUCD Chief Oliver P. Chancoco. The ceremony was attended by members of the Sangguniang Panlungsod, barangay chairpersons, department heads of the City Government of Tayabas, representatives from the PSA, and other stakeholders. As the first LGU in CALABARZON to subscribe to NIDAS, Tayabas City sets a milestone in promoting trusted digital identity authentication and advancing the digitalization of government services in the region.

PGC opens doors to employment through EMI Yazaki recruitment drive

The Provincial Government of Cavite (PGC), through the Office of the Provincial Public Employment Service Manager (OPPEM) headed by Ms. Rizalie Pinpin-Enero, successfully conducted a Local Recruitment Activity (LRA) for EDS Manufacturing, Inc. (EMI Yazaki) on July 13, providing Caviteño jobseekers with direct access to employment opportunities. The recruitment activity

featured 513 available job vacancies, attracting 63 applicants seeking employment with the company. Of the total applicants, 17 were hired on the spot, while 46 applicants qualified and will proceed with the company's succeeding recruitment process. The activity was facilitated in partnership with EDS Manufacturing, Inc. (EMI

Yazaki), represented by Ms. Evangeline Ramos, HRD Staff, whose team conducted applicant screening and interviews during the event. The successful conduct of the activity reflects the Provincial Government's continued commitment to empowering Caviteños through accessible employment services and meaningful partnerships with the private sector. — *OPIO*

Electricity consumers, climate justice group storm DOE, demand revocation of coal plants' licenses

Quezon City, Philippines — Electricity consumers, along with the Philippine Movement for Climate Justice (PMCJ), conducted a protest in front of the Department of Energy (DOE) office in Taguig on July 16, 2026 to call on the latter to translate their issuance of show cause orders (SCOs) to generation companies (GenCos) into the actual revocation of licenses and swift delivery of justice to power consumers who bear the brunt of skyrocketing electricity costs and rampant blackouts. PMCJ submitted a letter to Energy Secretary Sharon Garin requesting enforcement of its Accountability Policy under Department Circular No. 2026-02-0006. The group called on the DOE to file administrative and, if necessary, criminal cases against non-responsive GenCos and coal plants that disregard their obligations. It also demands that the full list of facilities under review by the DOE be published, thereby subjecting them to more comprehensive inspections and investigations. At the same time, PMCJ is calling for a clear timeline for deciding on suspensions, permit revocations, fines, and other penalties against these GenCos. "DOE's own circular enumerates the specific sanctions for repeat violators, which are administrative fines, suspension or revocation of Certificate of Endorsement and Certificate of Compliance, blacklisting or disqualification, and Cease and Desist Orders. Everything is laid out, but any tangible action from Garin and the DOE is not only lagging but also insufficient. How long will the Filipinos who suffer from passed-on power costs and blackouts have to wait for justice? Delaying action illustrates that the government prioritizes the interests of the power oligarchs it seems to protect and rejects the people's clamor. DOE, prove us wrong," said Ian Rivera, PMCJ national coordinator. The climate justice group also identified coal plants

with perennial forced outages across the grids and requested that the DOE prioritize them on the list of facilities for further investigation. In Cebu, residents also held a similar action at the DOE Visayas field office. PMCJ in Mindanao also submitted a letter to the DOE field office calling for an investigation into the region's perennial coal plants. "When Units 1 & 2 of Therma Visayas Inc. went into forced outage last May, hundreds of megawatts were suddenly removed from the Visayas grid. This immediately triggered a red alert status the following day, forcing rotational blackouts across Cebu. To cover the shortfall, Visayan Electric turned to the Wholesale Electricity Spot Market, where spot purchases accounted for 74.33 percent of its supply in June 2026 at a cost of ₱11.2822 per kilowatt-hour (kWh). This heavy reliance on the volatile spot market directly pushed electricity rates higher," said Lito Vasquez, PMCJ Visayas energy policy advisor. Vasquez also emphasized that as long as the cost of outages continues to be passed on to consumers rather than holding generation companies accountable for inefficiencies, households—not only in Cebu but across the country—will keep paying significantly more, even if their consumption stays the same. "Meralco announced a ₱0.3428 per kWh hike this

month. This could translate to a ₱69 increase in this month's bill for a typical household consuming 200 kWh. Bulacan, being the flood-control scam hotspot and one of the provinces that are submerged in floods after less than an hour of continuous rain, also suffers from high power costs and hours-long unannounced power interruptions. Being indignant about this outright injustice is an understatement," said Manuel Mendoza, convener of Alyansa ng Mamamayan Laban sa Mataas na Presyo ng Kuryente (ALMA-KURYENTE) Bulacan. Rivera argues that this is one of the many reasons people repeatedly call for a planned and managed coal phaseout to end this deplorable and unjust power service. "In light of the upcoming State of the Nation Address (SONA), we also register that the real state of the energy industry is plagued with fossil fuel addicts and oligarchs that burden the Filipino people. Government agencies seem to coddle these profit-driven energy giants by enabling them to a fault. But this special treatment should end. Now more than ever, the government must heed the call of the people for a planned and managed phaseout of coal," Rivera lamented. Groups warn DOE that if people's demands are not accommodated, they will face not only public scrutiny but also further legal action.

BSP: REPRODUCTION OF PH BANKNOTES IS PROHIBITED

The Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) reminds the public that reproducing Philippine banknotes without prior BSP authorization is prohibited by law. Under BSP Circular No. 829, Series of 2014, no person or entity may print, photocopy, distribute, or use any image or facsimile of a Philippine banknote, whether in black and white, in color, or in any combination of colors, without

prior BSP authorization. Offenders may face imprisonment of not less than five (5) years, but not more than ten (10) years. The BSP may authorize the reproduction of Philippine banknotes only for educational, historical, or numismatic purposes that help promote currency integrity, subject to the conditions prescribed under the Circular. 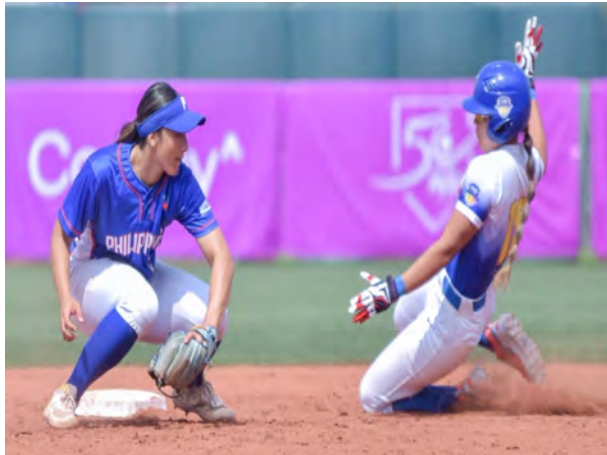
